Setting apart Land in Otago for Agricultural Leases and Sale on Deferred Payments.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-fourth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor; or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

And whereas the lands described in the First Schedule hereto are Crown lands subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said Act, and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor: And whereas the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto are also Crown lands subject to be dealt with under the said Act, for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby select and set apart, for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto; and do fix the first day of May next ensuing, at the Warden's office at Macraes, as the day and place on which the said land shall be open for application in allotments, as surveyed and marked on the survey map in the office of the Chief Surveyor, Dunedin.

And I do hereby further select and set apart, for the purpose of alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments, the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto; and do fix the first day of May aforesaid as the day on which the said allotments shall be open for application in allotments, as surveyed and marked on the survey map in the office of the Chief Surveyor, Dunedin.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

SETTING APART SECTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF GRANTING AGRICULTURAL LEASES.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement three thousand five hundred and forty-three (3,543) acres and twenty-four (24) poles, more or less, being Sections numbered respectively 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10, of Block III., Highlay District, and Sections numbered respectively 1, 2, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, and 16, of Block VII., Waihemo District: as delineated on the plans deposited in the Provincial District Survey Office, Dunedin.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Taranaki.

#### NORMANBY, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, pass a resolution recom-mending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said

land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Saturday, the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application in allotments, as surveyed and marked on the survey map in the office of the Chief Surveyor, New Plymouth.

Boundaries of Land Registrars' Districts of Otago and Southland altered.

#### NORMANBY, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Land Transfer Act 1870 Amendment Act, 1871," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation published in the Gazette, alter the boundaries of any Land Registrar's district pro-claimed or to be proclaimed under the provisions of "The Land Transfer Act, 1870:"

And whereas the existing boundaries of the Land Registrars' Districts of Otago and Southland are respectively declared by sections twenty-four and twenty-five of the said firstly recited Act, and it is expedient to alter such boundaries in manner herein-

after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority aforesaid, doth hereby alter the respective boundaries of the said districts in manner following—that is to say, the island known as Stewart's Island shall from and after the date hereof cease to be within the boundaries of or to form part of the Land Registrar's District of Otago, and shall, as from the same date, be within the boundaries of and shall for all purposes of the said "Land Transfer Act, 1870," be included in the Land Registrar's District of Southland.

## Declaring Lands open for Sale within Mining Districts, Westland.

(L.S.)

## NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fifty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district, not held under license or lease at the date of such Proclamation, or over which the license or lease has been cancelled, to be open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form, and on such date, as has been cancelled, to be open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form, and on such date, as he may determine; and any lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown lands of the same class not within a mining district: And the Governor may from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the lands specified in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale, the rural lands in sections of not less than twenty acres nor more than three hundred and twenty acres, and that the twentieth day of March instant shall be the day on which the said lands shall be open for sale.

Defining the Middle Line of portion of the Railway from Wellington to a junction with the Railway from Napier to Sentry Hill, at a point near the Manawatu Gorge, passing through the Hutt, Featherston, and Masterton—from 45 miles, Featherston (Suburban), to 65 miles 50 chains, near Masterton.

## (L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and twenty-second section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that every railway shall be made only under the authority of a special Act, which shall state as nearly as may be the line of the railway and the two termini thereof; and by the one hundred and twenty-third section of the same Act, that the several railways specified in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed to have been made, and in so far as any of them are unfinished may be completed, under the provisions of the Act now under recital, and the said Act shall be deemed to be a special Act authorizing the construction of each of the said railways; and by the one hundred and twenty-fourth section of the same Act, that when any railway is to be constructed under the provisions of any special Act the Governor shall issue a Proclamation defining the middle line of the railway or any part thereof, and may from time to time, by a Proclamation revoking or amending such former Proclamation, alter such line in any manner or to any extent which may be found necessary for the construction of such railway within the provisions of the said special Act; and by the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of the same Act, that the Minister shall cause to be made and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court such maps and plans as may be necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such Proclamation: And whereas the railway from Wellington to a junction with the railway from Napier to Sentry Hill, at a point near the Manawatu Gorge, passing through the Hutt, Featherston, and Masterton, is one of the railways specified in the said Fourth Schedule, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that the two termini of the said line shall be a point in Suburban Section number seventy, Township of Featherston, and Rural Section number sixty-one, Township of Masterton, Provincial District of Wellington, and Colony of New Zealand. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6217, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable John Ballance, the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the Office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington.

#### SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point in Suburban Section No. 70, Township of Featherston, within the County of Wairarapa West, Provincial District of Wellington, Colony of New Zealand, the said point being the thirty-one perches, more or less.

