Kowai Recreation-ground brought under " The Public Domains Act, 1860.'

NORMANBY, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL. At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of January, 1879.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOE IN COUNCIL. BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the element D me by the eleventh section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Canter-bury, and known as the "Kowai Recreation-ground," and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

### SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Canterbury, being Reserve No. 2066 (in red), two hundred and thirteen (213) acres, more or less, situate in the Ashley District (Kowai Road District). Bounded on the South-west by Section 19023; on the Southeast by the road forming south-east boundary of that Section; on the North-east by Reserve No. 1675 (in red); on the North by the road forming the

north-west by I.P.Rs. G and H, on run formerly No. 8., Class III., now No. 299, Class II. FORSTER GORING,

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of January, 1879.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Re-serves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers north boundary of Section No. 20597; and on the under or conferred by subsections five and ten o 124

section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the "Kowai Domain Board :"—

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,-

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each month, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, at the office of the Chairman, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting. 3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum.

Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time. 4. The members of the Board shall at their first

4. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at any annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in February in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of the Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Land temporarily reserved in the Provincial District of Canterbury.

### NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Provincial District of Canterbury described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purpose in the said Schedule specified.

### SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Canterbury,

containing by admeasurement 178 acres, more or less, being Section numbered 2382 (in red). Bounded towards the North-east by Section numbered 34301 for a distance of 31 chains; towards the South-east by Section numbered 33428 and a line in continuation of its north-western boundary for a distance of 50 chains; towards the North-west by a road line for a distance of 25 chains, and also by Section numbered 26448 for a distance of 9 chains; towards the South-west by Section numbered 26448 for a distance of 40 chains, and also by a road line for a distance of 27 chains: as the same is delineated on the official map deposited in the Provincial District Survey Office, Christchurch; save and excepting portion of I.P.R. B. on Run No. 64, Class 3, situate within the above-described section. For the improvement and protection of the Rakaia River.

All that area in the Provincial District of Canterbury, containing by admeasurement 342 acres, more or less, being Section numbered 2381 (in red). Bounded towards the North-east by Section 34038 and a line in continuation of its south-western boundary, and by Section numbered 32283 and a line in continuation of its north-eastern boundary, for a distance altogether of 165 chains; towards the Southeast by road lines for a distance of 35 chains, and also by Section numbered 32283 for a distance of 16 chains; towards the North-west by a road line for a distance of 23 chains; and towards the Southwest by a road line for a distance of 155 chains : as the same is delineated on the official map deposited in the Provincial District Survey Office, Christchurch. EXHIBITION OF FLASHING WHITE LIGHT ON PUY-SEGUR POINT, SOUTH-WESTERN EXTREMITY OF MIDDLE ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

### Marine Department,

Wellington, 24th January, 1879.

WITH reference to the preliminary notice issued by this department, dated the 22nd day of October, 1877, it is hereby notified that, on and after Saturday, the 1st day of March next, a Light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse which has been erected on Puysegur Point, the position and characteristics of which are as follow :--

The Puysegur Point Lighthouse is situated on the point of that name, at the south-western extremity of the Middle Island, New Zealand. The Tower is 40 feet in height, built of timber and

The Tower is 40 feet in height, built of timber and painted white. The Light will be a FIRST ORDER FLASHING WHITE LIGHT, visible all round as far as the land will allow, and showing a flash every TEN SECONDS.

The Light is elevated 180 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of about  $19\frac{3}{10}$  nautic miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.
