Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Southland.

(L.S.) **NORMANBY, Governor.**
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the nineteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Monday, the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement four thousand four hundred and twenty (4,420) acres, more or less, being part of Runs 150B and 181, Taringatura District. Declaring Land open for Sale within the Orepuki Gold Field.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fifty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district, not held under license or lease at the date of such Proclamation, or over which the license or lease has been cancelled, to be open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form, and on such date, as he may determine; and any lands so proclaimed may hereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown lands of the same class not within a mining district: And the Governor may from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby declare that the land specified in the Schedule hereto shall be open for sale, and that the twenty-fifth day of November next ensuing shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for sale.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of October, 1878.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eleventh section of "The Public

Reserves Act, 1877," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Otago, and known as the "Dunedin Botanical Gardens," and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement forty (40) acres two (2) roods and thirty-eight (38) poles, more or less, being part of the Town Belt of the City of Dunedin. Bounded towards the North-west by the Main North Road, from the Water of Leith to the Opoho Road, one thousand five hundred and thirty-five (1535) links; towards the North-east by the said Opoho Road, one thousand four hundred and ten (1410) links; towards the East by the other part of said Town Belt of the City of Dunedin, from the Opoho Road to the Northern Cemetery Road, three thousand four hundred links; towards the South-east by the said Cemetery Road, two hundred (200) links; towards the South by Sections numbered respectively 14 and 15, Block XXXVII., of the City of Dunedin, and a road line, three hundred and fifty (350) links, to the Water of Leith; and towards the West and South-west by the Water of Leith, four thousand one hundred and twenty-five (4125) links, to the starting point: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

Powers delegated to the Dunedin Botanical Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

NORMANBY, GOVERNOR.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of October, 1878.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted

that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such Order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the "Dunedin Botanical Domain Board:"—

His Worship the MAYOR of DUNEDIN (*ex officio*),

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock in the evening, at the office of the Chairman, or at such other place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Assent to Construction of Rakaia and Ashburton Forks Railway, and Area and Boundaries of Railway District.

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by sections eighteen and nineteen of "The District Railways Act, 1877" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that whenever the Governor shall approve of or object to any proposed railway, he shall, by notice gazetted, declare his assent to or disapproval of the construction of the railway, and such notice when so published shall be sufficient notice to the company of such approval or dissent, as the case may be; and that in and by any notice of approval the Governor shall declare the area and boundaries proposed to be a railway district for the purposes of the said Act, and such declaration shall be sufficient evidence of the constitution of such district for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas the Rakaia and Ashburton Forks Railway Company (Limited) propose to construct a railway under the said Act, and a majority of the whole body of ratepayers and owners of property in the proposed district, representing more than one-half of the value of the rateable property, have consented to the construction of the proposed railway.

And whereas the said Company have made application to me for my approval of the construction of the said proposed railway, and all things have been done and performed as required by the said Act to enable me to declare my assent to and approval of the construction thereof:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby notify and declare that I do hereby approve and assent to the construction of the said railway, and I further notify and declare that the area and boundaries of the district proposed to be a railway district for the purposes of the said railway and of the said Act shall be as follows:—

Area, one hundred and seventy-one thousand four hundred and fifty-seven acres, or thereabouts, bounded as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the south-eastern corner of Rural Section 6128, thence north-westerly along the south bank of the River Rakaia to the north-east corner of Rural Section 28847, thence westerly along the northern boundary of the last-mentioned rural section, thence in a straight line to the north-west corner of 28846, thence along the western boundary of the said last-mentioned rural section, thence southerly in a straight line to the south-western corner of H. P. R. on Run number 703, thence south-east along the western boundary of Rural Sections 28845 and 24440 and 30302 to the boundary dividing Runs 703 and 701, thence south-westerly along the said boundary of Runs 703 and 701 to the south-western corner of Run 703, thence in a straight line to the north-east corner of Rural Section 1542, thence along the northern boundary of the last-mentioned rural section, thence in a straight line to the north-eastern corner of P.