# (L.8.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that, whenever lands are required to be taken for public works, the Minister for Public Works shall cause a survey to be made and plans to be prepared showing generally the nature of the works proposed to be executed and the lands required to be taken for the same, together with the names of the owners and occupiers of such lands so far as they can be ascertained, and shall cause a copy of such plans to be deposited in some place in the road district in which such lands are: And it is further enacted that the said Minister shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and to be twice publicly notified, stating the place where such plans are open for inspection, with a general description of the works proposed to be executed and of the land required to be taken, and in such notice shall call upon all persons affected to set forth in writing any well-founded objections to the execution of such works or to the taking of such lands, and to send such writing within forty days from the first publication of such notice to the said Minister: And it is further enacted that the Minister for Public Works shall cause a copy of such notice and description to be served upon the said owners and occupiers so far as they can be ascertained; and that the said Minister shall, upon receiving any objection, appoint a time and place within the colony within which the objector may appear before the said Minister, or some person appointed by him, and support the objection by such evidence as the objector thinks fit; and that if within the said forty days no such objection is made, or if after due

consideration of such objections the said Minister is of opinion that it is expedient that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done thereby for which due compensation is not provided by the Act now in recital, the land proposed to be taken shall be taken in the following manner, that is to say: The said Minister shall lay before the Governor a memorial containing an accurate description of the land proposed to be taken, together with a map thereof, signed by the Surveyor-General or some certificated surveyor as evidence of the accuracy thereof; and the Governor in Council may thereupon, if he think fit, by Proclamation gazetted and publicly notified, declare that the said lands are taken for the use of a railway, road, or other public work, as the case may be; and from and after a date to be named in the said Proclamation the land therein specified shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for the public use named in the said Proclamation:

And whereas the lands described in the memorial above written are required to be taken under the authority of the said "Public Works Act, 1876," for a certain public work—to wit, the construction of a portion of a road between Masterton and Opaki, in the County of Wairarapa West:

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act prior to the taking of such lands have been duly performed and fulfilled:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the memorial above written, and shown on the plan thereto attached, are hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that from and after the day of the date hereof the said lands shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a public road.

Alteration in Rates for Light Dues, Ports of Tauranga, Poverty Bay, Napier, and Wairoa.

## NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this thirteenth day of March, 1878.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Marine Act, 1867," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may fix the various rates of lighthouse dues, not exceeding those specified in the said Act, which shall be payable at any port or ports within the colony, in respect of all vessels arriving at and of all vessels leaving such ports, by the master of every such vessel, and such dues from time to time to alter: And whereas by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, certain light dues were fixed for the ports mentioned in the Schedule thereunto attached: And whereas it is expedient to alter the rates of dues leviable at certain ports:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in exercise and pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, doth order that, on and after the first day of April next, in lieu of the light dues leviable under the said recited Order in Council at the Ports of Tauranga, Poverty Bay, Napier, and Wairoa, there shall be leviable the light dues which are specified in the third column of the Schedule hereto annexed, and therein set opposite the name of the port at which they shall be leviable; and from and after the date aforesaid, the light dues made leviable at the said ports, under and by virtue of the said recited Order in Council, shall cease and determine:

And, with the like advice and consent, His Excellency the Governor doth further order that light dues in respect of a vessel bound from a port in New Zealand to a port at which light dues are leviable, but at which there is no officer of Customs employed in the collection of the revenue, shall be paid at the port of departure; and that any vessel from any place out of New Zealand, calling at a port where light dues are not charged for such voyage, shall, on arriving at any other port where light dues are chargeable on vessels arriving from such voyage, be charged the same rate as if she had arrived at such port direct.

## NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this thirteenth day of March, 1878.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Education Act, 1877," (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that Education Boards shall keep full and true accounts, in which shall be entered every sum received into and paid out of the Board Fund, in the order of date of each such receipt and payment, including all moneys received from rates or profits derived from lands or other property vested in the Board, and that all such accounts shall be rendered annually, or at such periods as may be prescribed by regulations, and shall be audited by an Auditor to be appointed by the Governor:

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and as may be necessary to secure the due administration of the

said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say,—

1. Every Education Board shall, during the month of March in the present and every succeeding year, cause its accounts to be made up for the year ending the thirty-first day of December previous, and shall submit the same for audit to the Auditor appointed for the purposes of the said Act, in or for the district

for which such Board is constituted.

2. Every such Auditor shall have access to all the books and accounts of the Board and any of its officers, and shall examine the general statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board, and verify the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto, and shall either certify under his hand the same as found by him to be correct, duly vouched, and in accordance with law, or specially report to the Minister of Education holding office for the time being under "The Education Act, 1877," in what respects he finds it incorrect, unvouched, or not in accordance with law.

