A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue of the power vested in me by the third section of "The Regulation of Local Elections Act, 1876," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Act shall come into force in respect of all elective offices of the Havelock Board of Works within the district known as the Riding of Havelock, situate in the County of Marlborough.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

Lands taken for the purpose of a Road in the Rakaia Survey District, County of Selwyn.

A MEMORIAL laid before His Excellency the Governor, by the Minister for Public Works, pursuant to the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," containing an accurate description of the lands proposed to be taken for a certain public work—to wit, the construction of a road through Section No. 23974, in the Rakaia Survey District, County of Selwyn.

All that parcel of land containing by admeasurement two (2) roods and thirty-six (36) perches, more or less, being part of Section numbered 23974, in the Rakaia Survey District, the boundaries whereof are as follow:—Commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary of that section, the said point being distant south-easterly six hundred and eighty-six (686) links from the north-western corner thereof; thence south-easterly along the said boundary three hundred and eighty-four (384) links; thence south-westerly by a line bearing $349^{\circ} 50'$ (magnetic) five hundred and one (501) links; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of the said section one hundred (100) links; thence north-easterly by a line bearing $169^{\circ} 50'$ (magnetic) twenty-three (23) links; thence south-easterly by a line bearing $82^{\circ} 17'$ (magnetic) fifty (50) links; thence north-easterly by a line bearing $169^{\circ} 50'$ (magnetic) ninety-seven (97) links; thence north-westerly by a line bearing $82^{\circ} 17'$ (magnetic) fifty (50) links; thence north-easterly by a line bearing $169^{\circ} 50'$ (magnetic) two hundred and eighty-one (281) links; thence north-westerly by a line parallel to the first-described boundary two hundred and forty-seven (247) links, and from thence returning north-westerly by a straight line one hundred and seven (107) links to

the commencing point; the above particulars being delineated on a plan marked P.W.D. 5922, hereto attached.

I, the undersigned, John Davies Ormond, the Minister for Public Works, hereby certify that the above-written memorial is true and correct in the several particulars thereof.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that whenever lands are required to be taken for public works the Minister for Public Works in the case of Government works, and the County Council or Road Board in the case of county or district works, shall cause a survey to be made and plans to be prepared showing generally the nature of the works proposed to be executed and the lands required to be taken for the same, together with the names of the owners and occupiers of such lands as far as they can be ascertained, and shall cause a copy of such plans to be deposited in some place in the road district in which such lands are: And it is further enacted that the said Minister in the case of Government works, and the County Council or Road Board in the case of county works or district works, shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and to be twice publicly notified, stating the place where such plans are open for inspection, with a general description of the works proposed to be executed and of the land required to be taken, and in such notice shall call upon all persons affected to set forth in writing any well-founded objections to the execution of such works or to the taking of such lands, and to send such writing within forty days from the first publication of such notice to the said Minister, or to the County Council, or Road Board, as the case may be: And it is further enacted that the Minister for Public Works, the County Council, or Road Board, as the case may be, shall cause a copy of such notice and description to be served upon the said owners and occupiers so far as they can be ascertained; and that the said Minister in the case of Government works, the Council in the case of county, and the Board in the case of district works, shall, upon receiving any objection, appoint a time and place within the colony within which the objector may appear before the said Minister, or some person appointed by him in the case of Government works, before the Council in the case of county, or before the Board in the case of district works, and support the objection by such evidence as the objector thinks fit; and that if within the said forty days no such objection is made, or if after due consideration of such objections the said Minister, or the County Council, or Road Board, as the case may be, is of opinion that it is expedient that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done thereby for which due compensation is not provided by the Act now in recital, the land proposed to be taken shall be taken in the following manner—that is to say, the said Minister, or the County Council, or Road Board shall lay before the Governor a memorial containing an accurate description of the land proposed to be taken, together with a map thereof, signed by

the Surveyor-General or some certificated surveyor as evidence of the accuracy thereof; and the Governor in Council may thereupon, if he think fit, by Proclamation gazetted and publicly notified, declare that the said lands are taken for the use of a railway, road, or other public work, as the case may be; and from and after a date to be named in the said Proclamation the land therein specified shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for the public use named in the said Proclamation:

