Taking of Land for Dunedin Corporation Water Supply.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and seventynine of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876"
(herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted
that the Council of a borough constituted under
the said Act may take any land within the borough
for any of the purposes of the said Act, in the manner
provided by the Second Part of "The Public Works
Act, 1876:" And by the two hundred and fortyfourth section of the said Act it is enacted that the
Council may construct waterworks for the supply of
pure water for the use of the inhabitants of the
borough, or of the shipping in any harbour
adjoining, and may do all things necessary thereto,
and therein especially may purchase or take, under
the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876,"
land within or beyond the borough, and the waters
of any stream within or beyond the borough: And
by the two hundred and forty-fifth section of the
said Act it is enacted, that any land or water so
taken shall be taken under the provisions of "The
Public Works Act, 1876:"

And whereas by section seven of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Council of every borough may purchase or take, under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," any lands outside of as well as within the borough for any purpose connected with the drainage of the borough, the maintenance and repair of the roads, streets, and public places thereof, or the public health, protection, and safety of its inhabitants, or for any other purpose for which the Council is authorized to take land within the borough: And whereas the Council of the City of Dunedin propose to construct the following works, viz.: A water-race or aqueduct for obtaining a supply of water for the inhabitants of the City of Dunedin and its suburbs, from the river called the Silver Stream and its tributaries, and other smaller streams flowing through portions of the lands which the said

race or aqueduct would intersect, and for such purpose require to take the land and the waters of the several streams specified in the Schedule hereto: And whereas the Council aforesaid has laid before me the memorial and map required by the twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876:"

And whereas it appears to me that all things required by the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," "The Municipal Corporations Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," and "The Public Works Act, 1876," to be done and performed to authorize the taking of such land and the waters of the said streams have been done and performed:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by the said Acts, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, and the waters of the several streams specified in the said Schedule, are hereby taken for the purpose of such works as aforesaid; and that, from and after the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the land described in the Schedule, hereto, and the waters of the several streams therein specified, shall become vested in fee-simple in the Corporation of the City of Dunedin, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interest of what kind soever, for the purpose of such works as aforesaid.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Coun-

cil; Knight Grand Cross of the Most | Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventyeight.

SCHEDULE.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the eighth section of "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," it is enacted

that the Superintendent of Canterbury, with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, may, by Proclamation under his hand, from time to time delegate all or any of the powers thereby conferred upon him acting as aforesaid to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations, conditions, and limitations as may be specified in such Proclamation, and every such delegation may from time to time in like manner alter or revoke: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventysix, published in the Canterbury Provincial Gazette, Volume XXIII., No. XVII., page 109, the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, with the advice of his Executive Council, delegated unto certain persons therein named, and called The Canterbury Public Domains Board," all the powers conferred by the hereinbefore recited Act: And whereas by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," the powers, duties, and functions vested in the Superintendent and his Executive Council under the said eighth section are now vested in the Governor: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Proclamation, so far as regards the delegation to the persons therein mentioned, of the powers thereby delegated :

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," do hereby alter the said Proclamation so far as regards the delegation to the persons therein mentioned of the powers conferred by the said "Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," and I do hereby delegate, in respect of the lands contained in the Schedule to "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," all the powers conferred by the said Act to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as "The Canterbury Public Domains Board," viz.,—

subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained:—
1. None of the powers delegated shall be exercised in respect of the ground occupied by the building known as the Canterbury Museum, or by any building pertaining thereto which has been or may hereafter be erected in connection therewith by the authority of the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury or Governor, or to such enclosures in connection therewith as may be approved by the Board and the Governor.

2. The Trustees of the said Museum, and their officers and servants, shall at all times have the right of ingress and egress to and from the said Museum at such times as shall be determined by the said Trustees.

3. The Board shall meet at such times and places as shall be from time to time appointed by the Chairman, or when it shall be convened by him, and the business shall be conducted under such regulations as shall be determined on by the Board.

4. The Board shall keep proper minutes and records of its proceedings, and full accounts of its receipts and expenditure; and a yearly statement of the same, together with a general report of its proceedings, shall be forwarded to the Governor once in every

year.
5. This delegation of powers to the Board shall not in any way affect any lease or contract now in force between the Superintendent and any person or persons in respect of any portion of the lands named in

the Schedule to "The Canterbury Public Domains | specified in the Schedule hereto are opened to free nor any agreement between the said Superintendent and any person or persons in respect of the dedication of any portion of the said lands to any purpose of public recreation or amusement.

This alteration shall not destroy or affect the validity of instruments executed or acts done during the subsistence of delegation made by the herein-before recited Proclamation of the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

Declaring Lands open for Free Selection, Taranaki.

