WHEREAS by the fifth section of "The Armed Constabulary Act Amendment Act, 1869," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time make and alter Regulations respecting the clothing, equipment, and pay of the Armed Constabulary; and all such Regulations shall have the same force as though they formed a part of the now reciting Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke certain of the existing Regulations, bearing date the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and to make others in lieu of those so revoked:
