Prohibition of Importation of Cattle, Sheep, and Swine into New Zealand.

NORMANBY, GOVERNOR.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of December, 1876.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the second section of "The Animals Importation Prohibition Act, 1876," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of absolutely prohibiting the introduction into New Zealand, from any country, of all cattle, sheep, or swine: And whereas it appears to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that disease exists or is believed to exist among cattle, sheep, and swine in all the countries of the Continent of Europe, including Great Britain and Ireland, and it is expedient to prohibit the introduction into New Zealand of such animals as hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order and direct that, from and after the fifteenth day of April next, the introduction into New Zealand of cattle, sheep, or swine from any country or place in the Continent of Europe, including Great Britain and Ireland, shall be and the same is hereby absolutely prohibited and forbidden; and in further pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and with the like advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prescribe and direct that this Order in Council shall remain in force until the expiration of two years from the said fifteenth day of April, unless this Order in Council is in the meantime revoked.

Annuity Tables to be used after 31st December, 1876.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of December, 1876.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the fifth section of "The Government Insurance and Annuities Act, 1874" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor shall have power, by Order in Council, from time to time to do, *inter alia*, the following things:—

To direct the use of tables approved from time to time by him for determining the values of all annuities under the provisions of this Act, and of tables so approved for payment of sums of money at death and otherwise under the provisions of this Act; and such tables respectively shall be valid and effectual so long as the same shall remain in force; and

To revoke all or any of such tables, and to direct the use of other tables approved as aforesaid:

And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of November, in the same year: And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-seventh January, in the same year, certain Tables for determining the Values of Annuities, and for Payment of Sums of Money at Death and otherwise, in the Schedule to the said Order in Council, were approved of: And whereas it is expedient that certain of the said Tables should be revoked, and that other tables should be adopted in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby revoke and recall the Tables numbered I., II., and III. in the Schedule to the first hereinbefore mentioned Order in Council, and Table num-

bered VII. in the Schedule to the last hereinbefore mentioned Order in Council, and do hereby approve of the Tables in the Schedule hereto, and numbered I., II., III., and VII. therein, and direct that the same shall, from and after the first day of January next, be used and adopted for the purpose of determining the value of Immediate Annuities granted under the said Act, and for Payment of Sums of Money at Death and otherwise, in lieu of the said Tables I., II., III., and VII.: Provided that the revocation hereby made shall not be deemed to alter or affect any contract, act, matter, or thing duly made in accordance with and subject to such revoked Tables.

SCHEDULE.

TABLE I.—ANNUAL PREMIUMS to secure £100, payable at Death only.

Table with 6 columns: Age next Birthday, Annual Premium during whole of Life, and Age next Birthday. Values range from 25 to 60.

TABLE II.—SINGLE or ANNUAL PREMIUMS for a Specified Period, to secure £100, to be paid at Death only.

Table with 7 columns: Age next Birthday, Annual Premium limited to (Twenty, Fifteen, Ten, Five Payments), Single Premium, Age next Birthday. Values range from 25 to 60.

TABLE III.—ENDOWMENT INSURANCE.—ANNUAL PREMIUMS to secure £100, payable as indicated, or at Death, if prior.

Table with 8 columns: Age next Birthday, In 10 Years, In 15 Years, In 20 Years, In 25 Years, In 30 Years, In 35 Years, Age next Birthday. Values range from 25 to 60.

TABLE VII.—IMMEDIATE ANNUITY, payable by Quarterly Instalments, which will be granted for every £100.

Table with 6 columns: Age last Birthday, Males, Females, Age last Birthday, Males, Females. Values range from 40 to 60.

NOTE.—The Quarterly Instalments of the above Annuities are payable on the 1st day of January, April, July, and October, commencing on the first quarterly day following the day of purchase, and ending with the last quarterly day preceding the death of the Annuitant.

NOTICE.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 5 of "The Government Insurance Annuities Act, 1874," I do hereby give notice, that by the said Order in Council, made the 15th day of December now instant, certain Tables for determining the Value of Immediate Annuities, and for Payment of Sums of Money at Death and otherwise, have been directed to be used and adopted in lieu of certain other like Tables directed to be used and adopted by two Orders in Council dated the 22nd day of October, 1870, and the 24th day of January, 1872, respectively. And I do hereby further give notice, that the said first-mentioned Order in Council is directed to come into operation on the first day of January next, as therein mentioned; and that printed copies of the said Tables can be seen and obtained at my office in Wellington, and at the several Post Office Money Order Offices throughout the colony.
