

Declaring "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," in force within the Spring Creek River District.

#### (L.S.) NOBMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue of the power vested in me by the third section of "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Act shall come into force in respect of all elective offices of the Board of Conservators elected under "The Hawke's Bay and Marlborough Rivers Act, 1868," for the district known as the Spring Creek District, situate in the Provincial District of Marlborough.

Proclaiming certain Lands in Hawke's Bay to be Waste Lands of the Crown.

#### NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

(L.S.)

WHEBEAS by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time,

by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, proclaim the confiscated lands within any land district to be waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the confiscated lands in the Land District of Hawke's Bay, which are particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby declared to be waste lands of the Crown.

#### SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay known as the Tarawera Reserve, containing by admeasurement two thousand (2,000) acres, more or less. Bounded towards the Northwest by Crown lands seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-six (7826) links; towards the Northeast by Crown lands twenty-five thousand five hundred and fifty-six (25556) links; towards the South-east by Crown lands seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-six (7826) links; and towards the South-west by Crown lands twenty-five thousand five hundred and fifty-six (25556) links; be all the aforesaid linkages more or less, as the same is delineated on the plans in the Provincial District Survey Office at Napier.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, being part of the block known as the Te Haroto Reserve, containing by admeasurement four hundred and ninety-one (491) acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-west by part of the said block and Crown lands six thousand nine hundred and eighty-eight (6988) links; towards the North-east by Crown lands seven thousand and twenty-four (7024) links; towards the South-east by Crown lands seven thousand and seventeen (7017) links; and towards the South-west by Crown lands seven thousand and six (7006) links, be all the aforesaid linkages more or less, as the same is delineated on the plans deposited on the office of the Chief Surveyor at Napier.

Regulations under "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876."

#### NORMANBY, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that in any district now or from time to time hereafter constituted under the provisions of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876," the following Regulations providing for the appointment of Returning Officers, and for ascertaining and certifying the qualification of persons claiming to vote at every election of Trustees, and for issuing, executing, and returning the necessary writs for the election of Trustees, and for the orderly, effective, and impartial conduct of such elections, shall take effect :

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these Regulations, the following terms and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless

"Landowner" has the same meaning as is assigned to it by "the Act." "Returning Officer" means the person appointed

under these Regulations to conduct the elections of trustees of a district under the Act. "Trustees" mean the trustees for a district. "District" has the same meaning as is assigned to

it in the Act. "Resident Magistrate" means the Resident Magistrate having jurisdiction in the district, or if there is no such Resident Magistrate, or more than one, then such Resident Magistrate as the Governor may from time to time appoint to perform the duties and exercise the functions imposed on the Resident Magistrate by these Regulations, and shall include any person acting as or fulfilling the duties of such Resident Magistrate. "Publicly notified" and "public notice" shall

have the same meaning as is assigned to such words in the Act.

2. The Resident Magistrate shall, by writing, from time to time appoint Returning Officers. Any Returning Officer may at any time be removed by the Resident Magistrate, who may fill up any vacancy that may at any time occur by death, resignation, removal, or otherwise in the office of Return-ing Officer. Each Returning Officer shall within his district do all things required touching the conduct of elections of trustees of the district; and, in so far as may be consistent with the Act, and any Proclamation issued thereunder, and these Regula-

tions, such election shall be held, taken, conducted, and determined in manner required by "The Regula-tion of Local Elections Act, 1876;" and the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act, so far as the same can be applied to elections of trustees under the Act, shall be deemed and taken to be Regulations made under the Act. The provisions of sections 6, 12, 13, 14, and 15 of the said. "Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," shall not apply to the first elections of trustees directed to be held by the Governor under the 5th section of the Act. Whenever it shall be necessary to elect a trustee or trustees, the Resident Magistrate shall issue a writ for the election of such trustee or trustees. The Returning Officer shall fix a time and place for the holding of the election, and shall give public notice of such time and place. 3. The voter's roll for first election of trustees shall be prepared by the Resident Magistrate within

shall be prepared by the Resident Magistrate within thirty days from the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette. Such roll shall be in force until the 1st day of March in the next following year.

4. The Resident Magistrate shall, in every year, prepare a fresh roll, which roll shall be the roll for such year as from the first day of March until the first day of March then next following.

