(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me for this purpose by "The Ashburton High School Act, 1878," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint that the first meeting of the Ashburton High School Board shall be held in the Town Hall, at Ashburton, on Wednesday, the twenty-ninth day of January instant, at twelve o'clock noon.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twentieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of January, 1879.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Land-Tax Act, 1878," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council shall divide the colony into districts for the purposes of the said Act, and shall fix a day when the same shall come into operation and have the force of law: And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, the colony was, for the purposes of the said Act, divided into the Land-Tax Districts of Auckland, Hawke's Bay, Wellington, Nelson, Canterbury, and Otago, the boundaries and contents of which were set forth in the said Order in Council: And whereas by "The Land-Tax Act, 1878," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may alter or rearrange the boundaries of any district as occasion shall require:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby order and declare—

That, in addition to the contents of the Land-Tax District of Auckland, as set forth in the said Order in Council, the said district shall comprise and include all islands nearest thereto which were not so included by the said Order in Council

District of Hawke's Bay, as set forth in the said

That, in addition to the contents of the Land-Tax District of Nelson, as set forth in the said Order in Council, the said district shall comprise and include all islands nearest thereto which were not so included

by the said Order in Council.

That, in addition to the contents of the Land-Tax District of Canterbury as set forth in the said Order in Council, the said district shall comprise and include all islands nearest thereto which were not so included by the said Order in Council.

That, in addition to the contents of the Land-Tax District of Otago as set forth in the said Order in Council, the said district shall comprise and include all islands nearest thereto which were not so included by the said Order in

And with the like advice and consent I do hereby order and declare that this Order in Council shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of January instant.

Regulations for Electing Members of Harbour Boards.

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of January, 1879.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the thirty-fifth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," that all elections of members of Harbour Boards, other than those to be made by ratepayers, shall be held in such manner as may be prescribed by the special Act, and, if no provision be made in that behalf, then in such manner as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct by regulations to be made for that purpose:

And whereas it is expedient to make regulations roviding for the manner of electing members of Harbour Boards where no provision has been made as to the manner of holding such elections

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Marquis of Normanby, Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth hereby order and direct that the following regulations shall take effect for the election of members of Harbour Boards in the cases hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say,

REGULATIONS.

1. Whenever it is necessary to elect a member of a Harbour Board constituted under "The Harbours Act, 1878," by a local governing body, or by any other body or association having power to do so, such election shall be held at a meeting of the local governing body, or other body or association (hereinafter called the "electing body"), of which notice shall have been given in the same manner as notices of the meetings of such electing body are usually given, and in such notice the object of the meeting shall be stated. For the purposes of these regulations the expression "local governing body" shall have the like meaning as assigned to such expression in "The Harbours Act, 1878."

2. On the day fixed by law to hold the election, and at the meeting of the electing body, the names of the candidates being stated by the Chairman, each candidate shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another member of the electing body on the day fixed by law to hold the election. The Chairman at fixed by law to hold the election. The Chairman at any such meeting of the electing body may be any person who would be entitled or might be appointed to act as Chairman at the ordinary meetings of such

3. After the candidates for election have been proposed and seconded, the Chairman of the meeting shall call for votes by a show of hands for each can-

didate in order of proposal.

4. The candidates getting the largest number of

votes shall be elected.

5. In the case of there being an equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a casting vote. Such Chairman shall have a casting vote but not a deliberative vote.

6. Where members of a Harbour Board are required to be elected by the payers of dues and the owners of ships, a meeting of the said electors shall be held at the Harbour Board Office on the day fixed by law at a time to be fixed, and which shall be publicly notified under the hand of the Chairman of the Harbour Board, and at such meeting the members shall be elected by show of hands in like manner as hereinbefore provided for the election of members of Harbour Boards by local governing bodies.

If there be any vacancy in the office of Chairman, then such meeting may be called by the Secretary or Clerk of the Board, or other officer discharging the

duties of such Secretary.
7. Any such meeting shall have power to elect its own Chairman, and he shall have a casting but not a deliberative vote, and shall decide all questions of qualification as to vote by causing the claimant then and there to produce receipts in his favour for the dues required to be paid by him to qualify him to be an elector, or a certificate of ownership or other suf-ficient document from the Registrar of Shipping or

other proper officer, as the case may require.
8. The decision of the Chairman of any meeting, whether as to any election of a member of the Board or as to the proof of any qualification as aforesaid, shall be final and conclusive on all parties.

Thames County Council to return two Members for Thames Harbour Board, in lieu of Waiotahi and Kauwaeranga Road Boards.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the forty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," that, if at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that a local governing body or association electing or appointing a member or members of a Harbour Board has ceased to exist, or has been incorporated with or united to some other local governing body or association, the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare what other local governing body or association shall return a member in lieu of the body or association so ceasing to exist, or being incorporated or united as aforesaid:

And whereas it is enacted by the said recited Act that one member of the Thames Harbour Board shall be elected by the Waiotahi Road Board, and one by

the Kauwaeranga Road Board:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor that the said Road Boards have been, under the authority of the thirty-seventh section of "The Counties Act, 1876," dissolved, and the districts of such Boards merged in the County of Thames

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in pursuance of the above recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the County Council of the Thames County shall henceforth return two members for the Thames Harbour Board in lieu of the said Waiotahi and Kauwaeranga Road Boards, which have been merged in the Thames County aforesaid.

