Municipality of Green Island proclaimed a Borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any of the several places specified in the Third Schedule to the said Act in which a Municipal Corporation has been established under the provisions of an Ordinance of the Province of Otago intituled "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," from a day to be named in such Proclamation; subject, however to certain conditions in the said section mentioned: And whereas the Municipality of Green Island, in the Provincial District of Otago, is one of the places specified in the said Third Schedule, and a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by fifty-one of the ratepayers of such town praying him to constitute such municipality into a borough under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and such petition was, on the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, publicly notified, and no petition from an equal or greater number of such ratepayers was presented to His Excellency within two months after such public notification praying him not to assent to the prayer of such first-mentioned petition:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that from the eighteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the said Municipality of Green Island shall be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and shall be called the Borough of Green Island, and that the boundaries of such borough shall

be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement one hundred and three (103) acres, more or less, comprising the private Townships of Green Island and Kingston, situate in the Lower Kaikorai District, being Sections numbered respectively seventy-eight (78), seventy-nine (79), eighty (80), eighty-one (81), ninety-one (91), ninety-two (92), ninety-three (93), ninety-four (94), and two hundred and ninety-six R (296R), and parts of Sections numbered respectively sixty-five (65), seventy-six (76), seventy-seven (77), eighty-two (82), ninety (90), and ninety-five (95) on the map of the said Lower Kaikorai District. A MEMORIAL

LAID before His Excellency the Governor by the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, pursuant to the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," containing an accurate description of the lands proposed to be taken for a certain public work—to wit, the construction of a portion of the railway from Napier to the junction with the railway from New Plymouth to Waitara at Sentry Hill (Aramoho Junction to the Town of Wanganui).

WANGANUI SUBURBAN.

THROUGH Section 20, containing 2 acres 2 roods 07.6 perches, more or less. Commencing at a point on the south side of Russell Vale Road, 825 8 links northwesterly from the north-east corner of Section 20 on River Bank Road; thence following a line 2967.3 links in a southerly direction to the south-west boundary of said Section 20; thence following the said boundary north-westerly 1003 links; thence in a north-easterly direction 29729 links to Russell Vale Road; and thence following the said road in a south-easterly direction to starting point for a distance of 100 8 links.

Through Section 19, containing 21:7 perches, more or less. NORMANBY, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that whenever lands are required to be taken for public works the Minister for Public Works shall cause a survey to be made and plans to be prepared showing generally the nature of the works proposed to be executed and the lands required to be taken for the same, together with the names of . the owners and occupiers of such lands so far as they can be ascertained, and shall cause a copy of such plans to be deposited in some place in the road district in which such lands are: And it is further enacted that the said Minister shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and to be twice publicly notified, stating the place where such plans are open for inspection, with a general description of the works proposed

to be executed and of the land required to be taken; and if after due consideration the said Minister is of opinion that it is expedient that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done thereby for which due compensation is not provided by the Act now in recital, the land proposed to be taken shall be taken in the following manner, that is to say: The said Minister shall lay before the Governor a memorial containing an accurate description of the land proposed to be taken, together with a map thereof, signed by the Surveyor-General or some certificated surveyor as evidence of the accuracy thereof; and the Governor in Council may thereupon, if he think fit, by Proclamation gazetted and publicly notified, declare that the said lands are taken for the use of a railway, road, or other public work, as the case may be; and from and after a date to be named in the said Proclamation the land therein specified shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for the public use named in the said Proclamation:

And whereas the lands described in the memorial above written are required to be taken under the authority of the said "Public Works Act, 1876," for a certain public work—to wit, the construction of a portion of the railway from Napier to the Junction with the railway from New Plymouth to Waitara at Sentry Hill (Aramoho Junction to the Town of

Wanganui).

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act prior to the taking of such lands have been duly performed and fulfilled:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine,

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Tauranga District Lands Act, 1867," and "The Tauranga District Lands Act, 1868," after reciting that by an Order in Council made the eighteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and therein referred to as a Proclamation, it was declared that all the lands of the tribe Ngaiterangi, described in the Schedule to the now reciting Acts, should be a district within the provisions of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and should be designated by the name "Tauranga District," therein mentioned or referred to, and it was declared that the said lands were required for the purposes of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," aforesaid, and ordered that the said lands should be and were thereby set apart as sites for settlement and colonization, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act, and that it was expressed to be ordered that, in accordance with the promise made by His Excellency the Governor at Tauranga, on the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, three-fourths in quantity of the said lands should be set apart for such persons of the tribe Ngaiterangi as should be determined by the Governor after due inquiry should have been made; it is enacted and declared, amongst other things, that the whole of the lands specified in the Schedule to the Act now in recital were, by the said Order in Council, duly and effectually declared to be a district within the provisions of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and that the whole of the said land was duly and effectually set apart, reserved, and taken under the said Act as sites for cettlement for colonization and was duly and effectually set. settlement for colonization, and was duly and effectually declared to be required for the purposes of the said "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and to be subject to the provisions thereof, and that, for the

Regulations for Auditing Accounts of School Committees.

