A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the lands specified in the Schedule hereto were, on the dates set opposite the said parcels of land respectively, under the provisions of the forty-seventh section of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," proclaimed by the Superintendent of Otago, and also by the Land Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, under the provisions of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," aforesaid, as amended by "The Waste Lands Amendment Act, 1876," as lands open for occupation on deferred payments:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, pass a resolution recommending that the land in the Chatton District described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be withdrawn from the deferred-payment system, and should be offered for sale by auction as land of special value:

And whereas the Land Board aforesaid did, on the twenty-eighth day of August, pass two resolutions, recommending that the lands in the Waikaia and Waipahi Districts, also described in the Schedule hereto, should be withdrawn from the deferred-payment system, and should be offered for sale by

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the abovenamed Acts, do hereby revoke the Proclamations above referred to, so far as they relate to the sections therein mentioned and included in the Schedule hereto, and do proclaim and declare that the said sections are hereby withdrawn from the operation of the deferred-payment system, and that the same shall be disposed of as recommended by the Land Board aforesaid.

Land within the Westland Gold Field exempted from occupation for Mining Purposes.

NORMANBY, Governor. (L.s.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the eighth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in the Proclamation constituting a mining district, and also from time to time by Proclamation subsequently issued, either by general or particular description, to set apart for mining purposes exclusively any portion of Crown lands within a mining district, and in like manner to exempt from occupation for mining purposes, or for water-races, dams, or reservoirs, or for machine, business, or residence sites, any land within the boundaries of such mining district, and from time to time any such exemption to revoke, and the limits and extent of the land in any such district comprised to alter as he may think fit:

And whereas at the time of the commencement of the said Act there was constituted a gold field known as the "Westland Gold Field," and such gold field is by the provisions of the said "Mines Act, 1877," to be deemed a mining district under that Act

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is within such mining district, and it is expedient to exempt the same from occupation for mining purposes, or for water-races, dams, or reser-

voirs, or for machine, business, or residence sites: Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the

Act, 1877," do proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby exempted from occupation for mining purposes, or for waterraces, dams, or reservoirs, or for machine, business, or residence sites.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in D me by the eleventh section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and known as the "Kowai Pass Racecourse and Recreation Ground," and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Canterbury, situate in the Malvern District, contain ing by admeasurement one hundred (100) acre more or less, on the north-eastern side of the Coal Tramway Reserve, the said point being the western-most corner of Section 14381; thence north-westerly, following the said reserve, a distance of eleven chains sixty links; thence northerly, following the road powers and authorities vested in me by "The Mines forming the eastern boundary of Reserve No. 1248

Powers delegated to the Kowai Pass Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eighth day of October, 1878.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person," in the herein-before recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of

section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the "Kowai Pass Domain Board:"-

(herein referred to as "the Board,") subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month at seven o'clock p.m., at the office of the Chairman, or at such other place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a Any meeting may be adjourned from time auorum. to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a

meeting.

And whereas by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said one hundred and forty-fourth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the Gazette of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the Gazette:

Regulations for the Preparation, Revision, &c., of Electors' Rolls under "The Counties Act, 1876."

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Counties Act, 1876" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that, in all cases in which no provision, or no sufficient provision, is, in the opinion of the Governor, made by the said Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, for the purpose of facilitating or more effectually carrying into execution any of the objects of the said Act, to make and prescribe all such regulations and orders, | provided.

either general or applicable to particular cases only, as he shall think fit, and such regulations and orders from time to time to revoke or alter as to the Governor shall appear to be requisite:

And whereas, in my opinion, no provision or no sufficient provision is made by the said Act for the

following matters and things, that is to say,—
(1.) For the preparation of an electors' roll for the purposes of elections occurring in any county before a roll is made up in accordance with the Third Part of the said Act;

(2.) For the preparation and revision of such rolls, where the number or boundaries of

ridings have been in any manner altered; or (3.) Where any portion of the county has been incorporated in a borough, or where a borough or any part thereof has become united with a county;

(4.) For correcting errors in describing the boundaries of any riding:

And whereas it is expedient to make general regulations and orders applicable to the said cases:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Counties Act, 1876," and for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, do hereby make the following regulations,

and do order as follows, that is to say,—

1. Whenever it shall be necessary to prepare an electors' roll for the purposes of elections occurring in any county in which the said Act is in operation, and before any roll has been formed in such county, the Clerk of the County Council (herein referred to as "the Clerk") shall, on or before such day as the Council may appoint, do and perform all things directed by the forty-second section of the said Act.

