Setting apart Lands in Otago for Agricultural Leases.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the thirty-third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Government of the Go nor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are Crown lands subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said thirty-third section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby select and set apart, for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and do fix the first day of November next ensuing as the day on which the said land shall be open for application.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement two thousand four hundred and seventy (2,470) acres two (2) roods and nineteen (19) poles, more or less, situate in the Lower Wanaka District, being Sections numbered respectively from 1 to 36 and 38 to 56 inclusive, Block I., on the map of the said district, a portion of Run numbered 240A. Conditions for Trout Fishing in Canterbury.

NORMANBY, Governor.

N pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations for the Provincial District of Canterbury:

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

2. Any holder of a license, as hereinafter mentioned, may fish with rod and line for trout in the rivers of Canterbury from the sixteenth day October next until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy eight.

3. Licenses to fish with rod and line in the said rivers will be issued under the hand of the Secretary of the Acclimatization Society at Christchurch, and for every license a fee of twenty shillings will be charged.

4. No license shall authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish, and that only

with rod and line.

5. Any person fishing without a license, or any person who shall on demand of any person holding and showing a license, or on the demand of any police officer or constable, fail to produce and show to such person, police officer, or constable his license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. All trout not exceeding eight inches in length taken by any person fishing as aforesaid shall be immediately returned alive to the river, and any person convicted of infringing this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds sterling, and his license shall thereupon become void.

7. Except as aforesaid, no person shall fish or use any net or other engine, instrument, or device for taking fish in any river or stream within the Provincial District of Canterbury, and all persons offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty

not exceeding fifty pounds.

8. Any person who puts, throws, or places, or allows to be put, thrown, or placed into any river or stream in the said Provincial district of Canterbury, any dynamite or other explosive substance, or any matter or liquid deleterious to fish, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

Delegation of Powers to Nelson City Council.

Comparison with the previous Month.—The death rates for 5 boroughs were slightly higher for September than for August, but at Auckland and Hokitika they were lower.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from this class of disease exceeded those for the previous month by 5, and were 20 61 per cent. of the whole number. More than half the deaths were from scarlating, which complaint was fatal at the same towns as in August. At Dunedin it caused 3 deaths, and at Hokitika the 8 deaths which represent the mortality for the month were all the result of scarlatina. During the 8 months, February to September inclusive, there have been 40 deaths from this disease registered as at Hokitika, out of a total mortality of 78 from all causes. Diseases of the Respiratory Organs.—There were 19 deaths from Bronchitis, Pneumonia, Pleurisy, and Congestion of the Lungs. In August, 13 deaths took place from similar causes. Out of the 19 cases for last month, 7 deaths occurred at Dunedin.

Violent Deaths.—Three were accidental. One adult male was run over by a cab, another was drowned by falling from a wharf, and an infant was killed by suffocation. A woman committed suicide by wounding herself in the abdomen while in a state of unsound mind. The total of violent deaths is thus 4.

of unsound mind. The total of violent deaths is thus 4.

Comparison with September, 1876.—The total number of deaths for September, 1876, was 93, or 4 less than the total for last month. At Christchurch and Dunedin, the number of deaths for September of both years was the same. At Auckland, there were only 9 deaths last month, against 18 in September, 1876; and at Wellington, on the other hand, 23 deaths were recorded, against 17 in September of the previous year. Zymotic Diseases, which caused 20 deaths in the boroughs in September, 1877, caused 16 in September, 1876. For both periods Scarlatina was the only epidemic disease. Against 18 deaths registered from diseases of the Respiratory Organs in September, 1877, there were 20 in September, 1876. The Violent Deaths decreased from 7 in September, 1876, to 4 in September, 1877.