3. These regulations shall apply to every Education Board constituted prior to or after the coming into operation of "The Education Act, 1877," and shall come into force upon the thirteenth day of March instant.

Making Regulations for granting Agricultural Leases within the Ohinemuri Block, Hauraki Gold-Mining District.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by "The Gold Mining Districts Act, 1873," and "The Ohinemuri Gold Field Agricultural Leases Validation Act, 1876," and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following Regulations for the Ohinemuri Gold Field, Hauraki Gold-Mining District, prescribing the mode in which applications may be made for leases of land for agricultural purposes; the quantity of land, not exceeding two hundred acres, which shall and may be granted in a lease in any particular block; the amount of deposits to be paid by any applicant therefor, and by any objector thereto; the terms and conditions upon which such leases may be held, occupied, assigned, transferred, forfeited, and cancelled; the amount of rent payable therefor, and the times and places of payment; the conditions upon which and the manner in which entry to search for gold, or for any metal or mineral, upon any land so leased may be authorized; and the terms and conditions upon which the holders of miners' rights may be permitted to mine upon land the lease for which shall have been determined on account of its auriferous character.

## REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING AGRICULTURAL LEASES.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING AGRICULTURAL LEASES WITHIN THE OHINEMURI BLOCK, HAURAKI GOLD-MINING DISTRICT.

Applications.

1. All applications for leases shall be accompanied by a sketch plan of the land applied for, which shall, so far as practicable, exhibit to the satisfaction of the Warden the boundaries and estimated acreage of the land for which a lease is asked.

## Deposit to be made.

2. Before lodging his application, the applicant

Revenue, who shall give a receipt therefor in duplicate, and no application shall be entertained unless one duplicate be annexed to the application. event of the lease issuing, the sum deposited shall be placed to the credit of the applicant, towards payment of the first year's rent and the cost of preparing the lease; in the event of the lease being refused, the same shall be returned to the applicant.

## Applications to be recorded.

3. Every application shall be recorded in a book to be kept for the purpose, and the date and hour of the receipt of such application, the name of the applicant, and the area and situation of the land applied for, shall be minuted therein, together with the address to be given by the applicant for service. Such book shall be open to public inspection, and any person may take a copy of any minute therein.

## Term and Area.

4. No application shall be received for a lease of less than ten acres or more than fifty acres, and no lease shall be granted for a longer term than twentyone years, and it shall not be competent for any person to hold two or more distinct selections of any land dealt with under these Regulations. Any lessee may, with the consent of the Warden, hold by transfer an area not exceeding two hundred acres: Provided the selections adjoin and the conditions of each lease have been complied with.

#### Figure of Selection to be Rectangular, &c.

5. Every area of land applied for must, so far as the features of the country will permit, be of a rectangular form, and, when fronting on a road, river, lake, or coast, where practicable, must be of a depth not less than twice its length of frontage. No such selection must be made so as to monopolize the wood or water, or any landing-place, in any locality. No lease shall be granted on any selection made in such a manner as to injuriously interfere with the disposition of the remainder of any land in the vicinity of the land so selected.

## Applicant to survey.

6. Each applicant shall have the land selected by him surveyed at his own expense by a surveyor duly authorized by the Chief Surveyor of the Auckland District, and shall cause to be delivered, at the Survey Office, Auckland, a plan and tracing of the same, executed in accordance with the instructions of the Surveyor-General, within six months of the date of application, and the Chief Surveyor shall, if the plan be so executed, certify the same upon the tracing, and transmit it to the Warden's office.

#### How Lease to be executed.

7. As soon as conveniently may be after the deposit of the survey plan as aforesaid, a lease in due form. executed on behalf of Her Majesty, will be issued to the applicant upon his executing a counterpart thereof, and paying for such lease the sum of thirty shillings.

#### Lease to be forfeited if not executed within One Month.

8. Any applicant who shall fail to execute the counterpart of his lease for the space of one calendar month after notice shall have been given that the same is ready for signature shall forfeit his right to such lease. Any such notice may be delivered per-sonally, or sent by post addressed to the place of abode of the applicant.

#### Rent to be paid in Advance.

9. The rent per acre to be reserved upon every lease shall be at the annual rate of one shilling for the first seven years, one shilling and sixpence shall deposit five pounds with the Receiver of Gold | the second seven years, and two shillings for the last seven years; and shall be due, and paid annually in advance, to the Receiver of Gold Revenue, on the first day of January in each year of the term of lease: Provided always that one full year's rent shall be paid at the time of issue on all leases issued prior to the thirtieth day of June in any year, and one half-year's rent shall be paid on leases issued subsequent to the thirtieth day of June in any year.