5. Such rolls shall be formed by placing thereon the name of every landowner who, under the pro-visions of the Act, is entitled to vote at an election of trustees.

6. The rolls so to be formed may be partly written and partly printed, or wholly written or printed, as may be most convenient, and shall, fourteen days before the 1st day of March in every year, be published by the Resident Magistrate by affixing the same to the outer door of the Resident Magistrate's Courthouse, if there be one in the district, or, if there be no such Court-house, then in or on some other public or conspicuous place in such district; but publica-tion shall not be necessary in the case of the roll prepared for the first election pursuant to the Act.

7. During such fourteen days the Resident Magis-trate shall, if it be established that the name of any person entitled to vote in the election of trustees has been omitted from or erroneously inserted on such roll, to place on such roll the name so omitted, or to strike out the name so erroneously inserted on such roll.

The Resident Magistrate shall sign the roll for the first election, and every subsequent roll when so amended. When so signed such roll shall be con-clusive evidence that the persons whose names are on such roll, and no others, are the persons entitled to vote in the election of trustees for the district.

9. If the Resident Magistrate is absent from the district, then the roll shall be signed by the Clerk to such Resident Magistrate; and such rolls so signed as aforesaid shall be the voters' rolls to be used respec-

tively at the election of the trustees. 10. The Resident Magistrate shall, on the request of the Returning Officer, cause such officer to be supplied with a sufficient number of copies of the voter's roll as may be necessary for the purposes of the elections in the district.

Constituting Rabbit District of Hokanui.

#### NORMANBY, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section 3 of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, on receipt of a petition duly signed by not less than ten landowners residing within any district proposed to be proclaimed under the said Act, cause the prayer and substance of such petition to be gazetted and publicly notified, and, unless a counter petition by an equal or greater number of landowners to the contrary is received by the Governor within thirty days from the date of such publication, the Governor may, by Proclamation, constitute and declare the area described by such petition to be a district for the purposes of the said Act, by some specific name: And whereas a petition has been received under the said Act, signed by not less than ten landowners residing within the area described in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be declared a Rabbit District under the said Act, and the Governor in Council has caused the prayer and substance of such petition to be duly gazetted and publicly notified as by the said Act required, and no counter petition, as prescribed by the said Act, has been received by the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim, constitute, and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a district for the purposes of the said Act, and the name of such district to be Hokanui. And I do further direct that Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of August, now next, at twelve noon, at the Homestead of Patrick Kinney McCaughan, Esquire, at Wantwood, Gore, Southland, shall be the time and place for holding a meeting of the land owners of such district for the purpose of electing either three or five persons to be the trustees of such district, for the purposes of the said Act.

Land withdrawn from the Westland Gold Field.

#### (L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time subsequent to the Proclamation of a goldfield, to withdraw by Proclamation therefrom any Crown lands which he may deem it necessary to withdraw, and that such lands shall thenceforth be dealt with, sold, occupied, and disposed of under any law or laws for the time being in force regulating the sale, occupation, or disposal, or in any way affecting or relating to the management or dealing with the Crown lands within the province in which such gold field is situate, in like manner in every respect as though such lands had never been comprised in any proclaimed gold field:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority for this purpose vested in me, do hereby withdraw from the Westland Gold Field, proclaimed on the twenty-second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, which is included within the said gold field.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Oyster Fisheries Act, 1866," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, declare any natural oysterbed to be closed against dredging for any period to be stated in such Proclamation: And whereas it is expedient that the natural oyster-bed at Halfmoon Bay, in Stewart Island, should be temporarily closed:

WHEREAS by section seventeen of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any district in New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation:

#### (LS.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any of the several places specified in the Third Schedule to the said Act in which a Municipal Corporation has been established under the provisions of an Ordinance of the Province of Otago intituled "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," from a day to be named in such Proclamation : subject, however, to certain conditions in the said section mentioned : And whereas the Town of South Dunedin, in the Provincial District of Otago, is one of the places specified in the said Third Schedule, and a petition has been presented to his Excellency the Governor by fifty-seven of the ratepayers of such town praying him to constitute such town into a borough under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and such petition was, on the twentythird day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, publicly notified, and no petition from an equal or greater number of such ratepayers was presented to His Excellency within two months after such public notification, praying him not to assent to the prayer of such first-mentioned petition :

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from the twentythird day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the said Town of South Dunedin shall be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and shall be called the Borough of South Dunedin ; and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

ROCK, FLINDERS PASSAGE, TORRES STRAITS. THE following additional information relative to the rock in Flinders Passage, of which a notice was issued from this office on the 6th March last, has been received from Captain Hannah :-

The rock, which is small in extent, and steep-to on all sides, lies in the following position, viz. :-

Channel Rock ...