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of January, 1878. Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Education Act, 1877," I, George Bay District, in the Provincial District of Auckland,

purposes of the Act now in recital, the words "due Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Goinquiry" in the said Order in Council should be vernor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with deemed and taken to extend to inquiries made and the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby make the following regula-tions for prescribing the times and manner of audit-ing the accounts of School Committees:—

1. Every School Committee shall, not less than

three days before the fourth Monday in the month of January, in the present and every succeeding year, submit its accounts for audit to some qualified person

appointed by the Committee.

2. Such person shall have access to all the books and accounts of the Committee and any of its officers, and shall examine the general statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Committee and verify the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto, and shall either certify under his hand the same as found by him to be correct, duly vouched, and in accordance with law, or specially report to the Education Board of the district in what respects he finds it incorrect, unvouched, or not in accordance with law.

3. This regulation shall apply to the accounts of every School Committee constituted prior to or after the coming into operation of "The Education Act,

N pursuance of the provisions of "The Government Native Land Purchases Act, 1877," it is hereby notified that money has been paid by or on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen for the purchase or acquisition of the several blocks of Native land in the North Island which are more particularly described and mentioned in the Schedule hereto; and, further, that negotiations in respect of such purchases or acquisitions as aforesaid have been entered into by or on behalf of Her said Majesty.

SCHEDULE. PIRAUAU.

ALL that block or parcel of land in the Poverty Bay District, in the Provincial District of Auckland, containing by admeasurement 4,112 acres or thereabouts, known by the name of Pirauau. Bounded on the North by the Rangiwhaiau Block, the Paparoa Block, and the Ruangarehu Block; thence on the East by the Pirauau-Tuakau No. 1 Block; thence on the South by the Mangatarata Creek; thence on the West by the Mata River to the starting point: as delineated on a plan deposited in the Survey Office, This block has not passed the Native Land Napier. Court.

PIRAUAU-TUAKAU No. 1.

All that block or parcel of land in the Poverty Bay District, in the Provincial District of Auckland, containing by admeasurement 8,540 acres or thereabouts, known by the name of Pirauau-Tuakau No. 1. Bounded on the North by the Tuakau No. 2 Block; thence on the East by the Onetchunga Creek and Tokomaru Block; thence on the South by the Tuakau Block, the Uriwiri Creek, and the Mangaroau Creek; thence on the West by the Mangatarata Creek and the Pirauau Block to the starting point. Bounded on the North by the Waipapa Creek; thence on the East by the Ruangarehu Block and Onetchunga Creek; thence on the South by the Pirauau-Tuakau No. 1 Block; thence on the West again by the Ruangarehu Block, Waihua Creek, and Ihungia Creek to the starting point. This block has passed the Native Land Court.

TUAKAU.

All that block or parcel of land in the Poverty Bay District, in the Provincial District of Auckland, containing by admeasurement 9,600 acres or thereabouts, known by the name of Tuakau. Bounded on the North by the Mangaroau Creek, the Uriwiri Creek, and Pirauau-Tuakau No. 1 Block; thence on the East by the Tokomaru Block; thence on the South by the Tauwhareparae Block; thence on the West by the Mata River to the starting point: as delineated on a plan deposited in the Survey Office, Napier. This block has passed the Native Land Court.

TAUWHAREPARAE (INCLUDING WAINGAROMIA No. 2).

This block has not passed the Native Land Court.

HUIARUA.

MATATUOTONGA.

PUREMUNGAHUA.

All that block or parcel of land in the Poverty Bay District, in the Provincial District of Auckland, containing by admeasurement 2,890 acres or thereabouts, known by the name of Puremungahua. Full truck charged for. Minimum charge on any one consignment to be seven pounds (£7).

Trucks will be allowed to remain at coal pits eight (8) working hours for the purpose of loading, after which demurrage will be charged at the rate of £1

per day or fraction thereof.

Any time from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. counted as working hours.
