Provisional Reserve for Educational Purposes in the Provincial District of Canterbury.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make out of any waste lands of the Crown provisional reserves for educational purposes of a public character, in manner as in the said section is set forth:

Moeraki Harbour Board By-laws approved.

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of October, 1877.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. HEREAS the Moeraki Harbour Board, to which Board the powers conferred by the seventh, tenth, thirtieth, thirty-first, and thirty-second sections of "The Marine Act, 1867," have been delegated as is authorized by "The Harbour Boards Act, 1870," did, on the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy seven, make the rules, regulations, and by-laws set forth in the Schedule

hereto, and it is expedient to approve of the same : Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of New Zea-land, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in accordance with the provisions of "The Harbour Boards Act, 1870," approve of the said regulations and by-laws.

SCHEDULE.

4. The Board's Wharf Manager shall be Port or Harbourmaster, and shall conduct or order the anchoring or removal of all vessels in port, and shall also conduct and regulate the management of the wharves and traffic thereon and thereat.

5. Any person or persons using the Board's wharves in any way, or interfering with the management thereof, without having first obtained an authority for same from the Board's Manager, or who shall disobey the lawful commands of the Harbourmaster, or who shall commit a breach of or fail to comply with the Board's regulations or by-laws for same, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £50 in the discretion of the Justices or Resident Magistrate adjudicating.

6. All boats making use of the harbour in any way shall be subject to an annual license fee of $\pounds 2$ 2s. each, payable to the Board.

7. For landing or shipping goods or material on or from the wharves in the Port of Moeraki, the Board will levy the following charges :---

On sawn, split, or dressed timber not exceeding 3 superficial to 1 lineal foot, 9d. per hundred superficial feet.

Round or squared logs, 5s. per 320 superficial feet.

General merchandise or other goods, 3s. 4d. per ton or 40 cubic feet.

Coals, 2s. per ton of 12 sacks.

Wheat and flour, 2s. per ton of 10 sacks.

Oats, potatoes, and barley, 1s. 8d. per ton of 12 sacks.

Pollard and bran, 1s. 8d. per ton of 14 sacks.

Wool pressed, 1s. per bale. Wool unpressed, 1s. 4d. per bale.

Hides, 2d. each. Skins, 1d. each, or as general merchandise.

Great cattle, 5s. each. Small cattle, 4d. each.

Empties, one-half rates.

Parcels, 6d. each.

The Board will detain all goods, &c., until the charges thereon are paid. Upon all goods detained by the Board, or not taken delivery of or shipped on day of receiving, and necessarily removed to store or otherwise, an additional charge will be made equal to one-half of the foregoing charges.

All steamers will receive preference over sailing vessels at the wharves.

WHEREAS by "The Customs Regulations Act, 1858" it is exacted that it a regulation of the second strategy of the se 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, from time to time to appoint and remove a superior officer of Customs, who shall have the control and direction of all other officers and persons employed in or about the collection and management of the revenue of Customs, and who shall be styled "The Commissioner of Customs," and also in like manner from time to time to appoint and remove, or to depute to the Commissioner the power to appoint and remove, officers and persons subordinate to the Commissioner to collect and manage the Customs revenue, and to perform the several duties incident to and connected with the collection and management thereof:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony as aforesaid, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby delegate to

The Honorable Sir GEORGE GREY, K.C.B.,

NORTHUMBERLAND ISLANDS.

THE following information has been received from Lieutenant Connor, R.N., the Assistant Admiralty Surveyor :-

Edwards' Shoal is a narrow sand-bank, steep to, upon which the sea breaks occasionally. It lies in

the following position, viz.,— North end 2.6 miles N.E. by N.) from the summit South end $1\frac{1}{5}$ miles N.E. by $E_{4}^{3}E$.) of Ridge Island. At about the middle of the shoal there is at low-

water springs a depth of about 7 feet, with 9 feet on either side for a distance of $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile.

Yaralla Shoal is a long narrow shoal of fine sand, steep to.

North end 6.5 miles N. 1 W.) from summit of South end 4.1 miles N. 3 W.) Ridge Island.

It has 11 feet on it shoalest part, which lies 4 cables from its northern extremity.

The summit of Constance Islet (100 feet high) kept just open of Granite Island—which is shown on the chart as being 465 feet high—bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., leads in mid-channel between the Yaralla and Pearl Shoals.

