A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Auckland intituled "The Auckland Dog Nuisance Act (Session I, No. 4), 1854," it is, among other things, enacted that the said Act shall come into operation in such districts as shall be proclaimed by the Superintendent in the Auckland Provincial Gazette to come within the operation of the said Act:

And whereas the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," vested in the Governor: And whereas it is expedient that the district comprised within the County of Waitemata should be proclaimed to come within the operation of the said first-mentioned Act:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, on and from the date of this Proclamation, the said "Dog Nuisance Act, 1854," shall come into operation within the district comprised in the County of Waitemata, and the said Act shall extend and apply to the said County of Waitemata accordingly.

Colony, at the Government House, at Auckland, this twenty-second day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Ordinance of the Province of Canterbury intituled "The Canterbury Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, 1872," and by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, on and from the date hereof, that portion of the Provincial District of Canterbury described in the Schedule hereto shall be included within the agricultural district referred to in Schedule B of the said "Canterbury Trespass of Cattle Ordinance, 1872."

SCHEDULE.

THE Levels District comprises that portion of the Provincial District of Canterbury not included in the Town of Timaru, and bounded on the North by the Temuka, Geraldine, and Mount Peel Road Districts; on the East by the sea; on the South by the Pareora River; on the South-west by the eastern boundary of Section No. 20518, and the south-eastern boundary of the same section, and by a line in continuation of that boundary to meet the Burke's Pass Road, by that road to where it crosses the River Tengawai, thence by that river to the south-east corner of Section 21315, thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of section 3279, and by the west boundary of that section to the junction of the Burke's Pass Road with the road

passing through Section 21990, thence along the centre of the latter road passing through Sections 21088 and 16279 to the River Pareora.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

*Delegating certain Powers under "The Mines Act, 1877."*

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by the one hundredth section of 'The Mines Act, 1877,' it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to such person or persons, being in the service of the Crown, as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections six, seven, eight, nine, ten, forty-five, forty-six, forty-nine, fifty-one, fifty-four, fifty-five, fifty-nine, sixty-one, sixty-eight, seventy, eighty-two, eighty-three, ninety-nine, one hundred and one, one hundred and seven, and one hundred and twelve, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such delegation: And whereas it is expedient to make the delegation hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby delegate unto James Pillans Maitland, of Dunedin, Esquire, and Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Provincial District of Otago, all the powers vested in the Governor under the thirty-seventh, thirty-eighth, thirty-ninth, fortieth, forty-first, forty-third, forty-fourth, fifty-sixth, sixtieth, and sixty-fifth sections of the said Act, and as the same sections, or any of them, may from time to time be amended: And I do hereby order and declare that the powers hereby delegated shall be exercised and performed by the said James Pillans Maitland within the Provincial District of Otago, and so long only as he shall hold the office of Commissioner of Crown Lands as aforesaid, and that all such powers shall be exercised in accordance with any regulations now in force under the said Act, or that may hereafter be in force so far as the same relates to the said powers hereby delegated, and subject also to the consent and approval of the Land Board of the Otago Land District.