2. The forty-fifth section of the said Act shall apply to the roll prepared hereunder.

3. The persons appointed by the Council, as provided by section forty-three of the said Act, shall do and perform all things mentioned in that section, on or before the day appointed by the Council as hereinbefore provided.

- 4. A copy of the rolls for the several ridings shall be kept and public notice given, and such rolls shall be open to public inspection, as directed by the fortysixth section of the said Act, between such days as the Council may appoint; and persons aggrieved may do all things directed by the forty-seventh section on or before such day as may be appointed as aforesaid.
- 5. The Resident Magistrate of the Resident Magistrate's Court in the riding, or if there is no such Court, or more than one in the riding, the Resident Magistrate of the Resident Magistrate's Court appointed by the Governor, pursuant to section forty-seven of the said Act, shall by public notice appoint a time and place, on or after a day to be fixed by the County Council, at which to hear applications as directed by the forty-eighth section of the said Act; and all things may be done and performed thereat which might be done at a sitting held in accordance with the said forty eighth section with the said forty-eighth section.
- 6. The Resident Magistrate may adjourn such Court from time to time, but such Court shall not sit on any day later than one month from the date on or before which the Clerk shall have prepared rolls under the first of these regulations
- 7. The said roll so corrected shall be signed by the Clerk, and shall come into force on the day fixed for a general election of the Council and not previously, and shall be the electors' roll for the several ridings in force until a fresh roll is made, as by the said Act

- 8. Whenever, by reason of any alteration in the number of the ridings in a county in which the said Act is in operation, it shall be necessary to prepare new rolls before a general election of the Council, the following provisions shall have effect:—
 - (1.) Upon such alteration taking effect, the Clerk shall, as soon as conveniently may be, make up from the electors' roll or rolls in force a new roll for such new or altered ridings, and shall place on the roll of each such riding the name of each voter who appears from the existing electors' rolls to be entitled to vote in such new or altered riding, and shall assign to each the number of votes to which he is entitled.
 - (2.) Such new rolls, when corrected by the Council and signed by the Chairman and any two Councillors, shall be the electors' rolls for such new ridings until new rolls are made up in accordance with the said Act.

(3.) The new rolls so formed shall come into force on the day fixed for a general election of the Council, and not previously.

9. Where a borough has been dissolved and included within a county under any law authorizing the same, a new electors' roll shall be made up, as soon as conveniently may be, by adding thereto the names of all persons who at the time of such dissolution were entitled to vote in the borough.

10. Such names shall be inserted upon the roll of the riding or ridings of which the former borough then forms part, and shall be added thereto by the Clerk, who shall place on such roll or rolls the names of each person who was entitled to vote in the borough according to the burgess roll in force at the time of such dissolution, and shall assign to each the number of votes to which he was entitled under such last-mentioned roll.

11. Where any portion of a county is added to a borough, then the existing roll or rolls in force in any riding or ridings affected thereby shall be altered, as soon as conveniently may be, by the Clerk omitting therefrom the names of all persons who appear in the existing electors' rolls to be entitled to vote in the portion so added to the borough.

12. When a new roll or rolls shall have been made under the Regulations 9, 10, and 11, the same, when corrected by the Council, and signed by the Chairman and any two Councillors, shall be the electors' rolls in the riding or ridings to which they relate until new rolls are made up in accordance with the said Act. The rolls made under the said regulations shall come into force when corrected and signed as aforesaid.

13. For the purposes of these regulations the term "borough" means any borough constituted under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and includes any Municipal Corporation constituted under any other Act or Ordinance.

14. Any copy of an electors' roll made or altered under these regulations, signed by the Clerk, shall be evidence that the said roll has been duly made under the provisions of the said Act, unless the contrary is proved; and no defect in the title to office of any person making or signing such roll shall invalidate such roll.

15. In any case where the Governor shall be satisfied that by inadvertence any error has occurred in describing the boundaries of a riding, whether such error has occurred prior to the making of these regulations or subsequent thereto, or that any omission has been made in such description, the Governor may cause such error to be rectified by a notification in the New Zealand Gazette and in at least one news-
