*Town of Balclutha proclaimed a Borough under
"The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any of the several places specified in the Third Schedule to the said Act in which a Municipal Corporation has been established under the provisions of an Ordinance of the Province of Otago intituled "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," from a day to be named in such Proclamation; subject, however, to certain conditions in the said section mentioned: And whereas the Town of Balclutha, in the Provincial District of Otago, is one of the places specified in the said Third Schedule, and a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by fifty-four of the ratepayers of such town praying him to constitute such town into a borough under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and such petition was, on the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, publicly notified, and no petition from an equal or greater number of such ratepayers was presented to His Excellency within two months after such public notification praying him not to assent to the prayer of such first-mentioned petition:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that from the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the said Town of Balclutha shall be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and shall be called the Borough of Balclutha; and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement five hundred and sixty-eight (568) acres one (1) rood and twenty-nine (29) poles, more or less, being the Municipality of Balclutha, formerly known as Sections numbered re-

spectively one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7), and eight (8), Block thirty-five (XXXV.), Clutha District, and part of Section numbered forty-four (44), Block one (I.), Hillend District and Crown lands. Bounded towards the North by the Clutha River, three thousand five hundred (3500) links; towards the West by Block numbered two (II.), Hillend District, one thousand three hundred (1300) links; towards the North by other part of the said Section numbered forty-four (44), two thousand four hundred (2400) links; towards the North-east by other part of the said Section numbered forty-four (44), four thousand (4000) links and four thousand two hundred (4200) links; also by the Clutha River, one thousand two hundred (1200) links; towards the South-east by Section numbered (forty-three) 43, Block one (I.), Hillend District, and a road line, one thousand two hundred (1200) links; towards the South and South-east by the Clutha River, ten thousand two hundred (10200) links; towards the South-west by a road line, two thousand five hundred and twenty (2520) links; and towards the North-west by Section numbered nine (9), Block thirty-five (XXXV.), Clutha District, and a road line, five thousand six hundred and ten (5610) links; be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Ordinance of the Province of Canterbury intituled "The Canterbury Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, 1872," and by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that on and from the nineteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, that portion of the Provincial District of Canterbury described in the Schedule hereto shall be included within the agricultural district referred to in Schedule B of the said "Canterbury Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, 1872."

SCHEDULE.

THE Geraldine Road District comprises that portion of the Provincial District of Canterbury bounded on the North by the Ashburton and Upper Ashburton Road Districts; on the West by the Mount Peel Road District; on the South by the Ophi River; and on the East by the main South Road to Section 5961; thence following the northern boundary line of Sections 5961 and 11526 and a line in continuation of the same to the eastern boundary of Section 9031, thence following the eastern and north-western boundaries of the latter section to the Geraldine Road, thence following that road south-easterly to the road running through Section 7319, thence following the latter road by Trig. Pole 5, and through Section 3275 to the north-eastern corner of Section 7462, thence following the eastern boundary of Section 7462 to the south-east corner thereof, thence following a straight line to the south-west corner of Section 13741, and from thence following the road forming the western boundary of that section to the River Ophi before mentioned.

Defining Districts under "The Licensing Act, 1873."

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1873," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the said Act, by Proclamation in the

Government Gazette, define such territorial divisions as he may think proper to be Licensing Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the District of Clyde was constituted under the said "Licensing Act, 1873." And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said district, and define other districts in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Act, and of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby abolish the said District of Clyde, and do proclaim, constitute, and appoint that the territorial divisions, the boundaries whereof are defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto, shall be Licensing Districts for the purposes of the said Act; and that such districts shall be known by the names by which they are designated in the said Schedule.

And I do further proclaim and declare that three members of the Licensing Court constituted for each such district, inclusive of the Chairman, shall form a quorum thereof.

SCHEDULE.

CLYDE DISTRICT.

THIS district is bounded towards the North by a right line due west from the summit of Ben Nevis to the Hector Mountains to the summit of the Carrick Mountains; thence by a right line to the summit of Cairnmuir Hill; thence towards the North-west by a right line to the junction of the Leaning Rock Creek with the Clutha River; thence by the said creek and a right line to the summit of Leaning Rock Hill; thence by right lines from peak to peak along the summit of the Dunstan Mountains, and by a right line to the source of Lauder Creek; thence towards the North-east by the Lauder Creek, the Manuherikia River, and the Pool Burn to its junction with the Ida Burn, and by the south-western boundary of Run No. 225 to the Roughridge Hills; thence towards the East by the summit of the Roughridge Hills to North Roughridge Hill, and by a right line thence to the summit of South Roughridge Hill; thence towards the South-west by a right line to the point where the road from Clyde to Dunedin crosses the Raggedy Ranges; thence towards the South by the said road to the Manuherikia River, and by a right line to the most southern corner of the Township of Clyde, as defined in the First Schedule to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867;" thence towards the South-east by a right line to the head of McLellan's Gully; thence again towards the East by a right line to the summit of the Obelisk; thence again towards the South by a right line to the summit of Lorn Creek; and towards the West by right lines from peak to peak along the summit of the Hector Mountains to Ben Nevis, the commencing point.

