Declaring certain Lands to be Waste Lands of the Crown.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," the Governor was empowered from time to time, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to purchase or in any way acquire any land in the North Island of New Zealand, or any interests therein, which the owners might be willing to sell, convey, or surrender, as therein mentioned: And whereas by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1873," it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums of two hundred thousand (200,000) pounds and five hundred thousand (500,000) pounds therein mentioned are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall by, Proclamation, declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as hereafter provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws for the time being in force in the province in which such land is, regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown within such province; and thereupon such lands so proclaimed shall become subject to such rands so proclaimed shall become subject to such provisions: And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto have been purchased out of the sum of two hundred thousand (200,000) pounds declared to be applicable for the purchase of lands in the North Island under the provisions of Part Four (IV.) of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and the further sum of five hundred thousand (500,000) pounds declared to be applicable for the purchase of lands in the North Island under the provisions of section 3 of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1873:" And whereas it is expedient that the said lands should be declared to be regated. that the said lands should be declared to be waste lands as hereinafter set forth: Now, therefore, I, the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1873," do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject (except as by the said Act is provided) to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws for the time being in force in the Province of Auckland regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown within such province.

Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrates' Districts of Papakura and Waikato.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' Districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did proclaim and constitute the Districts of Papakura and Waikato, as described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, to be, on and from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, Resident Magistrates' Districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the boundaries of the said

districts were altered:

And whereas it is expedient to further alter the boundaries of the said Districts of Papakura and

Waikato so constituted as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Districts of Papakura and Waikato, as described in the Schedule hereto, as and from the sixteenth day of October next.

SCHEDULE. PAPAKUBA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Onehunga District, as described in New Zealand Gazette, 1867, page 491, and by the Tamaki Strait to Oreri Point; thence towards the East by a line to the Wairoa Range, and along that range and by a line in a south-easterly direction to the utmost northerly source of the Whangamarino River; thence towards the South by that river to its confluence with the Waikato River; thence along the western bank of the Waikato River to the mouth of the Whangape Stream; thence by that stream and the northern shore of the Whangape Lake to the mouth of the Awaroa Stream; thence by a line running due west to the eastern boundary of the Waiuku District; thence towards the West by the said Waiuku District, as described in New Zealand Gazette, 1867, page 492; and then by the Manukau Harbour to the commencing point.

WAIKATO DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the southern boundary of the Papakura District, hereinbefore

defined; towards the East by part of the Hauraki District, as described in New Zealand Gazette, 1874, page 580, to its south-western angle; thence again on the North by the southern boundary of that district to the summit of Te Aroha Mountain; thence by the south-western boundary of the Tauranga District, as described in New Zealand Gazette, 1867, page 492, to the summit of the Otane Wainuku Mountain; thence by a line to the summit of Maungakawa Mountain, and by the southern and western boundaries of the Military Settlements Block to north-western angle of that block; thence by a line to the south-eastern angle of the Wainuku District, as described in the New Zealand Gazette, 1867, page 492; and thence by the eastern boundary of that district to the south-western angle of the Papakura District, the commencing point.

Revoking portions of previous Proclamation and defining Limits, Description, Line, and Limits of Deviation of other portions of the Railway from Auckland to Mercer, in the Province of Auckland.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

IN accordance with the provisions of the sixteenth section of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1874," I, the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the hereinbefore mentioned Act, and in exercise of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke those parts of the Proclamation of the Auckland and Mercer Railway, dated the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventytwo, and published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 40. of August 12, 1872, which refer to the portions of the said railway, more particularly described in the First Schedule hereto: And I also do hereby proclaim, declare and define the limits, descriptions, and lines of the said portions of the said railway to be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto; and that the lands specified and described in the Third Schedule hereto are proposed to be taken for the purposes of the said portions of the said railway; and that the limits of deviation shall be those set forth in the said Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

1. Commencing at the north-western boundary of Native Reserve adjoining Lot 33, in the Parish of Papakura; terminating at the south-eastern boundary of Lot 41, in the Parish of Papakura.

2. Commencing at the north-western boundary of Lot 76, in the Parish of Karaka; terminating at a point in Lot 79, in the Parish of Karaka.

3. Commencing at the south-western boundary of Lot 10, in the Parish of Mangatawhiri; terminating at the north-eastern boundary of Lot 10, in the Parish of Mangatawhiri.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Limits, Description, Line and Limits of Deviation of portions of the Railway from Auckland to Mercer, in the Province of Auckland.