And whereas the lands described in the memorial above written are required to be taken under the authority of the said "Public Works Act, 1876," for a certain public work—to wit, the construction of a road through Section No. 23974 in the Rakaia Survey District, in the County of Selwyn:

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act prior to the taking of such lands have been duly performed and fulfilled:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustine Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the memorial above written, and shown on the plan thereto attached, are hereby taken for the purposes of a road, and that from and after the day of the date hereof the said lands shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever for use as a public road.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

DISCONTINUANCE OF MANA ISLAND LIGHT AND EXHIBITION OF FLASHING WHITE LIGHT ON THE BROTHERS, COOK STRAIT.

Customs Department (Marine Branch),
Wellington, 31st August, 1877.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on and after the evening of Monday, the 24th September, 1877, a Light will be exhibited from a Lighthouse which has been erected on the Brothers (Northern Islet), Cook Strait, the characteristics of which are as follow:—

The tower is 28 feet in height, built of wood and painted white. The light will be a SECOND ORDER FLASHING WHITE LIGHT, visible all round, SHOWING A FLASH EVERY TEN SECONDS. The light will be elevated about 258 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of 22 nautical miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

From the lower part of the tower a FIXED RED LIGHT, having an arc of 5°, will be shown in the direction of Cook's Rock,

On the same night on which the Brothers Light is exhibited, the Fixed White Light on Mana Island WILL BE DISCONTINUED.

Alterations and Additions to the Rates for the Conveyance, Delivery, and Storage of Goods, Parcels, &c., on all the New Zealand Railways, published in New Zealand Gazette, Nos. 34, 48, 58, 62, and 67, of the 18th April, 1st June, 28th June, 19th July, and 2nd August, 1877, respectively.

IN accordance with the By-laws for the New Zealand Railways, fixed by Order in Council dated the 17th day of April, 1877, the following alterations and additions to the rates for the conveyance, delivery, storage of goods, parcels, &c., on all the New Zealand Railways, published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, Nos. 34, 48, 58, 62, and 67, of the 18th April, 1st June, 28th June, 19th July, and 2nd August, 1877, respectively, are hereby declared to be fixed, and shall come into force on and after the 10th September, 1877:—

Pearl barley, in bags, to be carried as Class B.

Tallow and fat, and tallow, in bags, casks, or other packages, to be eliminated from Classes B and C respectively, and to be carried as Class D.

Butter, in baskets, to be carried as Class C.

Beans and peas (colonial produce), whole or crushed, to be carried as Class E.

Beans and peas, in casks or bags (imported), to be carried as Class B.

The minimum charge for coal for distances of 3 miles and under to be 7s. 6d. per truck. The minimum charge for distances of over 3 miles, and under 15 miles, to be 12s. 6d. per truck.

Class G, in small lots, less than one truck-load, may be carried as Class D, provided charge does not exceed 1s. per mile.

Pigs, sheep, goats, and calves, in single-floor trucks, to be carried at 10s. per truck per mile for all distances not exceeding 10 miles; and for each additional mile, 5d. per truck per mile up to 50 miles; and for each additional mile, 4d. per truck per mile up to 100 miles; and for each additional mile, 3d. per truck per mile. Two-floor trucks will be charged at 1½ above rates.

Sucking pigs, in hampers or baskets, may be sent as parcels, according to weight.

Craneage to be charged at 6d. per ton; additional charge, where crane has to be fetched, 1s. per mile (one way only); minimum charge for fetching crane, 15s.

Beer and cider, in bulk, to be eliminated from Class B, and carried as Class C.

Green horse-feed to be carried as Class E.

Shipping goods between Dunedin and Port Chalmers of Classes A, B, C, D, to be carried as Class D.

Classes A, B, C, D, minimum charge for any quantity to be 1s.

Classes F and G, for each loading or unloading done by the Railway Department, 5s. per truck will be charged.

Meats preserved to be carried as Class D.

Empty check wagons 6d. per truck per mile up to 50 miles, and 3d. per truck per mile for each additional mile.

Agricultural implements, not otherwise specified, above 2 tons in weight, owner's risk, to be carried as Class A; less than 2 tons, to be as Class C.
