Additional Regulations under "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1875."

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of November, 1876.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Electric Telegraph Act, 1875," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to make regulations for fixing and determining the fees, rates, or dues to be demanded and received for the transmission of any despatch, message, or communication by means of any telegraph line, and for the delivery thereof, respectively; and that such regulations shall have the force of law when published in the Government Gazette of the colony:

Now, therefore, His Excellency George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the hereinbefore recited Act, doth, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, make the additional regulations contained in the Schedule hereto: And in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, His said Excellency doth hereby order and declare that such regulations shall take effect from and after the sixteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and that they shall be read with and form part of the regulations now in force.

SCHEDULE.

The tariff rates at present in force, limiting the receipt of telegrams by evening papers, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on week-days, to two hundred words at evening rates, shall, until the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, be extended to five hundred words between the same hours.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," doth hereby revoke the said in part recited Order in Council so far, but so far only, as the same appoints a Circuit Court of the Supreme Court to be held in the Nelson District on the second Monday in December next, at the Provincial Council Hall at Blenheim; and doth hereby appoint that, in lieu of the Circuit Court so appointed to be held, there shall be held in the said district, in the Immigration Depôt, at Blenheim, on the first Monday in December next, a Circuit Court for the despatch of civil and criminal business of the said Court.

Alteration of Boundaries of Otago Road Boards.

IN pursuance and exercise of all powers vested in him by the twenty-seventh section of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1876," His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby give his consent to the attached Proclamation.

A PROCLAMATION

By His Honor James Macandhew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

Whereas by section seven of "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance, 1874," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, upon the recommendation of the Provincial Council of the said Province, from time to time, by Proclamation in the Gazette, to alter the boundaries of any road district, and either to enlarge or diminish the area thereof; also to increase or diminish the number of subdivisions of any road district, and to alter the boundaries and to increase or diminish the area of any subdivision or subdivisions of any road district, notwithstanding that any district or any subdivision or subdivisions of any district may already have been constituted by the said Ordinance or by any Proclamation thereunder: And whereas by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," it is enacted that until the day next after the last day of the first session of the next or sixth Parliament of New Zealand all powers, duties, and functions which immediately before the passing of the said Act were under or by virtue of any law vested in or to be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any province, on the recommendation of the Provincial Council of such province, under any law or Ordinance for the time being in force, shall be exercised by the Superintendent, with the consent of the Governor in Council. consent of the Governor in Council: And whereas the Superintendent of the Province of Otago has recommended His Excellency the Governor in Council to alter the boundaries of the Waiareka, Kakanui, Waitaki, and Awamoko Road Districts, and the number and boundaries of the subdivisions thereof, and His Excellency the Governor in Council has given his consent to this Proclamation, and to the alterations aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Waiareka, Kakanui, Waitaki, and Awamoko Road Districts, and the number and boundaries of the subdivisions thereof, are hereby altered, and shall be respectively as follows:—

WAIAREKA ROAD DISTRICT

Is bounded towards the North by a road line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Section 58, Block IV., Awamoko Survey District, and running through Blocks IV., V., and VI., said district, and its continuation through Blocks I. and II., Maruwenua, and Blocks XI. and X., Kauroo Survey Districts, to the western boundary of the Kakanui Hundred; towards the West by the said western boundary of the Kakanui Hundred; towards the South by the northern boundary of Block VIII. and part of V., Kauroo Survey District, as far as the north-eastern corner of Section 4 of said Block V.; towards the East and South-east by Section 1, Block IV., Kauroo; again towards the West by other part of Section 1, Block IV., Kauroo; and again towards the South by Block II.; and again towards the West by other part of Block II., Kauroo; and again towards the South by part of Block II., Kauroo; and Blocks IX. and V., and part of Section 1, Block IV., Oamaru, to a stream; thence by said stream to the main North Road; thence by the said road to the eastern boundary of Section 32, and by a road line being the eastern boundary of said Section 32 and Section 31, Block IV., Oamaru; thence by the south, south-west, and western boundary of the Waitaki Road District to the north-eastern corner of Section 58, Block IV., Awamoko Survey District, the point of commencement.

SUBDIVISIONS OF THE WAIABEKA ROAD DISTRICT.

Windsor Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North, North-east, and East by a road line running through Blocks VI., V., and IV., Awamoko District, and the Papakaio Subdivision of the Waitaki Road District; towards the South and West by the Oamaru and Kauroo Survey Districts; and towards the North and North-west by the continuation of said road line through Blocks II. and I., Maruwenua Survey District.

Teneraki Subdivision

Is bounded on the North by the Awamoko Survey District; on the West by the Waiareka Stream; on the South by Block V. and part of Section 1, Block IV., Oamaru Survey District; on the South-west by the Awamoko Stream to the main North Road; on the South by the main North Road; and on the East by the Town of Oamaru and the Oamaru Stream.

Enfield Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North by the Windsor Subdivision; towards the East by Teneraki Subdivision; towards the South by Block IX., Oamaru Survey District, by the Kakanui River, and by Block II., Kauroo Survey District; and towards the West by Block IV., Kauroo Survey District.

Tapui Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North by part of the Awamoko Road District, and part of Block I., Maruwenua Survey District, as far as Rakis Table; towards the East by the Windsor and Enfield Subdivisions; towards the South-east by Section 1, Block IV.; again towards the East by other part of Section 1, Block IV., Kauroo District; towards the South by the

southern boundary of Blocks IV. and IX., said district; and towards the West by the western boundary of the Kakanui Hundred.