## Lease to be void if Rent in Arrear.

10. If the rent reserved by any lease shall be in arrear for six months, or the conditions hereinafter imposed shall not be fulfilled, such lease shall be void, and all rights thereunder forfeited.

#### Conditions of Lease.

11. Every lease granted under these Regulations shall be subject to the conditions following:—

(1.) Not less than one-tenth of the whole area shall, within twelve months from the commencement of the term of the lease, be brought into cultivation, or one-half of the whole area shall be substantially fenced within the said period.

(2.) Cultivation or other improvements to be commenced within three months from the date

of the lease.

## Register to be kept.

12. A register of all leases granted, and of all transfers or assignments thereof, shall be kept by the Mining Registrar at Ohinemuri.

#### Lease may be transferred.

13. Any lease may, with the sanction of the Warden, be transferred: Provided that no transfer shall be valid unless the conditions upon which the lease was granted are certified by the Warden to have been complied with; upon any such transfer a fee of one pound for cost of inquiry and registration shall in every case be paid.

## Roads.

14. Land so leased shall be subject to the right on the part of the Warden to lay out roads thereover, and no compensation shall be allowed in respect of any such land so taken, except where the same is occupied by buildings or ornamental grounds, or be under crop.

#### Application to enter to search for Gold.

15. Any holder of a miner's right desiring to enter for the purpose of searching for gold upon any land held under agricultural lease shall apply to the Warden in such form as may be prescribed, and shall serve upon the occupant or lessee of the land a duplicate copy of such application. On the receipt of such application, the Warden shall appoint a day and place for hearing the same, and on the day appointed shall proceed to hear the application and any objection thereto that may be made by the lessee or occupier; and the Warden may thereupon grant or refuse such application.

#### Deposit.

16. In any case in which permission shall be granted to any holder of a miner's right to enter upon any such land for the purpose of searching for gold, he shall deposit with the Receiver of Gold Revenue such sum of money as the Warden may consider sufficient as security for the due performance of any conditions of such permission, and it shall be lawful for the Warden, in case of failure to comply with such conditions or any of them, to order payment of the whole or any part of such money to the lessee or occupier of the land, or to make such other order in relation to the same as to him shall seem fit; and the decision of the Warden shall be final.

## Conditions of Entry to search for Gold.

17. The Governor reserves the right of free entry to any land so leased as aforesaid for the purpose of searching and mining for gold, or for any other metal or mineral, and of determining any lease when such gold, metals, or minerals shall have been discovered therein, and also of granting permission to prospect without compensation upon any unimproved land.

#### Exemptions.

18. Agricultural leases will not, except in special cases, be granted of lands comprised within the boundaries of proclaimed townships or public reserves, nor for any area including a permanent water-course, or which may present auriferous indications; and in all cases a public roadway one chain in width will be reserved along the margins of navigable streams and rivers.

#### Rivers, &c., may not be diverted.

19. The granting of any lease shall not authorize the diversion of any road, river, stream, or watercourse, or authorize the use of any water therefrom, or from any natural spring, except for domestic purposes; but all such water on any demised land the same shall remain subject to the Gold Fields jurisdiction

### Governor may reserve Land in certain cases.

20. The Governor may at any time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, proclaim any land included in any agricultural lease to be a reserve for the site of a township, or for any other purpose of public utility, and the estate of the lessee in the land so reserved shall thereon cease and determine, and the lessee shall be entitled to payment of compensation for the loss or injury he may sustain by the exercise of such right, the amount thereof to be ascertained by two impartial persons, one to be appointed by the Governor and the other by the lessee, or by any umpire to be appointed by such persons.

## Governor may exclude Land from Lease.

21. The Governor at any time before the execution of any lease may exclude from the land proposed to be comprised therein any land which may appear to him to be suitable and necessary for any purpose of public utility.

## Lapsed Leases.

22. Should any lease granted as aforesaid lapse or be forfeited the Warden may, with the approval and in the name of the Governor, re-enter on the land so demised, and the same repossess and enjoy as effectually as if no such lease had existed.

#### Provision for Acquisition of Land.

23. In the event of the acquisition by Government of the freehold of the lands comprised in the Ohinemuri Block, all applications which may be made by lessees for the purchase of the lands demised to them under these Regulations shall be forwarded to the Warden, who shall report thereon, and shall, as soon as conveniently may be thereafter, submit the same, together with such report, for the consideration of the Government.

24. Any notice required by these Rules to be given may be given by serving the same personally upon, or posting the same directed to, the applicant at his address for service.