1. Commencing at the north-western boundary of Native Reserve adjoining Lot 33, in the Parish of Papakura; terminating at the south-eastern boundary of Lot 41, in the Parish of Papakura;

2. Commencing at the north-western boundary of Lot 76, in the Parish of Karaka; terminating at a

point in Lot 79, in the Parish of Karaka;

3. Commencing at the south-western boundary of Lot 10, in the Parish of Mangatawhiri; terminating at the north-eastern boundary of Lot 10, in the Parish

as the limits, description, and line thereof are set forth on the plan (marked P.W.D. 5227), and described in the book of reference referred to on the face of the said plan; and which plan and book are authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Edward Richardson, Minister for Public Works, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland; or within the limits of deviation set forth on the said plan by dotted red lines, being generally not more than 110 yards on either side of the said line, unless otherwise delineated on the aforesaid plan, and passing in, through, over or into the several places, lands, roads, reserves, streams and watercourses enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto.

THIRD SCHEDULE, OR BOOK OF REFERENCE.

Lands and Roads, &c., proposed to be taken for the purposes of the portions of the Railway from Auckland to Mercer, hereinbefore described.

So much of the lands and roads hereinafter mentioned as are required for the said portion of the said railway along the line of the said railway herein-before defined, or within the limits of deviation aforesaid, as the lands are described and defined in the plan or book of reference aforesaid.

certain ports, and to levy dues at certain other ports at which no light dues are now leviable:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, doth order that, on and after the first day of November next, in lieu of the light dues leviable under the said recited Orders in Council, there shall be leviable, at each of the ports specified in the Schedule, the light dues which are specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule, and therein set opposite the name of the port at which they shall be leviable; and from and after the date aforesaid, the light dues made leviable under and by virtue of the said recited Orders in Council shall cease and determine:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Hawke's Bay Special Settlements Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Hawke's Bay, with the consent of the Provincial Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said province, to set aside out of the waste lands within the Province of Hawke's Bay, the Native title to which has been extinguished, any block or blocks for the purpose of special settlement, not exceeding in the whole thirty thousand acres, on such terms as may be sanctioned by the Governor in Council, anything in the existing regulations for the management or disposal of waste lands in the province to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas the said Superintendent, with the consent of the Provincial Council as aforesaid, hath proposed to set aside the block of land in the Seventy-Mile Bush, in the said province, described in the First Schedule hereto, containing two thousand acres, more or less, as a special settlement under the said Act for the members of an Association called the Heretaunga Small Farm Association, upon the terms hereinafter mentioned:

And whereas the said Superintendent, with the consent of the Provincial Council as aforesaid, hath requested the Governor to sanction the said terms:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby sanction the terms set forth in the Second Schedule hereto as the terms under which the said proposed special settlement shall be made under the said Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land situate in the Seventy-Mile Bush, in the Province of Hawke's Bay, being a portion of the Maharahara Block, and containing by admeasurement two thousand (2000) acres, more or

less. Bounded towards the East and South-east by the Oringi Waiaruhe Block, 1575 links, 7260 links, and 10800 links; towards the North-east by the Tahoraiti Block No. 1, 2640 links, 2733 links, and 875 links; towards the North by a portion of the Maharahara Block, being a line running westerly from Manawatatua on the western boundary of Tahoraiti Block No. 1, a distance of 10500 links; towards the West by a portion of the Maharahara Block, being a line running southerly a distance of 20000 links; and towards the South by the northern boundary of the Ahuaturanga Block, 8500 links.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Terms and Conditions for Occupation and Purchase of the Block of Land proposed to be set aside for Special Settlement by the Heretaunga Small Farm Association.

1. The object of this Association shall be the establishment of a Small Farm Settlement in the Maharahara Block, in the Province of Hawke's Bay.

- 2. The business of the Association shall be managed by a Committee of seven members, including the Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected by the share-holders annually, whose duty shall be to carry out the object of the Association. The Secretary shall act as Manager, and shall have charge of all books and other property, and shall carry out the instructions of the Committee and general meeting, and shall receive and answer all correspondence for this Asso-
- 3. No question of vital importance to the Association shall be decided by the Committee so as to bind the members, unless resolved upon at a general meeting of members, due notice of which shall be given; and all questions carried and decided upon by a majority of the members then present shall be binding upon the Association, unless contrary to the rules and laws under which the Association shall be
- 4. The members of the Association shall be males not under twenty-one years of age, who shall hold not less than thirty shares, and shall undertake to occupy and pay for the land in conformity with these regulations, and also in conformity with the terms laid down by the Government and Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay, and terms as agreed upon by his Honor the Superintendent on their behalf.
- 5. Occupation shall be the enclosing of at least 10 per cent. of the land taken up by each share-holder, and clearing the same, and the erection of a tenement, the value of which shall not be less than ten pounds (£10), before the end of the second year; and further, that at least 20 per cent. of the land taken up by each shareholder shall be enclosed with a good and substantial fence, cleared and put into crop before the end of the fourth year; clearing to mean that all trees less than ten (10) inches in diameter at three (3) feet from the ground shall be felled, and also the actual residence of a member, himself or his family, during the whole of the third, fifth, and seventh years of the term.

