LIGHT ON CAPE MARIA VAN DIEMEN.

PRELIMINARY NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Lighthouse is now in the course of erection at Cape Maria Van Diemen. It is anticipated that the light will be ready for exhibition in January, 1879. The following is a description of the light that will be exhibited:—

Cape Maria Van Diemen Lighthouse is situated on the small island which lies off the northern end of Cape Maria Van Diemen, at the extreme north of the North Island of New Zealand. The light will be a First Order Revolving White Light, visible all round as far as the land will allow. It will attain its greatest brilliancy every minute. From the lower part of the tower a Fixed Red Light will be shown over the Columbia Reef.

Due notice will be given of the exact date when this light will be first exhibited.

About the centre of the label are the words "New Season's," in letters about ⅜ of an inch long, above which two words, and below the before-mentioned drawing, are the words "Extra Choice" in letters about ½ an inch long; below the before-mentioned words "New Season's" are the words "Kaisou Congou" in letters of about ⅜ of an inch long. All the words "Extra Choice," "New Season's," "Kaisou Congou," occupy about one-third part of the label. The remaining part of the label will be filled up, but the words or numbers of the printing will or may vary.

The above description is for labels for box teas; for half-chests the label will be the same but larger in every respect, and for chests larger again than that for half-chests.
