Lands declared to be Waste Lands of the Crown in the Land District of Auckland.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and any Act amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall by Proclamation declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as thereafter in the said Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown for the time being in force in the land district in which such land is situated; and thereupon such land so proclaimed shall become subject to such provisions:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto has been purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, and it is expedient that the said land should be declared to be waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be Waste Lands of the Crown, subject to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown in force in the Land District of Auckland.

SCHEDULE.

ARAKIORE No. 2.

ALL that parcel of land at Kaukapakapa, in the District of Kaipara, in the Provincial District of Auckland, known by the name of Arakiore No. 2, containing by admeasurement four hundred and fifty-two (452) acres, or thereabouts. Bounded towards the North by the Kaukapakapa South Block seven hundred and forty-five (745) links and twelve thousand five hundred and seventy (12570) links; towards the South-east by the Tikokopu Block two thousand one hundred and thirty (2130) links, four thousand two hundred (4200) links, seven thousand five hundred and eighty (7580) links, nine hundred and sixteen (916) links, and two hundred and fifty-two (252) links; and towards the South-west by the Rautawhiri No. 2 Block, three thousand seven hundred and eight (3708) links; again towards the North by the Kaikai Block two hundred and thirty-five (235) links, one hundred and eighty-six (186) links, one hundred and ninety-five (195) links, five hundred and two (502) links, three hundred and fifty (350) links, five hundred and five (505) links, two hundred and four (204) links, and two hundred and eighty-seven (287) links; and towards the West by the last-named block two thousand seven hundred and sixty-four (2764) links, two hundred and ninety-one (291) links, and nine hundred and forty-three (943) links.

TE AUKUMEROA.

All that piece of land at Whangarei, in the District of Kaipara, in the Provincial District of Auckland, known by the name of Te Aukumeroa, containing by admeasurement three thousand and forty-five (3045) acres, or thereabouts. Bounded towards the North-east and East by the Awarua River; towards the South by Te Aia Heketoro Creek by lines one thousand five hundred and fifty (1550) links and two thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven (2967) links, the Mangakahia River, a reserve four thousand seven hundred and ninety-

four (4794) links, and again by the Mangakahia River; towards the West by the Koekoea Creek, by lines four thousand one hundred and ten (4110) links and one thousand one hundred and thirty-seven (1137) links, and Te Kawaka Creek; and towards the North by the Otaianga River.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

Lands declared to be Waste Lands of the Crown in the Land District of Taranaki.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, proclaim the confiscated lands within any land district to be waste lands of the Crown: And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are confiscated lands within the Land District of Taranaki, and it is expedient that such lands should be proclaimed waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said fourteenth section, do hereby proclaim and declare the lands described in the Schedule hereto to be waste lands of the Crown.

SCHEDULE.

PUKEMAHOE.

ALL that block of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki known by the name of Pukemahoe, containing by estimation one thousand (1,000) acres, or thereabouts, and bounded as follows:—Commencing at the mouth of the Mangapureo Stream, where it joins the Waitara River, thence up a ridge continuing on to Ratawaero, thence to Kaimiko, thence following the boundary of the Waitara-Taramouku Block to the Kairoa Stream, turning here to the East, and following that stream till it falls into the Waitara River, afterwards following the course of the said river in its windings on to Mangapureo aforesaid. Excepting out of the hereinbefore described area a Native burial-ground at Pohohitoa containing one (1) acre, or thereabouts.

RUAPEKAPEKA.

All that block of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki known by the name of Ruapekapeka, containing by estimation four hundred (400) acres, or thereabouts, and bounded as follows:—Commencing at the mouth of the Mangamoeahu River, where it joins the Waitara River at Kopua, following the side of the Waitara River to Aupapa, turning here and going up a ridge on to Ruapekapeka, turning here to the North, and going on, and then turning to the East, and going on to Tautari, then turning to the North, and going on to Te Kawau, then turning to the East, and going on and following the survey line in its windings to Poukaikatoa, turning here to the South, and running along the boundary line of the Waitara-Taramouku Block to the Mangamoeahu River at Pakaitangata, turning here and following the course of the Mangamoeahu River to its mouth, the point of commencement.

TE WERA.

All that block of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki, known by the name of Te Wera, containing by estimation six thousand three hundred and twenty (6,320) acres, or thereabouts. Bounded on the North by the Waitara River, commencing at its junction with the Mangaopa Stream; on the West by the Waitara River to its junction with the Makauhau Stream, thence by the Huiroa Block to Upokotoia; on the South by an irregular line running from Upokotoia eastward, crossing the Makuri River; and on the East by an irregular line running northward to Te Wera, thence to the Mangaopa Stream, following the course of said stream to its junction with the Waitara River. Excepting out of the hereinbefore described area a Native reserve at Mangaopa containing fifty (50) acres, or thereabouts.

HUIROA.

All that block of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki, containing by estimation twenty-five thousand three hundred (25,300) acres, or thereabouts. Bounded on the North by the Waitara River from its junction with the Makauhau Stream to Puketutu; on the West by the Manganui Block; on the South by an irregular line running from Tukarokaro to the Mako Stream, thence by the Mako Stream to its junction with the Makino River, thence by the Makino River to its junction with the Ahuroa Stream, thence by an irregular line to Upokotoia; on the East by the Te Wera Block. Excepting out of the hereinbefore described area a Native reserve at Te Kawau containing one thousand (1,000) acres, a Native burial-ground at Makino containing about one (1) rood, and a burial-ground at Makauhau, sufficient to include the graves of Native chiefs.

OTOIA.

All that block of land in the Provincial District of Taranaki known by the name of Otoia, containing by estimation two thousand six hundred and sixty (2,660) acres, or thereabouts, and bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point on the Patea River near the Ngakotana Stream, thence up the Patea River to Kakapirau, thence up a spur and along a survey line to a point in the Taranaki Stream, thence by the survey lines, crossing the Teahitakawai and the Ohah Streams to the Te Ngawhakaruru Stream, thence crossing the Otakaiti Stream to the Tumutu Stream, thence to the Karewarewa Stream, thence to a stream which is followed for some distance, thence to the Pukerata Stream, which is also followed for a short distance, and then crossed, thence to a point in

the old surveys, which is followed until a point in the boundary of the Otoia Reserve is reached, thence by a survey line running in a northerly direction to its point of termination, and thence by a survey line to the point of commencement at Ngakotana on the Patea River.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony at the Government House, at Wellington, this thirty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

WHEREAS by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and any Act amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall by Proclamation declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as thereafter in the said Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown for the time being in force in the land district in which such land is situated; and thereupon such land so proclaimed shall become subject to such provisions:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto has been purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, and it is expedient that the said land should be declared to be waste lands of the Crown:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims, and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown in force in the Land Districts of Hawke's Bay and Wellington respectively.

SCHEDULE.

AHUATURANGA.

ALL that piece or parcel of land in the Woodville District, Seventy-Mile Bush, situate partly in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, and partly in the Provincial District of Wellington and being called or known by the name of the Ahuaturanga Block, containing by admeasurement forty-one thousand five hundred and seventy-one (41,571) acres, or thereabouts, namely, thirty-seven thousand nine hundred and ninety-five (37,995) acres in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay and three thousand five hundred and seventy-six (3576) acres in the Provincial District of Wellington. Bounded towards the North by the Maharahara Block; and on the North-east and East by the Oringi Waiaruhe Block; on the South-east, South, and South-west by the Manawatu River; and on the West by the Manawatu Block. Excepting out of the hereinbefore described area a Native reserve situate in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay near the point where the road from Woodville to Masterton crosses the Manawatu River, extending from the Manawatu River to the Manga Atua River, and containing one thousand five hundred and seventy-five (1,575) acres, or thereabouts.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the confiscated lands in the Land District of Taranaki, which are particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same are hereby declared to be waste lands of the Crown.

necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such Proclamation: And whereas the railway from Amberley to the Bluff is one of the railways specified in the said Fourth Schedule, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Authorizing the taking and laying down of Roads in Hawke's Bay.

