Proclaiming Caversham a Borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section seventeen of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," The Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any district in New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district of Caversham shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, a borough under the said Act; and that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Caversham, and the boundaries of such borough shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land bounded on the North by the Southern Recreation Grounds and Town Belt of the City of Dunedin from a road fronting Otago Harbour known as Anderson's Bay Road to the middle of the Main South Road; thence by the middle of the Main South Road through Sections 13, 14, and 15, Block seven (VII.), Town District, to where the eastern boundary of Section 5, Block six (VI.), Town District, cuts that road; thence along the eastern side of said Section 5, Block six (VI.); and thence by the northern boundary of Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 18, 19, 22, 23, 26, 27, 30, 31, 33, 34, 37, 38, 41, and 42, Block six (VI.), Town District: Bounded on the West by Section 45,

Block six (VI.), Town District, to the middle of the Main South Road; thence by the middle of the Main South Road to the district road in Section 39, Block six (VI.), Town District; thence along the middle of the said district road to where it joins another district road, then along the middle of that other road to the corner of Section 21, Ocean Beach District; thence by the western boundaries of Sections 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32, Ocean Beach District, in a straight line to the Southern Ocean: Bounded on the South by the Southern Ocean: Bounded on the East by the incorporated Towns of St. Kilda and South Dunedin to a point opposite Section 8, Block seven (VII.), Town District, where a road line joins the before-mentioned Anderson's Bay Road; from said point along the middle of the said road to the City of Dunedin.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay intituled "The Cattle Trespass and Impounding Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time, by Proclamation, to appoint public pounds and poundkeepers at such places as he may think fit, and at any time to annul such appointments: And whereas by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now vested in the Governor:

SOUTH ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

THE detached bank at the outer edge of the bar at the South Passage—which, by the notice published in June, 1875, had to be passed at a short cable's distance—having now worked further to the southward, the directions for crossing the bar with the knoll in line with the triple hill are no longer applicable. The bar should now be crossed with the beacons in line, or open to the southward about four or five times their own width, when a depth of not less than 14½ feet will be found at low-water springs.

There is now a depth of 5ft. at low water over the detached bank.