KAKANUI ROAD DISTRICT

Is bounded towards the North by the Waiareka Road District and the Town of Oamaru; towards the South-east by the ocean; towards the South and again towards the South-east by the Kakanui River and Island Stream; towards the West by the western boundary of the Otepopo Hundred; again towards the South by the southern boundary of the Kakanui Hundred; and again towards the West by the western boundary of the Kakanui Hundred.

SUBDIVISIONS OF THE KAKANUI ROAD DISTRICT.

Lambton Subdivision

Is bounded on the North by Block III. and part of Section 1, Block II., Oamaru Survey District; on the West by the Waiareka Stream; on the South-east by the main North Road; and on the East by the Awamoko Stream.

Lambourne Subdivision

Is bounded on the North by the northern boundary of Block II., Oamaru District; on the West and South by the Kakanui River; on the East by Sections 33 and 29, Block VII., Oamaru Survey District; on the South-east and East by the main North Road and the Waiareka Stream.

Totara Subdivision

Is bounded on the North-west by the main North Road; on the West by Sections 15, 19, 21, 23, and 24, Block VII., Oamaru Survey District; South and West by the Kakanui River; South-east by the ocean; on the East by the Awamoko Stream, and Sections 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and part of 23, Block IV., Oamaru Survey District.

Awamoko Subdivision

Is bounded on the North by the main North Road; on the West by the Quarry Reserve and Sections 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, Block IV., Oamaru Survey District, and the Awamoko Stream to the ocean; on the Southeast by the ocean; and on the North-east by the Town of Oamaru.

Incholme Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North by the Waiareka Road District; towards the East and North-east by the Kakanui River; towards the South and South-east by the Island Stream; towards the West by the western boundary of the Otepopo Hundred; towards the South by the southern boundary of the Kakanui Hundred; and towards the West by the western boundary of the said Kakanui Hundred.

WAITAKI ROAD DISTRICT

Is bounded towards the North by the Waitaki River; towards the South-east by the ocean; towards the South by the Town of Oamaru; towards the Southwest by the Oamaru Stream; again towards the South by Sections 1, 2, and part of 11, Block XIII., and Section 43, Block XIII., Oamaru Survey District; towards the West by Block VIII., and part of Block IV., to the north-eastern corner of Section 58 of said block; again towards the South and South-west by a road line running through Blocks IV., V., and VI., Awamoko Survey District; again towards the West by part of Section 16, and Sections 4, 6, and 2, Block II., of Sections 3 and 20, Block III.; again towards the North by Section 4, Block III.; and again towards the West by Section 4, and appn. 6928, Block III.; again towards the South-west by a road line; and again towards the South-west by a Plock III., Maruwenua Survey District, to the Waitaki River.

SUBDIVISIONS OF THE WAITAKI ROAD DISTRICT.

Weymouth Subdivision

Is bounded on the North-east by the Waitaki River; South-east by the ocean; South-west by Landon Stream to Block I., Papakaio Survey District; West by east boundary of Blocks I., III., and VI., Papakaio Survey District.

Landon Subdivision

Is bounded on the North by Papakaio Subdivision; North-east by the Landon Stream; South-east by the ocean; South by the Town of Oamaru; and West by the Oamaru Stream.

Papakaio Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North-east by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Weymouth Subdivision; towards the South and West by the Oamaru Survey District and a road line; and again towards the West by Block VIII. and part of Block IV.; also by Blocks II. and V., Awamoko Survey District.

Awamoko Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North-east by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Papakaio Subdivision; towards the South and South-west by a road line running through Blocks V. and VI., Awamoko District; and towards the West by the western boundary of the Waitaki Road District.

AWAMOKO ROAD DISTRICT

Is bounded towards the North-east by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Waitaki Road District; towards the South by the Waitaka Road District; and towards the West by the western boundaries of the Kakanui and Maruwenua Hundreds.

SUBDIVISIONS OF AWAMOKO ROAD DISTRICT.

Datchet Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North-east by the Waitaki River; towards the East by the Awamoko Subdivision of the Waitaki Road District; towards the Southeast by the Awamoko Creek; and towards the West by the western boundary of the Maruwenua Hundred.

Eton Subdivision

Is bounded towards the North-west by the Datchet Subdivision; towards the East by part of the Awamoko Subdivision of the Waitaki Road District; towards the South and South-east by a road line running through Blocks I. and II., Maruwenua, and X. and XI., Kauroo Survey Districts, being the watershed of the Awamoko Downs; and towards the West by the western boundaries of the Kakanui and Maruwenua Hundreds.

Delegation of Governor's Powers under "The Constabulary Force Ordinance Amendment Act, 1868."

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Constabulary Force Ordinance Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to delegate to any person or persons all or any of the powers conferred on or vested in the Governor by an Ordinance of the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Establishment and Maintenance of a Constabulary Force," and to restrict

any such delegation so as to enable the person or persons named therein to exercise the powers aforesaid only within any province, county, or other division of the colony, to be specified and described in such delegation:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in that behalf vested in me, do hereby

delegate to

The Hon. James Alexander Bonar

all the powers conferred on or vested in the Governor by virtue of the said Ordinance, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Establishment and Maintenance of a Constabulary Force;" and I do hereby restrict this delegation so as to enable the said James Alexander Bonar to exercise the powers aforesaid only within the Provincial District of Westland.

Sir,—I have the honor to inform you that the following trees and plants are now growing in the open air here, and they all appear to thrive well and suit both the soil and climate. The land had been all subsoiled to a depth of 20 inches, and thoroughly wrought and pulverized, before planting took place; and since that time care has been taken to keep them perfectly clean. The whole quantity planted extends to about 100 acres, and it is at least equal to anything of the kind I saw when in England.
