NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the New Zealand Gazette, to fix, alter, and abolish the rates of postage at any time payable within the colony for the transmission of letters and newspapers by post, either between places within New Zealand or to or from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid, and that the postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly: And whereas by Proclamation duly made and issued, bearing date the nineteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-first day of June, in the same year, the Governor in Council did, in pursuance of the said recited power and authority, fix certain rates of postage to be paid within the colony for the transmission of all letters and newspapers and packets by post to or from the countries and places mentioned in the Schedule thereto, and the times at which the same respectively should be paid as therein mentioned: And whereas it is desirable that the said rates should be altered, and that other rates of postage should be fixed, as hereinafter mentioned :

and that other rates of postage should be fixed, as hereinafter mentioned : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise of the said recited power and authority, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby abolish all former rates of postage fixed to be paid within the colony, and doth proclaim and declare that the postage payable within the colony for the transmission of all letters, newspapers, and packets by post to or from the countries and places mentioned in the several Schedules hereto, shall be according to the rates mentioned in such Schedules, and that such postage shall in all cases be paid at the time such letters, newspapers, and packets are delivered into the post; and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth further proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect from and after the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

#### V.---REGISTRATION FEE.

For every letter, book packet, pattern parcel, or newspaper registered at any Post Office within the colony, for delivery at or from any Post Office within the colony, a fee of sixpence will be charged in addition to the postage.

#### SCHEDULE B.

#### VI.-Soldiers' And Sailors' Letters.

Letters addressed to or forwarded by any non-commissioned officer, army schoolmaster (not of the first class), army schoolmistress, soldier, or seaman, while actually employed in Her Majesty's Service may be transmitted within the colony, and between the colony and the Australian Colonies, India, British Ports in the Mediterranean, and the United Kingdom, at a charge of one penny each; and to any Post Office within the British Dominions, via the United Kingdom, by British Mail Packet, at twopence each, provided that the following regulations are observed :-

 Each letter must not exceed half an ounce in weight.
 If sent by any such privileged person, it must be superscribed with the name of the writer, his description or class in the regiment or vessel, and signed by the officer at time in command.

(3.) If addressed to any such privileged person, his description or class in the regiment or vessel must be specified thereon.

(4.) If posted within the colony the postage must be prepaid.

Letters of this description posted or received in the colony, not in accordance with the foregoing regulations, will be treated as ordinary letters. Soldiers' and sailors' letters addressed to foreign places are in addition chargeable with the foreign transit rates due to the countries through which such letters may pass.

And whereas at a sitting of the Native Land Court of New Zealand, at Foxton, in the Manawatu District, Province of Wellington, on the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, the claims of Hoani Meihana and others, and of Tapa te Whata and others, aboriginal natives of New Zealand, to certain pieces of land called respectively Middle Aorangi, Lower Aorangi No. 1, Lower Aorangi No. 2, Upper Aorangi, Upper Aorangi No. 1, Upper Aorangi No. 2, situate near Oroua, in the said district, were heard and decided under the provisions of the said "Native Lands Act, 1865," and the Acts amending the same, and certain orders were thereupon made by the said Court:

And whereas on or about the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventythree, an application was made by and on behalf of certain aboriginal natives claiming to have an interest in the said land for a rehearing of the claims to the pieces of land known as Middle Aorangi, Lower Aorangi No. 1, Upper Aorangi, and Upper Aorangi No. 1, and it is expedient that the said claims should be reheard before the said Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of the above-recited power, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby order and direct that the said claims of Hoani Meihana and others, and Tapa te Whata and others, to the pieces of land known as Middle Aorangi, Lower Aorangi No. 1, Upper Aorangi, and Upper Aorangi No. 1, shall be reheard as and in the manner provided by "The Native Land Act, 1873"; and doth also order that such rehearing shall take place within five years from the said twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

eight hundred and seventy-eight. 3. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the said river will be issued under the hand of the Chief Inspector of Police at Nelson, and for every license a fee of ten shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any police officer or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding twelve inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the said river, and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the Provin-cial District of Nelson, and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty

not exceeding fifty pounds. 8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed into any river or stream in the said Provincial District of Nelson, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

## Regulations for Trout Fishing in Otago.

#### NORMANBY, Governor.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations for the Provincial District of Otago:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

2. Any holder of a license, as hereinafter mentioned, may fish with rod and line for brown trout in the following rivers, creeks, and streams :---Kakanui River, Island Stream, Shag River, Waikouaiti River, Waitati River, Silver Stream, Fulton's Creek, Boat Harbour Creek, Lee Stream, Deep Stream, Taieri River, Puerua River, Kaihiku River, Waiwera River, and Kuriwao River, from the first day of October next until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight; and in the Water of Leith from the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventyseven, until the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

3. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the said waters will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of any Acclimatization Society in the said provincial district, and for every license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only with rod and line.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any police officer or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding seven inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the said river, and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the Provincial District of Otago, and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed into any river or stream in the said Provincial District of Otago, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

#### (L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Oyster Fisheries Act Amendment Act, 1874," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, declare that, within such district of the colony as shall therein be described, and during such consecutive months as shall therein be named, not exceeding four, it shall not be lawful to take or catch for sale any rock oysters, whether between high and low watermarks or not; and if any person shall within such district, and during such months as shall be named in any such Proclamation, take or catch for sale, or sell or expose for sale, or buy, any such rock oysters, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for any one offence, to be recovered in a summary way before any one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace; and further, that the Governor may from time to time revoke or alter any such Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamation made under the said Act bearing date the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twentyfourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, it was proclaimed and declared that during the consecutive months commencing on the first day of January in each year, and ending on the thirty-first day of March in each year, it shall not be lawful to take or catch for sale any rock oysters as in the said Proclamation mentioned:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation, and to make another Proclamation in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me under the said Act, do hereby revoke the said in part recited Proclamation, and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that during the four consecutive months commencing on the first day of December in each year, and ending on the thirty-first day of March in each year, it shall not be lawful to take or catch for sale any rock oysters, whether between high and low watermarks or not, within the district comprised within the Province of Auckland, the boundaries of which are set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

BOUNDED on the North by the coast line, including the islands adjacent thereto; on the East by the coast line, including the islands adjacent thereto; on the West by the coast line, including the islands adjacent thereto; on the South by the River Mokau to its source; thence by a right line running from the source of the Mokau to the point where the Ngahuinga or Tuhua, the principal tributary of the Wanganui River, is intersected by the thirty-ninth parallel of south latitude; thence eastward by the thirty-ninth parallel of south latitude to the point where that parallel of latitude cuts the east coast of the Northern d the Northern Island of New Zealand.

Mongonui.—Very wet and stormy month; rain greatly in excess of average, 393 in. recorded on the 5th, and 433 in. on the 6th, the maximum for the month; gales or strong winds on every day but nine, chiefly from W. and N.E.; 475 miles of wind registered on 4th, from E.; thunder on 5th, 14th, and 25th; hail on 5th.
Auckland.—Wet and squally, with generally low barometer; rain greatly in excess, the maximum fall recorded on 18th, 1-22 in., and on 22nd, 1365 in.; very strong winds and variable; frequent morning fogs; thunder on 9th and 25th, but not severe.
Taranaki.—A very stormy, wet month; maximum rainfall recorded on 24th, 131 in.; strong N.W. and S.W. winds from Sth to 11th with rain, thunder on 8th and 9th, and on 24th and 25th stormy from N.W. allow with rain ; thunder on 23rd and 24th.
Napier.—Changeable weather; frequent rain, but moderate, the maximum fall recorded on 6th and 28th, 31 in.; S.E. gale on 1st, and on 10th strong S.W. gale; winds strong, and prevailed from S. and S.W.
Wellington.—Very wet, unpleasant weather experienced almost throughout the month, although there were a few fine bright days; rainfall greatly in excess of average; the maximum recorded on 30th, 250 inches; prevailing N.W. wind and stormy generally, especially on 8th, 9th, 13th, 14th, and 25th. On 29th rain commenced in morning from N.W., changed to S.E., but light, barometer raing slightly; showery during day, barometer falling again, very threatening, and at 3.30 p.m. heavy rain commenced, and continued until 5 p.m., 2 in. falling during the hour and a half; showery at night, but cleared off.
Wanganui.—Tine up to 7th, then rain to 15th from N.W.; followed by a few fine days; on 22nd, 160 in. rain recorded, and continued wet to end of month; wind westerly, from which quarter it prevailed, and frequently strong; thunder on 10th.
Nelson.—Very wet weather, frequent rain, but no heavy falls, the maximum recorded on 8th, 61 in.; prevailing S.

Queenstown.-Fine for time of year; maximum rainfall recorded on 14th, 34 in.; prevailing N.W. winds, and light; snow fell on five

days; fog on 4th. Southland.—Fine weather generally; greatest rain recorded on 9th, 65 in.; stormy from 8th to 12th, from W., with rain; otherwise, wind moderate and changeable; hail on 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th; some severe frosts during nights.

#### GENERAL REMARKS.

With few exceptions the weather has been very wet and boisterous throughout the month, accompanied by thunder and hail storms, and excessive falls of rain; the wind was principally westerly; the barometer and thermometer readings were below the average. Earth-quakes were reported by observers at Taranaki on 8th at 7.20 a.m.; and at Queenstown on 2nd, slight. A tidal disturbance was observed at many of the stations on the East Coast on the 11th. A brilliant meteor was observed in the extreme North on the 11th, and one at Lyttelton on the 15th.