West. North-western extreme of King Point on with the hill standing midway be-

tween that point and Horned Hill ... S. <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> E. The Police Magistrate's house on Vivien Point being nearly in line with the South-east peak of Friday Island.

Vessels entering the Passage from the eastward should keep the North Point of Prince of Wales' Island in line with the north-west extremity of Horn Island while passing the line of the Midway Hill and King Point. After passing this line, the northern end of the Channel Rock should be steered for until the north-west end of Horn Island bears S.W., when the buoys at the eastern end of Ellis Channel will be in sight, and a course may be steered for the anchorage under Thursday Island accordingly.

#### DIRECTIONS FOR BURRUM RIVER.

FROM the Fairway Buoy, Hervey's Bay, steer W.S.W. until the beacon on the bar of the Burrum, about 101 miles distant, is sighted; or, if from the northward, do not, in passing Burrum Point, approach the shore within  $l_{\frac{1}{2}}$  miles; then bring the bar beacon to bear W. by S. and steer for it, passing it at a distance of about 50 yards on the port hand, then keep the first red beacon (which will be seen to the W.N.W.) on the port bow, and as it is ap-proached gradually haul up and pass it at a distance of about 50 yards on the starboard hand. A black beacon, which stands on a rocky patch, will then be seen ahead, and, when passing it on the port hand, the first white leading mark will open out in a northwesterly direction; steer for it, passing a black bea-con on a sand-spit on the port hand. When abreast the white beacon, follow the starboard shore at a distance of about 100 yards until abreast of the high land, when another white leading mark, on the north shore, will open out; steer past it, and thence to a third beacon on an island; thence back to one on the north side of the entrance to the Gregory; thence to another, in a south-easterly direction, on the opposite shore, passing on the starboard side, and, at a distance of 40 yards, a red beacon on a ledge of rocks. When the white beacon is neared another will be seen on the north shore. When it is reached keep that shore close on board, passing a black bea-con on the port hand. When abreast the upper part of the mangroves cross over to a white beacon on the south shore, and when it is passed keep a mid-

channel course, leaving a black beacon on a sand-spit, on the port hand; thence follow the curving shore round past the mouth of the Isis River, round-When abreast the next ing closely a bluff point. When abreast the next white beacon steer for another on the south shore, and keep that shore on board. After passing the next island below Blue's Flats, haul up sharp round a black beacon, and keep the port shore again on board, leaving a small island on the starboard side. The channel here is very intricate. When abreast of the upper end of the next island, haul up round another black beacon, and regain and keep the port shore on board until a red beacon on a sand bank is neared; pass it close on the starboard hand and a black beacon on the port hand, and then steer for the next white beacon on the south shore, passing an island on the starboard hand; then keep the starboard shore on board, passing Waterhole Flats, where, in the centre of the river, a sand patch dries at low water. When at these flats another white beacon will be in sight on the same side; steer for it, passing the islands on the port hand, and keep that shore close on board until three more beacons on the same shore are passed. When the last island is neared, steer for a white beacon on the port shore, leaving the island on the starboard hand. After passing the island keep a mid-channel course, and, when near Smith's house, haul over to the starboard shore, keeping that side to avoid some foul ground. From this point Whitley's coal-shoot will be in sight. From the upper crossing mark to Whitley's Falls, the river is clear, from side to side.

Strangers would probably save time by anchoring close abreast the island below the Gregory, in 11 feet at low water, and by boat personally examining the channel of the river above this spot before attempting to proceed further with their vessels. The depth of water on the outer bar, at low-water

springs, is 1 foot, with a rise of 9 feet; at neaps, 2 feet, with a rise of 5 feet; on the Flats at springs, 1 foot, with a rise of 6 feet; at neaps, 1 foot, with a rise of 4 feet.