6. The settlements shall be divided into allotments not exceeding one hundred and fifty acres each, according to the requirements of the shareholders, together with reserves (if required) for public or educational purposes, which will be laid out by the

Government.

7. Each share shall represent one acre of land, and no member shall subscribe for or occupy more than one hundred and fifty acres or less than thirty acres.

8. Every member of this Association shall pay an entrance fee of twopence (2d.) for each share at the time of entrance, towards the general fund of this Association.

9. The allotment of sections shall be made at a general meeting of the Association, and in such manner as shall be agreed to by a majority of the members attending such meeting.

10. The price of each acre shall be one pound (£1) sterling, payable every three months, at the rate of ninepence (9d.) per share for each and every share, until the member shall have paid one pound (£1) sterling for each and every share he may hold. Any member will be at liberty to pay larger instalments, or the whole balance of purchase money in one payment, after he has complied with Rule No. 5 as far as refers to improvements and the residence

on his section the third year.

11. Each member shall pay, or cause to be paid, his instalments from time to time to the Treasurer, whose receipt shall be sufficient voucher for such payment. Payment shall be made on the twentieth day of June, on the twentieth day of September, on the twentieth day of December, and on the twentieth

day of March, in each year.

12. Any surplus money arising from the fines, entrances, or levies shall be applied by the Committee to the payment of expenses which have been and will be incurred in establishing and carrying out this Association, and to any other purpose which a majority of the members shall decide at a general

meeting.

13. All moneys paid to the Treasurer on account of the Association shall be placed in the Bank of New Zealand to the credit of the Association, and all moneys drawn from the Bank shall be by cheque signed by the Treasurer and Secretary, and one member of the Committee appointed for that purpose. The Treasurer shall give the Secretary a copy of all moneys received and paid at least once in every quarter. The accounts shall be audited once every half-year. The Auditor shall be appointed at

each yearly meeting.

14. Any member who shall fail to pay his quarterly instalments on or before the day appointed shall pay a fine of one halfpenny for each and every share for the first omission, doubling the fine each quarter that the member neglects or fails to pay. If a member neglects or fails to pay for four consecu tive quarterly payments, or gives notice that he c-not or will not pay any more on account of his shares, he shall cease to be a member of this Association, and shall have no claim against this Association on account of his shares; and the Committee shall dispose of his shares to a bond fide settler for the good of this Association.

15. In the event of the death of a member before being put in possession of his land, his interest in the allotment will revert to his heirs or executors, who may dispose of it to an approved bona fide settler, providing always that no member shall be allowed to hold more than one hundred and fifty acres; but should the deceased leave a widow or children, they shall be at liberty to occupy irrespec-

tive of age or sex.

16. Should any member be compelled to leave the district previous to his being entitled to his Crown grant, and before completing the requisite term of occupation, it shall be competent for the Committee to permit such to transfer his rights, title, and interest in the Association to another approved bond fide settler on the payment of 5 per cent., according to the value of his allotment at the time of transfer; providing always that no member shall be allowed to hold more than one hundred and fifty acres.

17. The Secretary shall call a general meeting of the members when desired by three members of the Committee. There shall be a yearly meeting held in the month of June in each year for the election of officers and to transact other business required. 18. Any member of this Association who may be found to have taken shares for another person, or for speculative purposes, and not with the view to bona fide settlement, shall, upon sufficient proof thereto to the satisfaction of a majority of the members, forfeit his interest in the Association, and the Committee shall dispose of his shares to a bona fide settler; and these rules shall be sufficient authority for such forfeiture and re-allotment; and any profits arising from such re-allotment shall be paid into the general funds of this Association.

19. Should any member of this Association fail to comply with Rule No. 5, or any part thereof, he shall forfeit his interest in this Association, and the Committee shall have power to dispose of his shares to a bona fide settler; and any profit arising from such re-allotment shall be paid into the general

funds of this Association.