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly intitled "The Crown Grants Act, 1866," it is enacted that whenever roads or rights of roads have been or hereafter may be reserved in any Crown grants, but such roads or the particular part or portions of the land comprised in the grant over which the road is to be or may be taken have not been or may not be specifically described in the body of the grant and laid down from survey on the plan in the margin thereof, or endorsed thereon or attached

thereto, such Crown grants, if otherwise duly and legally executed, shall be and be taken to have been as valid and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the said road or part of the land over which the right of road was to be taken had been specifically described and laid down as aforesaid on the said grant before the execution of the same, any law or practice to the contrary notwithstanding; and it is also thereby enacted that all such reservations made before or after the passing of the said Act shall be valid and effectual to all intents and purposes, provided always that the right of taking a road through any section shall only be exercised within five years after the issue of the grant, and, with regard to grants issued before the passing of the said Act, within three years from the coming into operation of the said Act; and it is also thereby enacted that in any case where allowances have been or shall be made in land or remission of purchase money in respect of such reservation of road, the road to be taken shall in no case exceed the amount of land allowed or the amount the purchase money whereof shall have been or shall be remitted as aforesaid; and it is also thereby enacted that whenever such road or roads shall have been taken and laid down in manner aforesaid on the land comprised in any such grant by any person legally authorized in that behalf, the land conveyed by the grant shall be deemed, from the date of the laying down of such road, to be all the land therein described to be granted, with the exception of the part thereof taken for such road, which part shall be deemed to be vested in Her Majesty, her heirs and successors:

And whereas it is expedient that a fit and proper person should be authorized to take and lay down roads over the lands specified in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby authorize

EDWARD HENRY BOLD,

District Engineer, of Napier, to take and lay down roads over the lands specified in the Schedule hereto, and for that purpose to exercise all such powers as by the said sections of the said Act may be exercised by a person legally authorized in that behalf under the said sections of the said Act.

REGULATIONS for the management of the
South Rakaia Cemetery:—

1. The Managers appointed under "The Cemetery
Reserves Management Ordinance, 1870," shall have
the entire control and management of the South
Rakaia Cemetery.

2. The Managers having power, by the 9th section
of the said Ordinance, to allocate portions of the
Cemetery to the various religious denominations
requiring the same, no interference will be per-
mitted with such allocations. A portion of the
Cemetery will be set apart as open ground for pur-
poses of general interment.

3. Persons desirous of obtaining an exclusive right
in any plot of ground in the Cemetery for the pur-
pose of making graves or family vaults, or erecting
monuments, may do so at a rate not exceeding
5s. per square yard. Such person shall receive the
following document, signed by one of the Managers
and the Secretary:—

Received from A.B., of _____, the sum of _____
for that piece of ground, part of the _____ Cemetery
at _____, numbered _____ on the plan of the
Cemetery in the custody of the Managers. The
said piece of ground to be held by the said A.B.

subject to the rules for the time being in force for
the management of the said Cemetery.

4. Applications for this purpose may be made to
the Managers, or to the Secretary, or other person
authorized by them to receive the same.

5. Every burial plot shall be 9 feet by 4 feet, and
every grave shall be 5 feet in depth at the least. In
the event of the purchaser of private ground desiring
a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. 6d. shall be
made for every foot more than 5 feet.

6. All railings or erections of any kind shall be
subject to the approval of the Managers.

7. Any purchaser of private ground may transfer
his or her interest therein to any other person, upon
payment of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

8. A plan of the Cemetery shall be kept, showing
the plots as laid off in the several divisions, and each
plot shall have a separate number on the plan.

9. A book shall be kept, in which shall be entered
the number of every plot sold, the name of the
purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale
or transfer of the same. A register shall also be
kept of all burials in the Cemetery, which register
shall be open for the inspection of the public on pay-

apply to the Sexton, or other duly authorized person,
for a warrant for such interment, which warrant shall
be granted upon payment of the following fees,