Another shoal, on the south end of which there is a depth of 15 feet, lies N. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., $9\frac{1}{4}$ miles from the summit of Ridge Island. The position of its northern extremity and the least water upon it have not yet been determined.

Pearl Shoal, which is of sand, narrow and steep to, extends 2.5 miles S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. from Wallace Islet. Its shoalest part, upon which there is only 3 feet of water, is at a distance of 1.3 miles from the shore.

Rocket Spit, of sand and steep to, with a depth of from 12 to 15 feet over it, extends to the southwestward from h. 1. Islet, from the summit of which its extremity lies S.W. by W., $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles. With the flood tide there is a heavy rip over the spit.

Unless thoroughly acquainted with the navigation, vessels of heavy draught are recommended not, to pass to the westward of the Beverley Group,

Entrance to Kaipara Harbour.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Customs Department (Marine Branch), Wellington, 31st October, 1877. THE following report, by Captain Johnson, of this

department, containing amended sailing direc-tions for entering Kaipara Harbour, is published for general information.

SIR,-From the recent survey I made of the approaches to Kaipara Harbour, I have the honor to report that I found that the Galatea Channel was the only one to be recommended as being the most safe and easiest to navigate. The bar on this channel has shifted $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles further seaward than is shown in the Admiralty chart, and is 8 miles distant from the green hillocks on North Sand Heads, and $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles in width at its entrance, with 15 fathoms close up to it, and $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on it at low-water springs, carrying from 6 to 7 fathoms in for $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles, when it gradually deepens, the greatest depth of 23 fathoms being found between Tory Shoal and North Head. Considerable alteration in the line of banks has also taken place since last surveyed. Tory Shoal has greatly increased towards North Head, narrowing this part of Galatea Channel to only $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, with deep water steep to on both sides.

The tides between Tory Shoal and North Head are very strong, both ebb and flood set partly on to the North Head; great care should therefore be exer-

cised in beating or during light winds. The tides have worked an indentation or bight in the North Head seaward of the hillocks, and have extended the North Spit or flats 3 of a mile further seaward than is shown in chart.

crossing the bar:-Bring Pukitu, a remarkable triangular green patch on the south side, to bear E. by N. with the westernmost of the three green hillocks on the North Head N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., the vessel will then be two miles seaward of the outer edge of the bar, and right in the fairway with Wakahoranga, a conspicuous conical hill inland $2\frac{1}{2}$ degrees open of the North Head; from this position steer in a N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. course for the middle green patch until Pukitu bears E.S.E., Wakahoranga will then be just over the North Head, and the beacon, house, and flagstaff, which are erected at the back of the centre green patch, will be seen in one; the vessel will then be guided in by the semaphore arm by steering in the direction the arm points, and steadying the course when the arm drops. Should the signals not be seen, the vessel should be kept a $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from shore, and when abreast of signal station a safe course for either the Kaipara or Wairoa branch may be shaped.

The pilot station is on Pouto Point, which has now a telegraph communication with the signal station.

THE attention of Shipowners, Shipmasters, and Others interested in shipping is directed to the following section of "The Imperial Merchant Ship-ping Act, 1876," which is operative throughout the British Dominions; and it is hereby notified that Officers of Customs throughout the colony have been instructed to enforce the provisions thereof in respect of all foreign-going ships.

"THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1876." SECTION 23.

Deck Cargoes

23. If any ship, British or foreign, other than home-trade ships as defined by "The Merchant Ship-' carries as deck cargo, that is to say ping Act, 1854,' in any uncovered space upon deck, or in any covered space not included in the cubical contents forming the ship's registered tonnage, timber, stores, or other goods, all dues payable on the ship's tonnage shall be payable as if there were added to the ship's registered tonnage the tonnage of the space occupied by such goods at the time at which such dues become

payable. The space so occupied shall be deemed to be the space limited by the area occupied by the goods and by straight lines enclosing a rectangular space sufficient to include the goods.

The tonnage of such space shall be ascertained by an officer of the Board of Trade or of Customs, in manner directed by subsection four of section twenty-one of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and when so ascertained shall be entered by him in the ship's official log book and also in a memorandum which he shall deliver to the master, and the master shall, when the said dues are demanded, produce such memorandum in like manner as if it were the certificate of registry, or, in the case of a foreign ship, the document equivalent to a certificate of registry, and in default shall be liable to the same penalty as if he had failed to produce the said certificate or document.