ALEXANDRA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the Clyde District; on the North by the Clyde District and the road leading to Dunedin across the Rock and Pillar to a point where it crosses the Raggedy Range; on the North-east by an imaginary line from said point to South Roughridge Hill; on the South by an imaginary line from South Roughridge Hill due west to Cairn Hill, and thence to Obelisk.

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the Districts of East Cape and Poverty Bay were, amongst others, constituted under the said "Licensing Act, 1873:" And whereas it is expedient to alter and redefine the boundaries thereof:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Act, and of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby, from and after the first day of December next, alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Districts of East Cape and Poverty Bay, as the same are defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

EAST CAPE DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and East by the sea from Matakawa Point to Motu Heka Point, Tolago Bay; towards the South by a right line from Motu Heka Point, running due west, to the summit of the watershed near the source of the Rangiriri River; and towards the North-west by the Opotiki and Cape Runaway Licensing Districts, including the adjacent Islands.

POVERTY BAY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the East Cape Licensing District to Motu Heka Point, Tolago Bay; towards the East by the sea to Paretu; towards the South by a right line from Paretu to the confluence of the Waiau and Waikare Taheke Rivers; towards the West and North-west by the Opotiki Licensing District, including the adjacent Islands.

WHEREAS by the fifty-eighth section of "The Native Land Act, 1873" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that, upon the application of any persons interested in any Native land who may feel themselves aggrieved by the decision of the Native Land Court in respect thereof, the Governor in Council may order a rehearing of any matter heard and decided under the provisions of the said Act, within such a period of time from the publication of the decision and memorial of ownership, in manner in the said Act required, as may be limited in such order; and upon such order being made, all proceedings theretofore taken by the Court in such matter shall be annulled, and the case shall commence *de novo*, and shall proceed in manner provided by the said Act: Provided that no application for a rehearing shall be entertained if it be made after six months shall have elapsed from the time of such publication:

And whereas at a sitting of the Native Land Court of New Zealand, at Whareponga, in the Hawke's Bay District, in the Provincial District of Auckland, on the fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, the claim of Tamihana Kakano and others, aboriginal natives of New Zealand, to a piece of land called Whareponga, situate at Whareponga, in the said district, was heard and decided, and a certain order was thereupon made by the said Court:

And whereas on or about the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, an application was made by and on behalf of certain aboriginal natives claiming to have an interest in the said land, for a rehearing of the said claim, and it is expedient that the said claim should be reheard before the said Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of the above-recited power, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby order and direct that the said claim of Tamihana Kakano and others to the piece of land aforesaid shall be reheard as and in the manner provided by "The Native Land Act, 1873," and doth also order that such rehearing shall take place within one year from the said fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

Additional Regulation for Trout Fishing in Otago.

CAPE OF GOOD HOPE, SOUTH COAST.

It is hereby notified that a Light Tower is being built, about 200 to 300 yards within the pitch of a low point (Seal Point), situated $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles westward of Cape St. Francis, to be hereafter called "Cape St. Francis Lighthouse."

The tower is a cylindrical stone structure, 91 feet high, with keeper's quarters attached at base, and is situated in latitude $34^{\circ} 22' 30''$ South, and longitude $24^{\circ} 50' 20''$ East of Greenwich.

It is intended to display a second order Holographical Revolving White Light, flashing at intervals of twenty seconds, with focal plane $101\frac{1}{2}$ feet above the base of the tower, and 118 feet above the level of high water.

The light will be visible in clear weather about $16\frac{1}{2}$ sea miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above the sea. It will command the coast uninterruptedly to the westward, but will be cut off to the eastward by Cape St. Francis on the line N. 53° E. true, or would not be visible from the eastward on a bearing more southerly than S. 53° W. true.

The nearest existing lights are Cape Recife, about 45 miles to the eastward, and Mossel Bay (Cape St. Blaize), about 133 miles to the westward.

The tower will probably be ready for the reception of the lenticular about January, 1878, and the light may probably be exhibited some time between 1st March and 30th April, 1878, of which due and precise notice will be given.

INVESTIGATOR STRAIT, PORT MOOROWIE.

NOTICE is hereby given that three Buoys have been placed just east of Point Gilbert, to mark the entrance to this anchorage.

The middle chequered buoy, with staff and ball, painted black and red, and cheese-shaped, is placed on a rock patch, having little more than 4 feet 6 inches of water over it at low-water springs. This patch covers an area of about 350 feet, and lies nearly in mid-channel. Vessels working into or out of the anchorage should not approach the chequered buoy nearer than half a cable's length.

A cheese-shaped red buoy, with staff and ball, is placed on the end of a reef in about 7 feet of water at low water, bearing E. by S. half S. from the above-mentioned chequered buoy, there being a channel between the red buoy and the chequered buoy of 9 feet at low water.

A cheese-shaped black buoy, with staff and ball, has been placed in 8 feet at low water on the shoal forming the western side of the anchorage. This buoy lies nearly due west from the chequered buoy, or in line with the extreme outer end of Point Gilbert, leaving a channel between having 9 to 10 feet through at low water.

Using either of the above channels, and steering for the large store above the landing-place, will lead into a pool (having a depth of not less than 3 to $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms at low water) capable of holding ten or twelve small vessels. Running in from seaward the soundings gradually decrease until not more than 9 feet exists in a line with the buoys, after passing which it will soon deepen. A convenient position for anchoring should then be taken up.