20. Should any dispute arise which the Secretary cannot arrange, it shall be referred to the Committee of Management, and if not satisfactorily arranged it shall be referred to a general meeting of members, whose decision shall be final.

LORD HOWE'S GROUP, OR ONGTONG JAVA, RONCA-DOR, AND FRINDSBURY REEFS.

CAPTAIN Rosengren, having recently visited Lord Howe's Group, reports that its extent and position

are incorrectly shown on the chart. The position he son, of this department, it has been ascertained that assigns to some of the islands of the group, and its position is accurately laid down on the Admiralty which he states agree with those obtained from the observations of Captain Ferguson, of the s.s. "Ripple," are as follow, viz.,

North-east Islet, latitude 5° 27' S.; longitude 159° 34′ E.

North-west Islet (Hammond Islet), latitude 5° 18' S.; longitude 159° 17' E.

South-west Islet, latitude 5° 38' S.; longitude 159° 21′ E.

These longitudes depend upon that of Cape Astro-

labe being 160° 29' E.

The group consists of a number of small, very low and sandy islands, lying within a quadrilateral reef, the diagonal measurement of which is about 34 miles north-west and south-east, and 21 miles north-east and south-west. The islands-which are also connected by nnmerous reefs-are covered with cocoanut trees, and are thickly inhabited. The sling is the only weapon used by the natives, but they are very treacherous, and should be approached with caution.

To the westward of the group a strong current was, in July, found setting to the W.N.W. at a rate

of from 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ knots per hour.

Roncador or Candelaria Reef was found to be correctly placed on the chart. The sea breaks heavily upon it. On its north-western edge, about one-third of the way from its northern extremity, a small rock was observed which, at a distance, appeared like a small vessel. Just to the northwards of this rock was apparently an opening into a lagoon, extending towards the northern end of the

Frindsbury Reef .- The position assigned to this reef was passed within three miles, but nothing could be seen of it from the mast-head.

NORTHUMBERLAND ISLES .- OUTLYING DANGERS, h.h. CLUSTER.

CAPTAIN Lowrie, of the s.s. "Blackbird," reports the existence of two dangers near the h.h. cluster,

which are not shown upon the chart.

1. Reef awash at low water, 3 cables S.W. of westernmost island of the group. Staff Commander Bedwell, R.N., the Admiralty Surveyor, corroborates the position of this reef, and adds that a shoal spit extends southwards from it for upwards of a mile.

2. A shoal with not more than 2 fathoms at low water, lying from 1 to 11 miles W.S.W. from h. Peak

Captain Bedwell also reports shoal water as lying nearly a mile to the south-westward of the same Islet, and recommends vessels not to approach the h.h. cluster within 4 miles, until the examination of the ground is completed, as detached dangers exist all round the group.

its position is accurately laid down on the Admiralty chart, and that the direction for clearing it given in the "New Zealand Pilot" may be relied on. There are no outlying dangers, but for a half a mile seaward there is a bank with from 10 to 6 fathoms at low-water springs. The shallowest part is where Karori Stream bears N. ½ E., and Karori Rock just on with Terawhiti. The tides set strongly over this bank, causing heavy ripplings, particularly with the flood, which causes an appearance similar to a shallowlycovered reef.

Luna Rock.

This is a dangerous sunken rock discovered by optain Fairchild. It is small in size, and has only Captain Fairchild. 6 feet of water on it at low-water springs, with deep water all round. It bears from Karori Rock N. 57 W., distant five-sixths of a mile, and from Macmanaman's house S. 70° W., distant from nearest beach half a mile. It lies 1\frac{3}{4} cables outside of a line from Karori Rock to Terawhiti.

Owing to a strong flood tide which sets partly on the shore between Sinclair's Head and Cape Terawhiti, vessels from the westward bound to Wellington should be careful against being carried inshore of

their course.

Shoal off Baring Head.

This shoal lies to the north and westward of Baring Head. It is about 1 cable in width by 3 in length, running parallel with the shore. It has from 7 to 41 fathoms on it at low-water springs. The shallowest part bears from Baring Head N. 53° W., distant 2½ cables. It breaks in heavy weather. To clear it, cables. It breaks in heavy weather. To clear it, keep Pencarrow Light N. by W., until Baring Head is one point open of Taourakira Head.

Boat Passage off Jackson's Head.

The master of the steamer "Hawea" having reported that she struck when drawing 14 feet of water one-third across from the main in the inner passage, Captain Fairchild, of the "Luna," sounded it, and found the least water 4 fathoms, with very uneven bottom. This passage is therefore not recommended for vessels drawing over 12 feet.