NORMANBY, Governor. (L.S.) A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fourth section of "The Crown Lands Sale Act, 1877," it is enacted that, from and after the coming into operation of that Act, and until further provision is made for the classification of Crown lands by the General Assembly, all Crown lands shall be sold in accordance with the law in force in the land district where such lands are situated, but not in any case at a less price than two pounds per acre, if by free selection; and in the event of any land having to be sold at auction after application to purchase, then the upset price at which such land shall be put up to auction shall be at such price per acre as the Waste Lands Board may determine, not being less than the price at which the land was open for application: Provided that, after lands have been put up to auction at a price of not less than one pound per acre, the said land may, by Proclamation by the Governor, be open to free selection at a price of not less than one pound per

BY-LAWS.

BY-LAWS made by the Waitaki Road Board, under the provisions of "The Highway Boards Empowering Act, 1871," and "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance, 1874," for regulating the manner in which its meetings shall be called and held, and generally for regulating the conduct of its business and proceedings.

-General Conduct of Business.

1. The first business at any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

2. After the minutes have been submitted for confirmation, the Chairman or Clerk shall lay on the table all correspondence and statements, and submit all other general information that may have been received since the previous meeting of the Board.
3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid,

the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect :-

(1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the

authority of the Board.
(2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

(3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

(4.) Presentation of reports of committees.

(5.) Ordinary business.

(6.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

(7.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations. (8.) Other motions of which previous notice has

been given. (9.) Notices of motion.

(10.) Payments. And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any member of the Board, the members of the Board voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman.

II.—Motions.

5. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Clerk at the close of the meeting of the Board; or, if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then fourteen clear days prior to the next meeting of the Board, and the Clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

6. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. No motion, except that for receiving the same,

shall, unless under some urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of the Board after that at which it has been presented.

- 8. Except by leave of the Board, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Clerk in the notice of motion book; and, if not so moved, or postponed, shall be struck out.
- 9. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member of the Board who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

III.—Order, &c., of Debate.

10. Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

11. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Board thereon.

12. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Board.

13. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Board unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of a by-law of the Board by directing the Chairman's

attention to the infraction thereof. 14. A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

15. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

16. No member shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

17. The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

18. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly dis-

19. Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively, to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw his expression, and to make satisfactory apology to the Board.

20. A member called to order shall sit down, unless

permitted to explain.

21. Any member using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw or apologize for such conduct, and refus-

ing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

22. Any person (not being a member) who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Board, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the Chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

23. Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Board applying

to the question under discussion.
24. The Board shall vote by show of hands.

25. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Board, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

26. At every meeting of the Board all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, if required by the Chairman, and delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

27. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous

amendment is disposed of.

28. If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment, as amended, shall become itself the question or amendment, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question or amendment coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

29. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the firstmentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Board for dis-

cussion at a time.

30. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply immediately, after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order. 31. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion

for adjournment of the Board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

32. Any member may protest against any resolu-tion of the Board, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Board, by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office, and signed by such member; but such protest may be expunged, if declared by a majority of the Board to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Board.

IV.—Lapsed Questions.

33. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it

was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

34. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

V.—Committees.

35. Minutes of all proceedings of Committees, as well of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the Committee's minute book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Board; and the Clerk, when

practicable, shall attend all meetings of Committee.

36. The Clerk shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the Board, or on the written order of the Chairman of the Committee, or of any two members of the Committee.

37. The Board may, on motion agreed to, resolve

itself into Committee of the whole.

38. In Committee of the whole the rules concerning the seconding of motions and the restriction of speaking shall not apply.

G. GREY.

RENNELS AND BELLONA ISLANDS. Dunedin, 3rd October, 1878.

SIR,—I have the honor to report to you an error in the position of some islands I passed on my passage from Foochow to this port in the brig "Rio Loge." These islands, named Rennels and Bellona, are marked as "doubtful" islands on the latest published charts, and are situated directly in the track between China and Australia. The position assigned to Rennels Island is N.W. point 11° 12′ south latitude, and 160° 19' east longitude, whereas the correct position should be for the N.W. point 11° 30' south latitude, and 160° 8' east longitude, making an error of 18' in latitude and 11' in longitude. tude. My observations were taken within two or three miles of the NW. point, and the error of my chronometer found only the day before at Christoval, so that I can rely upon the position. The S.E. point I place in 11° 51′ south and 160° 42′ east, approximate. Rennels Island and Bellona bear from each other N.W. by W. and S.E. by E., not more than fifteen miles distant.

I cannot find in any directory a description of Rennels Island, and I believe there is none published, I therefore enclose the following remarks from my own observation:

Rennels Island is about 38 miles long and 8 wide at the N.W., and lies in a N.W. and S.E. direction, is about 500 to 600 feet high, of uniform height

edge. Along the whole N.E. side is a fringing reef about two cables from the shore. The N.W. point is a gradually-sloping point, with a hummock two hundred or three hundred yards from the beach, and has a reef extending about four or five cables from the shore, with a strong tide rippling round the point; the coast trends about three miles to the S.W., and thence to south-eastward. Bellona Island appears to be about the same height as Rennels Island, and also thickly wooded.
