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*Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrates' Districts of Nelson South-West Gold Fields and Greymouth.*

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates' Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' Districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be: And whereas by Proclamations bearing date the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did proclaim and constitute the Districts of Nelson South-West Gold Fields and Greymouth, as described in the said Proclamations respectively, to be Resident Magistrates' Districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said districts so constituted as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do

hereby alter the boundaries of the said Districts of Nelson South-West Gold Fields and Greymouth, as described in the Schedule hereto, as and from the first day of May next.

SCHEDULE.

NELSON SOUTH-WEST GOLD FIELDS DISTRICT.

THIS district is bounded towards the North by the southern boundary of the Collingwood District, defined in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 69, dated 21st December, 1867; towards the South-east and East by the Nelson District, defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* before mentioned, to the south-western angle thereof, and by the summit of the watershed of the north-eastern and south-eastern sources of the Grey River to the saddle between the Hurunui and Teremakau Rivers; towards the South-west by a right line to the junction of the Arnold River with Lake Brunner, thence by the Arnold River to its confluence with the Grey River, thence along the Paparoa Ranges to the watershed between the Punakaiko and Pororari Rivers, thence along the summit of that watershed to the ocean at the southern headland of the last-mentioned river; and towards the West by the ocean to the mouth of the Mackay River, the commencing point.

GREYMOUTH DISTRICT

Is bounded on the North and East by the Nelson South-West Gold Fields District, herebefore described, to the saddle between the Hurunui and Teremakau Rivers; thence towards the South by the said

Teremakau River to its mouth; and thence towards the North-west by the sea to the commencing point at the South Headland of the Pororari River.

*Lands proclaimed Waste Lands in the Land District of Wellington.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and any Act amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall by Proclamation declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as thereafter in the said Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown for the time being in force in the land district in which such land is situated, and thereupon such land so proclaimed shall become subject to such provisions:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto has been purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, and it is expedient that the said land should be declared to be waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims, and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown in force in the Land District of Wellington.

*Determining Land to be Site for the Town of Rangitoto.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the thirty-second section of "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," it is enacted that the sites of towns shall from time to time be determined by the Governor upon the recommendation of the County Council, and shall be notified by Proclamation in the Province of Westland Gazette:

And whereas by the sixty-seventh section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is provided that the recommendation aforesaid shall be made by the Waste Lands Board instead of by the County Council: And whereas the said Waste Lands Board has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be a site for a town within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby determine and fix the land described in the Schedule hereto to be a site for a town within the meaning of the thirty-second section of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of March, 1877.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Immigrants Land Act Amendment Act, 1875," it is enacted, that in any case where any person, who, since the passing of "The Immigrants Land Act, 1873," (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act,") and prior to the coming into operation of the now reciting Act, has paid his own passage to the colony with the intention of settling upon and cultivating land therein, and who has omitted to obtain any certificate or to do any other act by the said Act required to entitle him to a free grant of land thereunder, whether such omission shall have occurred prior to or after arrival in the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, on receiving proof that such person had a *bona fide* intention to comply with the said Act, to direct and declare that such person shall have and be entitled to all the privileges and benefits which he would have had under the said Act but for such omission as aforesaid: And further that every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the omission in respect of which such Order shall be made, and shall be forthwith published in the *New Zealand Gazette*; and thereupon the person named in such Order in Council shall have all the privileges and benefits which he would have had but for such omission as aforesaid:

And whereas proof has been received by the Governor that the persons mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto have paid their own passages to the colony with the intention of settling upon and cultivating land therein, and also that they had a *bona fide* intention to comply with the said Act, but have omitted to do the acts mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule by the said Act required to entitle them to free grants of land thereunder:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said "Immigrants Land Act Amendment Act, 1875," doth hereby direct and declare that the persons mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall have and be entitled to all the privileges and benefits which they would have had under the said Act but for such omission as aforesaid.

*Regulations and Rates for Storage and Delivery of Goods at the Lyttelton Railway Station in substitution of Clause 43 of By-laws and Regulations for Canterbury Railways fixed by Order in Council dated 26th October, 1875.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of March, 1877.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and of all other powers and authorities in any wise enabling him, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for Storage and Delivery of Goods at the Lyttelton Railway Station, and doth declare that the same shall come into force from the day of the date hereof, and shall be in lieu of clause 43 of the By-Laws and Regulations for the Canterbury Railways fixed by Order in Council dated 26th October, 1875, so far as it relates to the Lyttelton Railway Station.

Any goods, merchandise, or luggage forwarded for shipment which shall not be taken delivery of by the consignee within five working hours after arrival in Lyttelton, and which shall not be shipped within that time, may be stored at the risk of the consignees or owners (or may be kept in the railway wagons at the option of the Railway Department) up to forty-eight working hours, for which a distinct charge of two shillings per ton will be made for storage and delivery to ship; afterwards threepence per ton per week or fraction thereof will be charged for storage for two weeks; after two weeks, sixpence per ton per week or fraction thereof: Provided that delivery must be taken at any time on demand after three weeks' storage. Haulage and delivery from private stores to wharves, one shilling and sixpence per ton.

*Regulations and Orders under "The Counties Act, 1876."*

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Counties Act, 1876," it is, among other things, enacted, that in all cases in which no provision or no sufficient provision is in the opinion of the Governor made by the said Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, for the purpose of facilitating or more effectually carrying into execution any of the objects of the said Act, to make and prescribe all such regulations and orders, either general, or applicable to particular cases only, as he shall think fit, and such regulations and orders from time to time to revoke or alter as to the Governor shall appear to be requisite: And whereas first elections for the election of Members of the several County Councils have been held, but the time for the formation and completion of voters' rolls for the Ridings of the Counties prescribed by the said Act has not arrived: And whereas extraordinary vacancies have occurred in several of the said Counties, and such vacancies may hereafter occur before the said rolls are so formed and completed as aforesaid: And whereas, in my opinion, no sufficient provision is made by the said Act for the election of Councillors in Counties in which the whole of the said Act is in force, and prior to the formation and completion of such voters' rolls as aforesaid, and it

is expedient that general rules and orders should be made for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and for the purpose of facilitating and more effectually carrying into execution the objects thereof, do hereby make and prescribe the following Regulations and Orders, namely,—

1. Until the formation and coming into force of voters' rolls for the election of members of County Councils in Counties in which the whole of the said Act is in force, the persons entitled to vote at such elections in each Riding shall be those mentioned in the fifty-first section of the said Act; and all such persons qualified or entitled as in the said section mentioned shall be deemed to be county electors within each Riding for the purposes of such elections.

2. If at the time of the coming into operation of these regulations and orders there shall be an extraordinary vacancy in the Council of any County in which the whole of the said Act is in force, the Returning Officer for the Riding in which such vacancy exists shall, subject hereto, do and perform all acts, matters, and things, prescribed by law in respect of his office in and about such election.

3. These regulations and orders shall apply and extend to all extraordinary vacancies in the office of

Councillor which have occurred or which may hereafter occur in any County in which the whole of the said Act is in force, and they shall cease to have any operation upon the coming into force of voters' rolls, as provided by "The Counties Act, 1876."
