A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that, whenever it shall become necessary that any land which the Governor or the Minister is, by or under the Acts therein mentioned, or any Act authorizing the construction of any railway by the Governor or Minister, authorized to purchase or take for such railway, or any portion thereof, on or over which a railway authorized by the said Acts, or any Act to be passed in pursuance thereof, has been or may hereafter be constructed, should be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, it shall be lawful for the Governor or the Minister to cause a map of all such lands as may have been taken or purchased under the said Acts or any Act authorizing the construction of any railway as aforesaid, or any portion of such railway, to be prepared. Such map shall fully and accurately set forth the pieces or parcels of land intended to be taken and permanently used, or which have been purchased or taken, or are required to be vested in Her Majesty for the purposes of any such railway, and shall be authenticated by the signature of the Minister, or by that of some person to be appointed by him for that purpose from time to time. And it is also enacted that the Minister shall cause the map to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of Deeds for the registration district within which the lands shall be situated, or if the lands set forth on any such map shall extend beyond the boundaries of any one district, then such map shall be prepared in so many parts as shall be requisite to delineate the lands within each such district, and the map or the parts thereof as aforesaid shall be deposited in the office of the Registrar of Deeds in each registration district where the lands shall be situated to which such map relates; but, for the purposes of the said Act, such map, although consisting of several parts, shall only be deemed to be one map: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that it shall

Amending Proclamation, Southland High Schools Reserves.

# (L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 89, made under the authority of "The Southland Boys' and Girls' High Schools Act, 1877," after reciting that by that Act it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Commissioners appointed under "The Education Reserves Act, 1877," or for two Commissioners appointed for that purpose by the Governor, to select, out of the reserves for education in the Education District of Southland, such reserves as would give an annual income at present of five hundred pounds; and that, on the Proclamation of the Governor that such reserves had been selected and set apart for the Southland Boys' and Girls' High Schools, the said reserves should absolutely vest in the Southland Boys' and Girls' High Schools Board incorporated by the said "South-land Boys' and Girls' High Schools Act, 1877;" and, after reciting that George Lumsden, Esquire, and Walter Henry Pearson, Esquire, were the two Commissioners appointed by the Governor for the purposes aforesaid, and that they had selected the reserves mentioned in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, the Governor did proclaim and declare that the reserves, the particulars whereof are described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, had been selected and set apart for the benefit of the Southland Boys' and Girls' High Schools: And whereas Section forty-nine, Block two, New River Hundred, and Section twenty-seven, Block seventy, Invercargill, are erroneously included in the Schedule to the said Proclamation, such sections never, in fact, having been selected by the Commissioners appointed, but the reserves specified in the Schedule hereto were and are the sections selected by the Com-missioners, and intended to be referred to in the said Proclamation and Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Southland Boys' and Girls' High Schools Act, 1877" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the reserves specified in the Schedule hereto have, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, been selected and set apart for the Southland Boys' and Girls' High Schools in the said Act particularly referred to, and that the Schedule to the said Proclamation shall be read as if, instead of the numerals "II." in the second column of the said Schedule, opposite the figures "49" in the first column, the numerals "XI." were inserted, and, instead of the figures "27" in the first column of the said Schedule, the figures "22" were inserted.

Alteration of Boundaries of Maraetai and Wairoa Highway Districts.

#### NORMANBY, Governor.

UNDER and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the seventh section of the Act of the Provincial Council of Auckland intituled "The

Highways Act, 1874," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I do hereby notify that, from and after the date hereof, the boundaries of the Maraetai Highway District shall be those set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and the boundaries of the Wairoa Highway District shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

#### MARAETAI HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, bounded towards the North by the Hauraki Gulf to the mouth of the Wairoa River; towards the South by Lot No. 58, Parish of Wairoa, the southern boundaries of Papepape and Kiripaki Blocks, the eastern and southern boundaries of Lot No. 46, Parish of Maraetai, and the southern boundary of Lot No. 34 of said parish, to Waikopo Creek; and on the West by the said creek and the Maungamaungaroa to the Hauraki Gulf: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Auckland.

# SECOND SCHEDULE.

## WAIROA HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, bounded towards the North by the Maraetai Highway District, hereinbefore described, to the mouth of the Wairoa River, thence across that river and by the Hauraki Gulf; towards the East by Waitawa Bolazakan and Kininghi Dia ha to the Waitawa, Pekarakara, and Kiripaki Blocks to the confiscation boundary line, thence by said line to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of Lot No. 25, thence by the south-eastern boundary of that Lot and Lot No. 24 of the Parish of Otau to the Waimoko River, thence by that river to the road which forms the south-eastern boundary of Lot No. 30 of said parish, thence by the said road to the Wairoa River aforesaid, thence by said river to a point opposite to the northern boundary of Lot No. 112, Parish of Hunua, and across the river in a straight line to the said northern boundary; thence following the said boundary, and the north-western boundaries of Lots Nos. 174, 173, 133, and 136 of the Parish of Hunua aforesaid; thence by the south-western boundaries of Lots Nos. 135, 78, and 22 of said parish to Hewlin's line; thence by Hewlin's line to the north-eastern angle of Lot No. 31 of said parish, thence following the north-eastern and southeastern boundaries of said Lot No. 31, and the south-eastern boundaries of Lots Nos. 29, 28, and 27 of said parish, and part of the eastern and southern boundaries of Lot No. 3, Parish of Opaheke, to the Wairoa and Papakura Road; thence by the middle of that road to the Great South Road; towards the West by the middle of the Great South Road, from the Wairoa and Papakura Road to a point on it being the production of the road between Lots Nos. 26 and 33, Parish of Papakura; and towards the North-west by a straight line from the point last described to the road between Lots Nos. 26 and 33 aforesaid, and thence by the middle of that road as far eastward as Lot No. 29, Parish of Papakura; thence by the south-eastern boundary of Lot No. 29, the southern and south-eastern boundaries of Lot No. 39, and the south-eastern boundary of Lot No. 58, all of the Parish of Papakura; thence by the dividing line of the Parishes of Papakura and Wairoa aforesaid, and by the north-western boundary of the last-named parish to the Maraetai Highway District: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Auckland.

