Boundaries of Deeds Registration Districts of Otago and Southland altered.

At the Government House, at Auckland, this nineteenth day of March, 1878.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Deeds Registration Act, 1868," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time define and alter the limits of any deeds registration district, and may create new registration districts:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the twenty. seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, the Province of Otago as constituted by "The Otago and Southland Union Act, 1870," was divided into two registration districts for the purposes of the said "Deeds Registration Act, 1868," which said districts are respectively Act, 1868," which said districts are respectively known as the Deeds Registration Districts of Otago and Southland:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the existing boundaries of the said districts in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him as aforesaid, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, order that for all purposes of "The Deeds Registration Act, 1868," the island known as Stewart's Island shall, from and after the date hereof, cease to be within the Deeds Registration District of Otago, and shall for all purposes of "The Deeds Registration Act, 1868," be included in the Deeds Registration District of Southland: And His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, doth hereby, as from the date hereof, alter the boundaries of the said districts accordingly.

# SHOAL, TRINITY BAY.

THE position of the shoal reported by Captain Saunders, of the s.s. "Alexandra," and of which a notice was published from this office on the 16th November last, having been examined by Lieut. Connor, R.N., the officer in charge of the Admiralty Survey, the supposed danger has been found to be the north-east extremity of the main reef, which lies in the following position, viz.,—

North extremity of Island Point, N.W. by W. 3 W. Round Hill ... S. by W. westerly.

Vessels passing along the coast will be clear of this danger while keeping the two remarkable hills denoted on the chart as 2,652 and 2,710 feet in height respec-

tively, and lying south-west of Cape Grafton, open to the north-east of Double Island; while vessels going to or from Port Douglas will clear it by keeping the hill, denoted as 1,757 feet in height, open to the north-east of Island Point.

#### NEW HEBRIDES.

PORT RESOLUTION, ISLAND OF TANNA.

Captain Kilgour, of the "Stanley" schooner, reports that the formation of Port Resolution has been considerably altered by the effects of an earth-quake which took place at 7 a.m. on the 10th of January, and which was followed by a wave said to have been some 20 feet in height. The shock lasted about half a minute, throwing down—according to the report of Mr. Neilson, the missionary—about 40 acres of the high land forming the North Head. From the rocks on the north-west side of the entrance to the large shelving rock immediately opposite the missionary's house, Captain Kilgour found no change to interfere with the navigation; but the rock itself appeared to have been raised about 10 feet, and a long ledge of coral rock, extending from it S. by E. about 50 yards, thrown up above high water, thereby narrowing the harbour to that extent, just above what was formerly the best anchorage. He further states that the harbour now presents a totally dif-ferent appearance to that shown on the charts and described in the sailing directions, the principal changes having taken place on the western shore, while the depth of water in the port has shoaled about a fathom.

Vessels are cautioned to be very careful if leaving the mid-channel, and not to proceed further up the harbour than Missionary's Point.
