Cardrona Depasturing District—Additional Regulations.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made and issued under the authority of the fourteenth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," bearing date the twelfth day of March last past, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the fifteenth day of March aforesaid, a certain district within the Provincial District of Otago was constituted a Depasturing District, and certain Regulations for the depasturing of stock within the aforesaid Depasturing District were also made and proclaimed by the same instrument:

And whereas it is expedient to make other regulations in addition to the regulations heretofore made and published as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare, that from and after the day of the date hereof, the Depasturing District constituted by the aforesaid Proclamation of the twelfth day of March last, as the same is described in the Schedule annexed to the said Proclamation, shall be named the

CARDRONA DEPASTURING DISTRICT;

and also, that from and after the day of the date hereof, the following regulations shall take effect within the said Depasturing District in addition to the regulations for the same heretofore made and published as aforesaid:

ADDITIONAL DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

1. John Kevin, John Fox, John McGrath, Henry Millar, and Ralph Halliday, all of Cardrona, or such other persons as the Governor may from time to time, by warrant, appoint, shall be and are hereby appointed the Board of Wardens for the above-named Cardrona Depasturing District.

2. The said John Kevin shall be the first Chairman of the Board. Every successive Chairman shall be elected by the majority of the votes of the Wardens.

3. In case of the absence of the Chairman, the Wardens present shall appoint one of themselves to preside for the day at any meeting of the Board.

4. The Chairman shall have a casting vote in cases of equality of votes.

5. The Receiver of Gold Revenue at Arrowtown

for the time being shall be and is hereby appointed to give effect to all Depasturing Regulations in force within the Cardrona Depasturing District, and to see that the same are properly carried out and obeyed.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-ninth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

Gold Field proclaimed at Waikawa, Otago.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by Proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the colony to be a gold field under the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that all that portion of the Colony of New Zealand the limits whereof are defined in the Schedule annexed hereunto should be constituted a gold field:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act, do hereby proclaim, constitute, and appoint all that portion of the colony which is described in the Schedule hereunto annexed to be a gold field under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to be called and known as

THE WAIKAWA GOLD FIELD.

This nearly agrees by bearings with the position of Port Hutt, as ascertained by the U.S. Transit of Venus Expedition, December, 1874. The relative position of West Reef and other places to the northward and westward of Waitangi appears to be correct, and the whole island seems to be placed 9 miles to the westward of its true position.