Australian International Exhibition.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Wellington, 20th January, 1879.

REFERRING to the notice published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 36, of the 26th of April, 1878, relative to the Australian International Exhibition to be held in Sydney, New South Wales, in August, 1879, it is hereby further notified that the Government of New Zealand will be prepared to receive and to forward to Sydney any articles for exhibition which may be prepared by persons residuct in this calculation. dent in this colony.

A Royal Commission will be appointed immediately, who will prepare and publish regulations under which they will receive exhibits for transmission.

As articles for exhibition should be shipped from Wellington not later than June next, persons wishing to exhibit are invited to communicate with Dr. Hector, the Chairman of the Royal Commission, without delay.

All expenses of transmitting and exhibiting approved articles will be defrayed by the Government; but, as experience has proved that in exhibitions of this kind the best effect is produced by a few welldisplayed objects of considerable size, and as the space allowed to the colony for exhibition will be limited, a careful selection will have to be made, so that the representation may be complete.

The Collectors of Customs at the various ports have been instructed to receive exhibits, and to forward them to the Chairman of the Exhibition Commission at Wellington, by whom they will be collected and transmitted to Sydney; but no exhibits can be received later than the 30th June, 1879.

After the Exhibition is closed, the exhibits will be either returned to exhibitors free of expense, or sold or otherwise disposed of in Sydney, at the desire of the exhibitors; but the Government undertakes no responsibility for loss or damage, either in transit or during exhibition, or in regard to the price to be realized if sold, nor will they guarantee the safe remittance of the money.

Sir,—I have the honor to notify to you, pursuant to section 145 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," that, at a poll taken on Friday, January 10, 1879, a resolution in favour of the following proposal was duly carried:—

CORPORATION OF INVERCARGILL.

Public notice is hereby given that the Municipal Council have resolved to undertake the construction of waterworks for supplying the Town of Invercargill with water from the Dunsdale Creek by gravitation. For this purpose it is proposed to borrow the sum of £100,000 by means of debentures, bearing interest at six per cent. per annum.

The security proposed to be pledged to be the water rates, levied as follows:—

In respect of the ordinary supply,—
 Upon all lands and buildings to which water is
 supplied whose rateable value on the valuation
 roll—

Does not exceed twelve pounds ten shillings, a rate not exceeding ten shillings per annum:

Exceeds twelve pounds ten shillings, but does not exceed one hundred pounds, a rate not exceeding seven per cent. on such value:

Exceeds one hundred pounds, but does not exceed two hundred pounds, a rate not exceeding six per cent. on such value:

Exceeds two hundred pounds, but does not exceed three hundred pounds, a rate not exceeding five per cent. on such value:

Exceeds three hundred pounds, a rate not exceeding four per cent. on such value.

Upon all lands and buildings to which water can be but is not supplied, situate within one hundred yards from any part of the waterworks, a rate not exceeding one-half of the rates above mentioned.

Upon all buildings used as stores or warehouses, or for any purposes other than as dwelling-houses, a rate of two and a half per cent. on the rateable value.

2. In respect of the extraordinary supply,—Such rates as may be fixed by any by-law in that behalf, or as may be agreed on, subject to any such by-law, with any person receiving such supply.

- 3. In respect of any meter provided by the Council for measuring the quantity of water supplied, such annual charges as may be fixed by any by-law in that behalf.
- 4. Provided that if the revenue therefrom is insufficient to meet interest and charges, a special rate of sufficient amount to cover the deficiency shall be levied on the rateable property of the town.

There was in December a considerable increase in the number of deaths as compared with November, the deaths having risen in number from 89 in November to 132 in December. The deaths in these boroughs (with the exception of Invercargill) amounted to 106 in November of last year.

Zymotic diseases caused 33 deaths in December, against 10 in November. This large increase is attributable to the increased number of deaths from Diarrhæa and Typhoid Fever. The 18 cases of death from Diarrhæa were all of infants, of which 5 occurred in each of the Boroughs of Auckland, Thames, and Wellington, and 3 in Christchurch; but, large as the increase on the deaths from this cause is as compared with the previous month, it is not in excess of the number in December, 1877. Of the 6 deaths from Typhoid Fever, 2 occurred at Auckland, 3 at Christchurch, and 1 in Dunedin.

Constitutional diseases caused an increased number of 7 deaths last month as compared with November. Of these, Pthisis caused 13 deaths in December, against 9 in November.

Local diseases.—The number of deaths in this class was also considerably increased, the numbers having been 38 in November, and 54 in December. There was an increase of 8 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, 4 from diseases of the respiratory organs, and 3 from diseases of the digestive organs.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the two months at each town from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
