A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Canterbury Roads Ordinance, 1871," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that from the date hereof the portion of the Geraldine Road District described in the First Schedule hereto shall be severed from the said Geraldine Road District, and shall be annexed to the adjoining Mount Peel Road District. And, further, that the Geraldine Road District shall from the date hereof be constituted and bounded as the same is described in the Second Schedule hereto. And, further, that the Mount Peel Road District shall from the date hereof be constituted and bounded as the same is described in the Third Schedule hereto.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

FIRST SCHEDULE.
