WHEREAS by the one hundred and twenty-second section of "The Public Works Act, **VV** second section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that every railway shall be made only under the authority of a special Act, which shall state as nearly as may be the line of the railway and the two termini thereof; and by the one hundred and twenty-third section of the same Act, that the several railways specified in the Fourth Schedule to the several terminal terms have been made and the said Act shall be deemed to have been made, and in so far as any of them are unfinished may be completed, under the provisions of the Act now under recital, and the said Act shall be deemed to be a special Act authorizing the construction of each of the said railways; and by the one hundred and twenty-fourth section of the same Act, that when any railway is to be constructed under the provisions of any special Act the Governor shall issue a Proclamation defining the middle line of the railway or any part thereof, and may from time to time, by a Pro-clamation revoking or amending such former Proclamation, alter such line in any manner or to any extent which may be found necessary for the con-struction of such railway within the provisions of the said special Act; and by the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of the same Act, that the Minister shall cause to be made and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court such maps and plans as may be necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such Proclamation; and whereas the railway from Napier to the junction with the railway from New Plymouth to Waitara at Sentry Hill, passing by Paki-paki, Waipawa, Waipukurau, Takapau, &c., is one of the railways specified in the said Fourth Schedule, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of such railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the two termini of the said line shall be a point about sixty-three miles sixty chains on the railway, as proclaimed on the eleventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and a point marked seventy miles near Reserves numbered one hundred and seven and twenty-seven in the Rakaiatai and Manawatu number seven Blocks, within the County of Waipawa, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, Colony of New Zealand. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6023, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable William James Mudie Larnach, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Napier, in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that whenever lands are required to be taken for public works the Minister for Public Works shall cause a survey to be made and plans to be prepared showing generally the nature of the works proposed to be executed and the lands required to be taken for the same, together with the names of the owners and occupiers of such lands so far as they can be ascertained, and shall cause a copy of such plans to be deposited in some place in the road district in which such lands are: And it is further enacted that the said Minister shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and to be twice publicly notified, stating the place where such plans are open for inspection, with a general description of the works proposed to be executed and of the land required to be taken; and if after due consideration the said Minister is of opinion that it is expedient that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done thereby for which due compensation is not provided by the Act now in recital, the land proposed to be taken shall be taken in the following manner, that is to say: The said Minister shall lay before the Governor a memorial containing an accurate description of the land proposed to be taken, together with a map thereof, signed by the Surveyor-General or some certificated surveyor as evidence of the accuracy thereof; and the Governor in Council may thereupon, if he think fit, by Proclamation gazetted and publicly notified, declare that the said lands are taken for the use of a railway, road, or other public work, as the case may be; and from and |

the land therein specified shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for the public use named in the said Proclamation:

And whereas the lands described in the memorial above written are required to be taken under the authority of the said "Public Works Act, 1876," for a certain public work-to wit, the construction of a portion of the railway from Amberley through Oamaru to the Bluff:

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act prior to the taking of such

lands have been duly performed and fulfilled: Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby pro-claim and declare that the lands described in the memorial above written, and shown on the plan thereto attached, are hereby taken for the purposes of a railway; and that from and after the day of the date hereof the said lands shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a railway.

Proclaiming Hundreds under "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872."

NORMANBY, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS by "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he think fit, on the recommendation of the Superintendent and Provincial Council, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute into a hundred any portion of the waste lands not forming any part of any hundred pre-viously proclaimed, notwithstanding that such lands or any part thereof shall be comprised within any pastoral lease or license theretofore or thereafter to be granted by the Crown under any law regulating the occupation or disposal of waste lands, and whether or not the same shall have been included within the boundaries of any proclaimed gold field:

And whereas by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to exercise the power aforesaid on the recommendation of the Waste Lands Board of Otago, in lieu and instead of on the recommendation of the Superintendent and Provincial Council thereof:

And whereas by the first-named Act it is also further provided that no hundred shall be constituted which shall consist wholly of land unsuitable for agriculture and adapted for pastoral purposes only; and before any hundred shall be constituted, it shall be the duty of the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Chief Surveyor to certify to the Governor that, in their opinion, not less than one-third part of the area of such hundred is land available for agriculture:

And whereas the Waste Lands Board of Otago have recommended that each of the three portions of waste lands particularly described in the three Schedules hereto respectively should be proclaimed to be a hundred under the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas the said three portions respectively do not form part of any hundred previously proclaimed, and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Chief Surveyor of the Provincial District of Otago have, in accordance with the hereinbefore recited provisions of the first-named Act, certified to the Governor, as to each of such portions hereinafter in the said three Schedules respectively described, that in their opinion not less than one-third part of the area thereof respectively is land available for agriculture:

And whereas it is expedient that effect should be given to the said recommendation of the Waste Lands Board of Otago:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Acts, do hereby proclaim that each of the three portions of the waste lands particularly described in the three Schedules hereto respectively shall be and the same is hereby constituted into a hundred under and for the purposes of the said first-named Act; and that each shall be called or known by the name set above the description of the said hundred in the three Schedules hereto respectively.

SCHEDULES.

SCHEDULE No. 1. Waihemo Hundred.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by estimation thirteen thousand (13,000) acres, more or less, situate in the Waihemo and Highlay Survey Districts, being part of Run numbered two hundred and fifty-five (255) on the map of the said district. Bounded by a line commencing at the junction of Happy Valley Creek with the Shag River, and proceeding in a westerly and north-westerly direction up the Shag River to the northern boundary of the Highlay Survey District; thence along a line due east, twenty-five thousand four hundred (25400) links or thereabouts; thence along a straight line in a south-easterly direction, thirty-one thousand four hundred (81400) links or thereabouts to Happy Valley Creek to the starting point; but exclusive of all pre-emptive rights and other freeholds.

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Provisional Reserves for Educational Purposes in the Provincial District of Westland.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make out of any waste lands of the Crown provisional reserves for educational purposes of a public character in manner as in the said section is set forth:

And whereas the Waste Lands Board of Westland has passed a resolution recommending that the parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart and reserved for educational endowment purposes:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to reserve the said parcels of land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the authority vested in me by the above-named Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto annexed are provisionally reserved and set apart for educational endowment purposes, subject to the terms and conditions of the aforesaid twelfth section of the above-named Act.

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ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Westland, containing by admeasurement forty (40) acres two (2) roods and twenty-five (25) perches, more or less, being Section numbered one hundred and sixty-four (164) (in red), situate in the Jackson's Bay District. SIE,-With reference to my circular despatch of the 2nd August, 1876, I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council for giving effect to a Declaration concluded between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, on the 23rd July last, extending the provisions of the Extradition Treaty of the 20th May, 1876, to certain additional crimes.

The Declaration will come into operation on the 27th of this month.

Her the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of the reign of her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for Amend-ing the Law relating to the Extradition of Criminals," and also by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the thirty-sixth and thirty-seventh years of the reign of her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the Extradition Act, 1870," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent order, limit the operation of the order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and

qualifications as may be deemed expedient: And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twentieth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, between Her Majesty and the King of the Belgians, for the mutual extradition of crimi-nals, to which Treaty the above-mentioned Acts of Parliament were applied by an Order in Council of the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six:

And whereas a Declaration was concluded on the twenty-third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, extending the provisions of the above-mentioned Treaty to certain additional crimes, which Declaration is in the terms following:

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having judged it expedient, with the view to the more complete prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of certain crimes in addition to those enumerated in Article I. of the Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, of the 20th May, 1876, shall, under the provisions of that Treaty, be reciprocally delivered up, have agreed as follows:-

Persons charged as principals or accessories with or convicted of the under-mentioned crimes committed in the territories of the one Party, and who shall be found within the territories of the other Party, shall be reciprocally delivered up to each other under the circumstances and conditions stated in the Treaty between Great Britain and Belgium for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, of the 20th May, 1876:

- 1. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
- 2. Bigamy.
- 3. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.
- 4. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.
- 5. Receiving any chattel, money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been embezzled, stolen, or feloniously obtained.

The provisions of the present Declaration shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed THEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and the present Declaration, and have affixed thereto the 1877. DERBY.