[CIRCULAR.] Downing Street, 24th August, 1878. Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, the enclosed notice respecting a prize of £100 for an essay on hydrophobia, its nature, prevention, and treatment, offered by Mr. V. F. Benett Stanford, M.P., and to be awarded by the Royal College of Physicians, London.

Prize of One Hundred Pounds for an Essay on Hydrophobia: its Nature, Prevention, and Treatment. Offered by V. F. Benett Stanford, Esq., M.P., to be awarded by the Royal College of Physicians of London.

Conditions under which the above prize is to be

competed for :-

1. The essay must be in English, or accompanied

by an English translation.

2. The essay must be delivered to the College on

or before 1st January, 1880.
3. Each essay to be accompanied by a sealed envelope, containing the name and address of the author and hearing a motto on the outside. The author, and bearing a motto on the outside. same motto to be inscribed on the essay.

4. The essay may be the joint production of two or

more authors.

5. The essay, if not published by the author within a year, to become the property of the College.6. The prize not to be awarded unless an essay of

sufficient merit be presented.

The questions which are thought by the College

specially to require investigation are—

a. The origin and history of outbreaks of rabies, particularly in the United Kingdom and its depen-

b. The best mode of prevention of rabies.

c. The characteristics of rabies during life, and the anatomical and chemical changes which are associated with the disease in its successive stages, particularly in its commencement.

d. The origin of hydrophobia in man.

e. The chemical and anatomical morbid changes observed in the subjects of the disease, with special reference to those having their seat in the organs of the nervous system, and in the salivary glands.

f. The symptoms of the disease, particularly of its early stage, as illustrated in well-observed cases.
g. The diagnosis of the disease in doubtful cases,

from conditions more or less resembling it.

h. The alleged prolonged latency of the malady. i. The efficacy of the various remedies and modes of preventing the disease which have been proposed, and what plan of treatment, whether prophylactic or curative, it would be most desirable to recommend for future trial.

#### Sir J. D. Hooker to Colonial Office.

Royal Gardens, Kew, 24th July, 1878. Sin,-It is with peculiar pleasure that I call your attention to the publication, during the present year, of the seventh and concluding volume of the "Flora Australiensis.'

I believe that this work occupies a unique place in botanical literature. I am not aware of any other which, treating of the vegetation of so large a portion of the earth's surface, has been so successfully brought

to a conclusion.

For the last sixteen years it has engaged the un-remitting attention of its author, George Bentham, Esq., F.R.S., late President of the Linnean Society of London, who has carried on the studies necessary for its elaboration in the library and herbarium of the Royal Gardens, so largely enriched by his own munificent gifts.

The utility of the work, in describing in a uniform manner and in easily intelligible language the plants of a country so rich in vegetable products, cannot be over-estimated; and it is a matter of daily experience that without such a work these plants could not be accurately discriminated, and could not therefore be

turned to useful account with any certainty.

In a scientific point of view the "Flora Australiensis" is of inestimable value. It records the nature of the great bulk of the flora, with all the knowledge and skill of one of the greatest living systematists, and this while the natural conditions of the country can still be easily distinguished from the inevitable changes which must follow agricultural occupation and the operations of a wide-spread commerce.

The accumulation in London, and principally at Kew, of the important botanical collections made by successive travellers and explorers, from the date of Captain Cook's voyage to the present day, have made the preparation of the "Flora Australiensis," in this country, a matter of necessity. The labours of these men are bound up with the history of the Australian Colonies, and the mere barren enumeration of Australian plants, apart from the names of their first discoverers, would be an ungrateful obliteration of much that Australians will always hold in respect. Nor must it be forgotten that many species obtained through the industry of these early collectors have never been gathered since.

To no one was the force of these facts more apparent than to Baron von Mueller, the distinguished Government Botanist of Victoria. Not merely did he therefore waive his own, in many respects pre-eminent, claims to the authorship of the "Flora Australiensis," but, with singular generosity, he transmitted to this country his immense Australian herbarium, the examination of which was indispensable to the proper elaboration of the work. He, furthermore, allowed duplicate specimens to be taken from his collections for preservation at Kew as the authentic types upon which the descriptions published in the "Flora" had

been based. I trust that the completion of this the most im-

portant of the series of colonial floras, projected by my late father, will be recognized as evidence of the value of Baron von Mueller's services, and of the botanical establishments of Melbourne and Kew, in

furthering the development of the inexhaustibe vegetable resources of our colonial empire.
