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Boundaries of District Court District of Otago Gold Fields altered.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which District Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, a district was defined within which a District Court should be held under the said Act, and it was thereby declared that the said Court should be designated by the name of "The District Court of Otago Gold Fields:"

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, the boundaries of the said district so defined were altered:

And whereas it is expedient to further alter the boundaries of the said district so defined and altered as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of February next, the boundaries of the district within which the District Court of Otago Gold Fields shall be held shall be altered, and that thenceforth the boundaries thereof shall be the boundaries hereinafter described.

THE DISTRICT COURT OF OTAGO GOLD FIELDS.

Description of District.

This district comprises all that area bounded towards the North by the Provincial District of Canterbury, from the mouth of the River Awarua to a Pomahaka River to the confluence of the Parasol

DUNEDIN DISTRICT COURT.

Description of District.

THE Dunedin District shall comprise all that portion of the Provincial District of Otago bounded towards the North by the Otago Gold Fields District under "The District Courts Act, 1858," from Trigonometrical Station E on the Silver Peak Hills, by a right line running due east to a point on the north branch of the Waikouaiti River, distant from the confluence of the north and south branches of said river three hundred and ninety chains, more towards the East by the ocean; towards the South by the southern bank of Taieri River and branch to the Waipori Lake; thence by the Waipori Lake and the Meggatburn until it meets the boundary of the Otago Gold Fields District under the said "District Courts Act, 1858;" and on the West by the said Otago Gold Fields District under the said Act to afore-mentioned Trigonomtrical Station E, the point of commencement.

Lands reserved under "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877."

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Confiscated Lands Act, VV 1867," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to reserve out of lands taken under the said Act, or out of lands which by "The East Coast Land Titles Investigation Act, 1866," and "The East Coast Titles Investigation Act Amendment Act, 1867," it is provided shall be deemed to be Crown lands, such lands as to him shall seem fit: And whereas the said several parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto are lands taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863:" And whereas by "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the provisions of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," shall continue in operation, and shall be deemed to have been always in operation in respect of any reserves promised to Natives, or set apart for Natives under the said Act at any time previous to the coming into operation of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," but which, for want of surveys or other unavoidable causes, could not be proclaimed previous

to the time last mentioned: And whereas the lands hereinafter described were, previous to the coming into operation of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," promised to Natives, but for want of surveys could not be proclaimed previous to that Act

coming into operation:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said 1 130 ed Acts, do hereby proclaim and declare that the several parcels of land described in the Schedules hereto, marked respectively A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, and L, shall be and the same are hereby reserved for the purposes mentioned in the fourth section of the hereinbefore in part recited Act.

SCHEDULE A.

NATIVE RESERVES, WHAKATANE.

RESERVE No. 1, Allotment 28, Parish of Rangitaiki. Awarded to Ngatiawa (Whakatane section of tribe). Containing 2,510 acres, more or less.

"Auckland Dog Nuisance Act, 1854," in force within a portion of the County of Wairoa.

(L.S.)

THEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council

Act (Session I., No. 4), 1854," it is, among other things, enacted that the said Act shall come into operation in such districts as shall be proclaimed by the Superintendent in the Auckland Provincial Gazette to come within the operation of the said Act:

And whereas the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," vested in the Governor: And whereas it is expedient to proclaim that the district the boundaries whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be proclaimed to come within the operation of the said first-mentioned Act:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Acts, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date of this Proclamation, the said "Dog Nuisance Act, 1854," shall come into operation within that portion of the County of Wairoa the boundaries whereof are described in the Schedule hereto; and the said Act shall extend and apply to such district accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws for the Regulation of Omnibuses, Cabs, Cabs, Wagons, Drays, and all other VEHICLES PLYING FOR HIRE WITHIN THE CORO-MANDEL HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Notice.—To all persons whom it may concern.—In pursuance of the seventh section of "The Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1866," we, the Coromandel

Highway Trustees, being the local authority for the time being, do hereby agree and proclaim as follows:-

That all owners of omnibuses, cabs, cars, wagons, drays, and any other vehicles plying for hire within the proclaimed district, shall obtain from the Highway District Board a license permitting such omni-buses, &c., to carry a certain number of passengers either inside or outside. Said license to be in force only for any part of the year ending on the 30th day of June following the date for which it is issued.

For every such license there shall be paid to the District Board-For an omnibus, cab, car, &c., set on four wheels, one (£1) pound; and for an omnibus, &c., set on two wheels, ten (10s.) shillings. For a wagon, dray, &c., set on four wheels, one (£1) pound; and for a wagon, dray, &c., set on two wheels, ten (10s.) shillings.

That any driver of a public vehicle for conveyance

of passengers, who shall neglect to have painted, in | Importation of Grape Vines into Queensland prohibited. letters not less than one inch in size on the inside or outside of the door, or on some other conspicuous place of such vehicle as the Board may determine, the name and residence of the owner, the registered number of his license, and the number of passengers for which it is licensed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

If the owner of any omnibus, cab, car, &c., permits same to be used without first having a license in force as aforesaid in respect of such omnibus, &c., or without having the name and number painted in the manner herein directed, or if any person be found standing, driving, or plying for hire within the prescribed space, every such person shall be liable to a

penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

That any driver of any vehicle, licensed as aforesaid, galloping his horses or racing with any other vehicle, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The driver of any vehicle waiting for hire using as a stand any other place than those appointed by the District Board, or demanding higher rates than those authorized, shall, on conviction, be liable to pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

That each driver, on arriving with his vehicle at the shore end of the wharf, must either proceed on his journey without stopping, or turn down the road looking eastward, standing on the side of the roadway twenty-five feet from the wharf end, placing his vehicle in a line; the next driver, on arriving, to place his vehicle immediately behind the first, and the third behind the second, and so on. Neglect on the part of any driver to comply as aforesaid shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

That all wagons, drays, &c., passing through any part of the proclaimed district shall have, in addition to the name and residence of the owner, the registered number of his license, to be obtained from the Board, painted in legible and permanent characters on the right-hand side of his wagon, dray, &c. Neglect on the part of the owner or driver to comply as aforesaid, he shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

That an Inspector of licensed vehicles shall be appointed by the District Board, whose duty it will be to enforce these regulations and by-laws.

That all penalties shall be recoverable in a summary

way.

And, further, in pursuance of the powers vested in us under and by authority of "The Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1866," we, being the local authority for the time being, do hereby proclaim as follows:

That ten feet on each side of the main road, compared to the bridge pear the Bridge Hotel, to mencing at the bridge near the Bridge Hotel, to Ring's Bridge, Upper Township, and from the banks along the Tiki Road to the boundary of the Tiki Highway District, shall be a footway within the meaning of the said Act.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR EDWARD Kennedy, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Com-(L.S.) panion of the Most Honorable A. E. Kennedy, Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Queensland and its Governor. Dependencies.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the forty-first year of her present Majesty's reign intituled "The Grape Vines Disease Act," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to prohibit the introduction or importation into Queensland of grape vines or grape-vine cuttings: And whereas the grape vine disease known as *Phylloxera vastatrix* is found to exist in the Colony of Victoria: And whereas it is deemed expedient and necessary to prohibit the importation into Queensland of grape vines and grape-vine cuttings: Now, therefore, I, Sir Arthur Edward Kennedy, the Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore recited Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, absolutely prohibit the introduction or importation into Queensland from the said Colony of Victoria, and from all other places whatsoever, of any grape vines or grape-vine cuttings until this my Proclamation shall be revoked.
