# (L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, by Order in Council made under the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1873," and dated the second day of this current month of October, I have appointed Thursday, the tenth day of October instant, to be observed throughout the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay as a bank holiday under and for the purposes of the above-mentioned Act.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this second day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

Regulations for Trout Fishing in County of Waitaki.

#### NORMANBY, Governor.

N pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867," His Excellency the Governor doth hereby make the following regulations for the County of Waitaki:-

1. These regulations shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. Any holder of a license may fish with rod and line for brown trout in the following rivers, creeks, or streams: Oamaru Creek, Waireka Creek, and Waianakarua River, from the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, both inclusive. The Regulations Nos. three, four, five, six, seven,

and eight, of the Regulations of the twenty-ninth September, one thousand eight hundred and seventyseven, published in the New Zealand Gazette of the fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, page nine hundred and ninety-seven, shall, so far as applicable, be incorporated with and form part of these regulations.
