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Appointing the Corporation of the Town of Oamaru to execute Ordinances of Otago intituled "The Common Lodging-Houses' Ordinance, 1862," and "The Common Lodging Houses Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1864."

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, intituled "The Common Lodging-Houses' Ordinance, 1862," it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall apply within and throughout the City of Dunedin and Town of Port Chalmers respectively, and within and throughout all other towns, districts, and places to which the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, may think fit to extend it, upon notice of such extension being published in the Provincial Government Gazette; and it is further enacted that the said Ordinance shall be executed within and for all or any parts of any other town, district, or place by such body or person or persons as the Superintendent, with the advice of the Executive Council, may see fit to appoint:

And whereas the said Ordinance has been amended by "The Common Lodging Houses Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1864":

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette of the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, did extend the said "Common Lodging-Houses' Ordinance, 1862," and "The Common Lodging Houses Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1864," to the Town of Oamaru in the said Province of Otago:

And whereas by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," all the powers, duties, and functions by the said Ordinances vested in or to be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of the said province are now vested in and are to be executed and performed by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the Corporation of the Town of Oamaru to execute the said "Common Lodging-Houses' Ordinance, 1862," and

"Common Lodging Houses Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1864," within and for the Town of Oamaru:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Acts, do hereby proclaim and appoint the Corporation of the Town of Oamaru to execute the several provisions of the said "Common Lodging-Houses' Ordinance, 1862," and "The Common Lodging Houses Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1864," within and for the said Town of Oamaru.

Proclaiming certain Lands to be Waste Lands of the Crown.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, proclaim the confiscated lands within any land district to be waste lands of the Crown.

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine

Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the confiscated lands in the Land District of Auckland which are particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby declared to be waste lands of the Crown.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland, bounded towards the North by the Mangakapua Stream from a point near peg 99 to its confluence with the Mangarui Stream, thence by the Mangarui Stream to its confluence with the Wairoa River, thence by the Wairoa River to the confluence of the Mangapoiki River, thence by the Mangapoiki River to a point North of Trigonometrical Station Orahi, 151000 links; towards the East by a right line bearing South 31' 19" west from the Mangapoiki Stream through Trigonometrical Station Orahi to the Makaretu Stream, thence by the Makaretu Stream to the intersection of the aforesaid right line through Orahi, thence by the said line to the Kauhauroa Stream, 37760 links; towards the South by the Kauhauroa Stream to its confluence with the Waiiau River, thence by the Waiiau River to the confluence of the Waikare Taheke, 210400 links; towards the West by the Waikare Taheke and a line bearing North 34° 09' East from the said river through pegs 103 and 99 to the Mangakapu Stream at the starting point, 53400 links; be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. Altering Regulations for the Depasturing of Stock upon certain Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fourteenth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make, alter, and revoke regulations for the depasturing of stock upon any lands within proclaimed gold fields for which a lease or license for depasturing purposes has not been granted, or has been cancelled or suspended, and to regulate the number of horses or cattle which may be run upon such lands by the holders of miners' rights and business licenses, or of mining, mineral, and agricultural leases, or by other persons, and to issue depasturing licenses, and to regulate the fees that shall be paid therefor: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 897, on the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the Executive Government of the Province of Otago did, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to them by the Governor in Council in that behalf, make certain regulations under the said fourteenth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," for the depasturing of stock upon the lands described in the First and Second Schedules to the said Proclamation: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said regulations so made by the said Executive Government of the said Province of Otago in certain particulars:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the said regulations so made by the said Executive Government of the Province of Otago as aforesaid shall be altered by substituting the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Provincial District of Otago for the Superintendent wherever the word Superintendent occurs in the said regulations; and I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the said regulations shall henceforth be read and construed as if wherever in the said regulations the word Superintendent occurs the words "Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Provincial District of Otago for the time being" had been inserted in lieu thereof; and I do hereby order and declare that all powers and authorities by virtue hereof and of the said regulations to be exercised by the said Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be so exercised, subject to the consent and approval of the Waste Lands Board of the said Provincial District of Otago.

Defining the Middle Line of part of the Railway from Kaipara through Riverhead to Auckland.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and twenty-second section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that every railway shall be made only under the authority of a special Act, which shall state as nearly as may be the line of the railway and the two termini thereof; and by the one hundred and twenty-third section of the same Act, that the several railways specified in the fourth schedule to the said Act shall be deemed to have been made, and in so far as any of them are unfinished may be completed, under the provisions of the Act now under recital, and the said Act shall be deemed to be a special Act authorizing the construction of each of the said railways; and by the one hundred and twenty-fourth section of the same Act, that when any railway is to be constructed under the provisions of any special Act the Governor shall issue a proclamation defining the middle line of the railway or any part thereof, and may from time to time, by a proclamation revoking or amending such former proclamation, alter such line in any manner or to any extent which may be found necessary for the construction of such railway within the provisions of the said special Act; and by the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of the same Act, that the Minister shall cause to be made and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court such maps and plans as may be necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such proclamation; and whereas the railway from Kaipara through Riverhead to Auckland is one of the railways specified in the said fourth schedule, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the two termini of the said line shall be No. 23, Section 4, Parish of Waitemata, County Eden, and Section 90, Parish of Waikomiti, County Waitemata. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 5682, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable John Davies Ormond, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the Office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point in No. 23, Section 4, Parish of Waitemata, County Eden, about 8 chains south of Newmarket Station, and running thence generally in a South-westerly direction in the manner delineated

on the map and plan marked P.W.D. 5682, signed by the Honorable John Davies Ormond, Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court, at Auckland; and terminating at a point in Section 90, Parish of Waikomiti, County Waitemata, the total length being 9 miles 61 chains, or thereabouts.

