(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf by "The Resident Magistrate's Act, 1867," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of March next, the jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate's Court for

THE UPPER WANGANUI DISTRICT,

as the same is defined in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, shall be extended to fifty pounds.

Given under the hand of His Excellency
the Most Honorable George Augustus
Constantine, Marquis of Normanby,
Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby,
and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in
the County of York, in the Peerage of
the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of
Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a
Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander
of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint
Michael and Saint George; Governor
and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her
Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and
its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of
the same; and issued under the Seal of
the said Colony, at the Government
House at Wellington, this twenty-eighth
day of February, in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and
seventy-seven.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

Award by the Commissioners of the Public Debts Sinking Funds.

Know all men by these presents, that whereas by "The Public Debts Sinking Funds Act, 1868," it is provided that if and whenever it shall be made to appear to the Commissioners of the Public Debts Sinking Funds that any of the debentures issued under any of the Acts or Ordinances specified in the First or Second Schedules thereto have been converted or exchanged for debentures issued under "The Consolidated Loan Act, 1867," the Commissioners shall from time to time determine what amount of the sinking fund held by them and created for the payment of such first-mentioned debentures shall be released, and that the Commissioners shall make such determination by an award in writing: And whereas it has been made to appear to the said Commissioners that debentures to the amount of one hundred and seventy-two thousand three hundred pounds, being a portion of the debentures to the amount of three hundred thousand pounds issued under "The Lyttelton and Christchurch Railway Loan Ordinance, 1860," being one of the Ordinances named in the Second Schedule to the said "Public Debts Sinking Funds Act, 1868," have been converted or exchanged for debentures issued under "The Consolidated Loan Act, 1867," and debentures of the said loan to the amount of fifty thousand pounds have been paid off and cancelled, and that the amount of the debentures still outstanding and unconverted of the said loan of three hundred thousand pounds is thereby reduced to seventy-seven thousand seven hundred pounds:

And whereas the sum of forty thousand one hundred and eightr fire pounds risets as hillings and himself. and eighty-five pounds nineteen shillings and sixpence is held by the said Commissioners as accumulated sinking fund for the repayment of the said loan of three hundred thousand pounds, and the sum of twenty-one thousand pounds of the said accumulated sinking fund with interest thereon, together with the sinking fund hereafter accruing and interest thereon will be sufficient to record and interest thereon. est thereon, will be sufficient to reproduce the said sum of seventy-seven thousand seven hundred pounds.

And whereas it has further been made to appear to the said Commissioners that debentures to the amount of twenty-eight thousand eight hundred pounds, being a part of the debentures to the amount of thirty thousand pounds issued under the Canterbury "Loan Ordinance, Session VII., No. 3," being one of the Ordinances named in the Second Schedule to the said "Public Debts Sinking Funds Act, 1868," have been converted or exchanged for debentures issued under "The Consolidated Loan Act, 1867," and that the amount of the debentures still outstanding and unconverted of the said loan of thirty thousand pounds is thereby reduced to one thousand two hundred pounds: And whereas the sum of one thousand seven hundred and twenty-three pounds ten shillings and ninepence is held by the said Commissioners as accumulated sinking fund for the repayment of the said sum of thirty thousand pounds: And whereas the said outstanding debentures, amounting to one thousand two hundred pounds, have matured for payment, and a like amount of the said accumulated sinking fund is required to meet the payment thereof:

And whereas by the sixth section of "The Public Debts Sinking Funds Act Amendment Act, 1869," it is provided that when by law the liabilities in respect of any Provincial Loan or any part thereof, or the liabilities in respect of any portion of the Consolidated Loan into which such Provincial Loan or any part of such Provincial Loan shall have been converted, shall on or after the constitution of a new province, or on or after the constitution of the County of Westland, have been or shall be apportioned between the province by which such loan was raised on the one part, and the new province or

county, as the case may be, on the other part, then such moneys, being the proceeds of the sinking fund of such apportioned loan, shall be apportioned by the Commissioners under the said Act between the province raising such loan on the one part, and such new province or county, as the case may be, on the other part, in the like proportions as such liabilities have been by law apportioned:

And whereas under the provisions of "The Canterbury and Westland Debt Apportionment Act, 1868," the debts of the then Province of Canterbury were duly apportioned between the then Province of Canterbury and the then County of Westland in

the proportion of nine to four:

Now, know ye that the Commissioners of the Public Debts Sinking Funds, by this their award in writing, do determine that the sum of nineteen thousand one hundred and eighty-five pounds nineteen shillings and sixpence, being part of the said accumulated sinking fund held by them for the payment of the debentures issued under "The Lyttelton and Christchurch Railway Loan Ordinance, 1860, and that the sum of fifteen thousand four hundred and ninety pounds twelve shillings, being part of the said accumulated sinking fund held by them for the payment of the debentures issued under "The Canterbury Loan Ordinance, 1862," and that the sum of five hundred and twenty-three pounds ten shillings and ninepence, being part of the said accumulated sinking fund held by them for the payment of the debentures issued under the Canterbury "Loan Ordinance, Session VII., No. 3," shall be released; and that the sum of twenty-four thousand three hundred and sixty pine pounds six shillings three hundred and sixty-nine pounds six shillings and twopence, being the proportion of the sinking funds so released appertaining to the Province of Canterbury, shall be paid over to the Provincial Account of the Province of Canterbury; and that the sum of ten thousand eight hundred and thirty nounds sixteen shillings and one penny being the pounds sixteen shillings and one penny, being the proportion of such released sinking funds appertaining to the Province of Westland, shall be paid over to the Provincial Account of the Province of Westland, shall be paid over to the Provincial Account of the Province of Westland land, as provided by the sixth section of "The Public Debts Sinking Funds Act Amendment Act, 1869."

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The estimates of the populations of the boroughs given here are not as before merely an addition of the excess of births over deaths to the census figures for March, 1874, as it has become evident that such estimates are not sufficiently accurate. The number of persons to a house has been assumed to be the same as when the census was taken, and the population calculated on the number of inhabited houses in each borough at the present time, as shown in returns supplied by the municipal authorities.

Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from Zymotic disease in the 7 boroughs was 46.94 on every 100 deaths, against 36.23 in December, 1876, and 17.92 in November. Scarlatina caused five deaths: 2 at Christchurch and 3 at Dunedin. There were 11 deaths from this cause in the previous month. The deaths from Diphtheria were 3 at Wellington; the number for December was 6. The total deaths for January 1877 exceeds that for the previous month by 9. 38 deaths resulted from Dysentery and Diarrhea in January against 19 in December. Those for January occurred as follows:—Auckland 4, Thames 1, Wellington 18, Nelson 3, Christchurch 8, Dunedin 1, Hokitika 3. There were 2 deaths from Cholera at Wellington last month, but none in December.

Diseases of the Respiratory System .- 7 deaths in January, being a decrease on the December number.

Violent Deaths.—These were 10 in number. One man was killed by upsetting of a cart, and a hoy by fall from his horse. Three men were killed by fall of earth, one by dislocation of neck caused by diving; one by rupture of brain from fall. A boy was dragged in a tether rope by a cow until dead. A child was scalded to death, and another killed by sunstroke.

Comparison with January, 1876.—The mortality from Zymotic disease was greater in January, 1876, than last month, the numbers having been respectively 60 and 69. Scarlatina or Whooping Cough did not cause any deaths in January of 1876; but the numbers for Fever, Dysentery, and Diarrhea do not differ greatly for the two months under comparison. Diseases of the Respiratory Organs were fatal in 7 cases for each month; and the total mortality shows a decrease of 7 deaths for January, 1876.
