NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Canter-W HEREAS by the sixth section of "The Canter-bury Sheep Ordinance 1872 Amendment Ordinance, 1874," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, to appoint one or more place or places at or adjacent to the inland boundaries of or places at or adjacent to the inland boundaries of the province, at some one or other of which places all sheep to be introduced by land into the province shall be crossed over such boundaries, and no sheep shall be introduced by land into the said province unless at some one of such places; and any person crossing sheep over any such boundary as aforesaid at any other place than one which shall have been proclaimed as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of one hundred pounds. of one hundred pounds :

And whereas by virtue of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," the powers by the said Ordi-nance vested in the Superintendent are now vested in, and are to be exercised and performed by, the Governor:

And whereas by "The Diseased Sheep Act, 1876," it is enacted that the said Ordinance, amongst other Ordinances, shall, as amended by the Act now under recital, apply to that portion of the colony which is comprised within the boundaries mentioned in the

First Schedule to such Act: Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by the above recited Ordinance and Acts respectively, do hereby appoint the under-mentioned places to be places at one or other of which all sheep to be introduced by land into the district comprised within the boundaries mentioned in the First Schedule of "The Diseased Sheep Act, 1876," shall be crossed over such boundaries, viz.,

Fees for Private Letter Boxes.

HEREAS by "The New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make rules and regulations for the imposition of fees for private boxes and deliveries at the several post offices of the colony: And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the twentyninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, prescribed and imposed certain fees to be paid in respect of private boxes at the several post offices of the colony, and it is expedient to impose other fees in

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, and by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby revoke so much of the said Regulations Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Con-as relates to the fees payable in respect of private

hereby make the Regulation in the Schedule hereinafter written, imposing other fees in lieu thereof; and with the like advice and consent doth declare that this Order shall take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

SCHEDULE.

The fees payable in respect of each private box shall be,-

For a term exceeding six calendar months and not exceeding one year, one pound (£1).

For a term not exceeding six calendar months, ten shillings (10s.).

All such fees to be paid in advance: Provided that no private box shall be let save for a term ending on the 30th day of June or the 31st day of December next after the day on which the same shall be let; and that, where there are two or more applicants for the same box at the same time, the preference shall be given to the person desiring to have the same for the longest term.

WHEREAS by the fifty-eighth section of "The Native Land Act, 1873," (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act,") it is enacted that, upon the application of any persons interested in any Native land who may feel themselves aggrieved by the de-cision of the Native Land Court in respect thereof, the Governor in Council may order a rehearing of any matter heard and decided under the provisions of the said Act, within such a period of time from the publication of the decision and memorial of ownership, in manner in the said Act required, as may be limited in such order; and upon such order being made, all proceedings theretofore taken by the Court in such matter shall be annulled, and the case shall commence *de novo*, and shall proceed in manner provided by the said Act: Provided that no appli-cation for a rehearing shall be entertained if it be made after six months shall have elapsed from the time of such publication :

And whereas by the eighth section of "The Native Land Act Amendment Act, 1874," (hereinafter referred to as "the said Amendment Act,") it is enacted that in any case where an application for a rehearing of any matter heard and decided under "The Native Lands Act, 1865," and the Acts amending the same, shall have been made subsequently to the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, the Governor in Council may, in the manner provided by the fifty-eighth section of the said Act, order a rehearing of any such matter so heard and decided as aforesaid; and all the provisions of the said Act respecting rehearings, so far as applicable, shall extend to any rehearing under the said Amendment Act: Provided that such application shall in each case have been made within six months from the date of the decision of the Court in such case :

No person shall make or cause any unnecessary obstruction in or upon the roadway or footpath of any street or private street, by allowing any vehicle or animal to remain upon or across the same, or by placing thereon any goods or material of any kind, or shall fail to remove such obstruction when thereto required.

4. It shall not be lawful for any person to drive any horse or horses loose through or upon any public street or thoroughfare within the Borough of Napier.

5. Any person offending against any provision of this by-law, shall, for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

A BY-LAW TO PREVENT CATTLE STRAYING WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF NAPIER.

Whereas injuries have happened, and may hereafter happen, to persons and property by the straying of cattle within the borough, and it is desirable that provision should be made to prevent a continuance of such injuries: Subject to, and without prejudice to any law or regulation in force respecting any of the classes of animals under the head of cattle, it shall not be lawful for any person to keep or depas-ture any cattle within the limits of the borough, except within an enclosure. Any person offending against this by-law shall, for every such offence, forfeit a sum not exceeding £5. The word "enclosure" shall mean a place enclosed by a substantial fence.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The population has been estimated by adding the excess of births over deaths since the 1st March, 1874, to the then Census population. It is impossible to estimate the increase from immigration. The births were 22 less than in November. The deaths were 32 more in number than the deaths in November. Of the deaths, males contributed 66; females, 72: 69 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 500 per cent. of the whole number; 52 of these were of children under 1 year of age. There were 6 deaths of persons of 65 years of age and over: 7 of these persons were males and 4 females: of these, 2 males aged 69 and 85 died at Auckland; 1 female aged 68 at Wellington; 1 male aged 78, and 1 female aged 70, at Nelson; 2 males aged 65 and 68, and 2 females aged 70 and 73, at Christchurch; and 2 males aged 66 and 70 at Dunedin.

The total of deaths in December exceeded the number for November by 32. Zymotic Diseases.—These increased from 19 in November to 50 in December. Deaths from Scarlatina increased from 3 in November to 11 in December, of which 1 occurred at Christchurch and 10 at Dunedin. There were no deaths from Diphtheria, in November, but 6 last month : 1 at Auckland, 4 at Wellington, 1 at Dunedin. Whooping-cough caused 5 deaths in December : 3 at Auckland, and 2 at Dunedin. There were none from this cause in the previous month. Dysentery and Diarthœa were fatal in 6 cases during November, against 19 in December. These last occurred as follows :—2 at Auckland, 2 at Thames, 9 at Wel-lington, 5 at Christchurch, and 1 at Hokitika. Diseases of the Respiratory System.—December shows a total of 15, being 2 less than the number for the previous month. There were 2 deaths at Auckland, 3 at Nelson, 1 at Christchurch, 7 at Dunedin, and 2 at Hokitika. Violent Deaths.—The accidental deaths were 6 in number. Two persons were accidentally drowned, one man was killed by a sunstroke at Christchurch, one by fall of earth, and another by fall of a pair of shears. The remaining death was from Erysipelas, consequent on a fractured leg. There was 1 suicide by poison, and a child was found dead with marks of violence. Comparison with December, 1875, shows a great increase in the mortality from Zymotic disease, there being only 29 deaths for that month against 50 in December, 1876. This is caused by the increased number of deaths from Scarlatina, Diphtheria, Whooping-cough, and Diarthœa. The deaths from Fever decreased in number. Diseases of the respiratory system were fewer than in December of 1875. The mortality from all causes shows an increase for last month of 14 deaths. Recistrar.General's Office