WHEREAS by section twenty-three of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that if not less than one-half of the burgesses of any ward of a divided borough petition the Governor, praying him to divide such ward into two, and publish such petition, and no counter-petition is presented to the Governor, signed by not less than one-fourth of the burgesses of the other wards, within two months from such publication, the Governor may, by Proclamation, divide such ward into two wards, with such names and boundaries as he thinks fit: And whereas a petition was, on the sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, presented to His Excellency the Governor by not less than one-half of the burgesses of the Te Aro Ward, in the Borough of the City of Wellington, praying him to divide such ward into two, and such petition was duly published, and no counter-petition has been presented to His Excellency as by the said section is provided:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of

New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the hereinbefore recited Act, and in exercise of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Te Aro Ward, of the Borough of the City of Wellington, shall be and the same is hereby divided into two wards, named respectively Te Aro Ward and Cook Ward; and that the boundaries of the said Te Aro Ward shall be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and the boundaries of the said Cook Ward shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

And whereas the said Punu died intestate:

WHEREAS by the ninth section of "The Harbour Boards Act, 1870," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time delegate to any Harbour Board constituted thereunder all or any of the powers and authorities vested in him by the provisions contained in the seventh and tenth sections of "The Marine Act, 1867," subject to any regulations, restrictions, or stipulations that may be specified in such Order:

And whereas by an Ordinance of the Provincial Council of Taranaki intituled "The New Plymouth Harbour Board Ordinance, 1875," a Harbour Board was constituted for the Port of New Plymouth:

And whereas it is expedient that certain powers should be delegated to the New Plymouth Harbour Board, as in manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby delegate unto the

NEW PLYMOUTH HARBOUR BOARD

aforesaid the several powers and authorities mentioned and set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, such powers and authorities to be exercised within

the limits of the Port of New Plymouth, as defined in a warrant bearing date the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-third day of November, in the same year: subject, however, to such restrictions as in the said Schedule set forth.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore in part recited power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, I do hereby delegate unto the said New Plymouth Harbour Board all the powers vested in the Governor in Council by the tenth section of "The Marine Act, 1867." Rules and Regulations under "The Stamp Fee Act, 1875."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stamp Fee Act, 1875," it is provided that the Governor in Council may, by notice published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, direct, that after the time specified in such notice all or any of the duties, fees, fines, or penalties for the time being payable in money in any public department or office connected with the public service, or to the officers thereof, shall be collected by means of stamps; and after the time so specified the duties, fees, fines, or penalties therein mentioned shall be received by stamps denoting the sums payable, and not in money:

And whereas it is further provided that the Governor in Council may make, alter, or repeal regulations not contrary to the said Act for the due administration thereof, and may, subject to the said Act, prescribe the documents on which the stamps denoting payment of any such sums shall be impressed, or to which they shall be affixed for the purpose aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in pursuance and exercise of the above-recited powers and authorities, doth hereby give the notice and make the rules and regulations hereinafter contained concerning the matters aforesaid:—

1. On and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, all duties, fees, fines, and penalties payable to any Registrar of Deeds or District Land Registrar within the Colony of New Zealand by virtue of his office shall be paid by stamps in manner hereinafter provided.

2. There shall be for the purpose aforesaid a stamp to be called "The Land and Deeds Stamp," and all fees to which these regulations apply shall be paid either by impressed or adhesive stamps of the denomination aforesaid, and none other.

3. Fees in respect of the several matters specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be paid by stamps impressed on or affixed to the documents respectively specified for that purpose in the second column of the said Schedule. All other fees shall be paid by stamps impressed on or affixed to the documents in respect of which such fees are payable, in manner provided by the said Act.

4. No matter or thing for which a fee is paid by adhesive stamp shall be done or permitted to be done by any Registrar of Deeds or District Land Registrar until such stamp shall have been cancelled by the

person using the same by writing or stamping on or across such stamp his name or initials, or the name or initials of his firm, together with the true date of his so writing or stamping the same, so that such stamp may be effectually cancelled and rendered incapable of being used for any other purpose whatever. It shall be the duty of the Registrar of Deeds or District Land Registrar, as the case may be, to further obliterate such stamp when used by stamping the same with the seal of his office.

5. No stamp of less value than one shilling shall be issued or used under these regulations. In assessment of fees to which these regulations apply, fractional parts of one shilling shall not be charged unless exceeding sixpence, in which case such fractional part shall be charged as one shilling.

6. Land and Deeds stamps may be obtained from the Deputy Commissioners of Stamps, and from the depositaries and licensed dealers in stamps in the principal towns.

7. Depositaries and licensed dealers are required to sell stamps on demand at all times during office hours. Such stamps must be paid for in cash at the time of application.

8. A commission in the form of discount will be allowed on all purchases of stamps issued under the said Act, after the following scale:—To licensed dealers, 2½ per cent. on all purchases of £2 and upwards; to all other persons, 2½ per cent. on all purchases of £5 and upwards.

9. The regulations for the time being in force as to allowance of spoiled stamps shall, as nearly as may be, extend and apply to stamps issued and used under these regulations.

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF NEW ZEALAND.

ALTERATION OF THE DATE OF THE SITTINGS OF THE FULL COURT UNDER "THE DIVORCE AND MATRIMONIAL CAUSES ACT, 1867."

WHEREAS in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 29, of Thursday, April 5th, 1877, notice was therein given that three or more of the Judges of the Supreme Court would sit at the Supreme Court House, Wellington, on Monday, the twenty-first day of May next, to hear and determine petitions for the dissolution or for a sentence of nullity of marriage, under section 60 of "The Divorce and Matrimonial
