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Regulations for Elections of Boards of River Conservators within the Provincial District of Wellington.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of every power and authority vested in me in that behalf under "The Wellington Rivers Act, 1876," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the regulations contained in the Schedule hereto shall be the regulations for the conduct of all first and subsequent general elections of members of Boards of Conservators for any district heretofore or hereafter established under the first above mentioned Act, and of all elections for supplying vacancies that may occur in any such Boards.

SCHEDULE.

1. Within sixty days after the constitution of a new district under "The Wellington Rivers Act, 1876," and forthwith after the term of office of any member of a Board of Conservators has expired, or a vacancy in any such Board has been notified to him, the Governor shall, by public notification posted in some conspicuous place in the district, and pub-

lished twice at least in some newspaper having general circulation therein, summon a general meeting of the ratepayers of the district, to be held at such convenient time and place within the district as shall be stated in such notice, and in such notice the Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the meeting, who shall be the Presiding Officer to conduct the election.

2. At such meeting the ratepayers aforesaid shall elect from amongst the whole body of the ratepayers of the district (as such ratepayers are hereinafter defined) a sufficient number of persons to be the Board of the district, or to supply the vacancies that have occurred, as may be the case.

Every candidate must be qualified as provided in section eight of the said Act.

3. Every candidate shall be proposed by a ratepayer and seconded by another, and if at such meeting there shall be no more candidates proposed than the number of members of the Board to be elected, the Presiding Officer shall declare such candidate or candidates to be duly elected.

4. Every ratepayer may vote for any number of candidates, not exceeding the number of persons to be elected.

5. In the event of there being more candidates than the number of members to be elected, the Presiding Officer shall call for a show of hands separately in favour of each candidate; and after such show of hands shall declare the person or persons upon whom the election has fallen, unless a poll be forthwith demanded by some one of the candidates.

6. If a poll be demanded the Presiding Officer

time, being not less than three nor more than seven days after the day of the meeting, at which the poll shall be taken; and at such time and place the poll shall be taken accordingly in manner following:

- (1.) The poll shall commence at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and continue till four o'clock in the afternoon.
- (2.) The Presiding Officer, with such assistants as he shall think necessary, shall attend at the appointed place, furnished with poll-books and pens and ink. (3.) Every person desirous and qualified to vote
- at such election shall appear in person at the appointed time and place, and shall state to the Presiding Officer or one of his assistants the name of the candidate for whom he desires to vote; and the said Presiding Officer or assistant shall enter the same in the poll-book, and cause the voter to sign his name or set his mark thereto.
- (4.) The Presiding Officer shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the close of the poll, ascertain the number of votes given for each candidate, and shall declare that candidate in whose favour the greatest number of votes shall appear to have been given to be duly elected.
- (5.) In case of equality of votes for two or more candidates, the member or members shall be chosen from such candidates by lot.

7. The decision of the Chairman of any meeting, either as to the persons elected or as to the right of any ratepayer to vote, shall be deemed final and conclusive on all parties.

8. For the purposes of these regulations the term "ratepayer" means any person who, at the time of any election held under the said Act and these regulations, would be entitled to vote at the election of any member of any County Council, Highway Board, Local Board, or Borough Council within any district defined under the said Act.

HEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of April, one thousand | perches each.

And whereas by the sixth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the colony to be a mining district under the now in part recited Act, to assign boundaries to such district, to enlarge, contract, or otherwise alter such boundaries, and to declare by what local name every such district shall be designated; and that, until the Governor shall otherwise order, every gold field duly proclaimed or constituted at the time of the com-mencement of the said "Mines Act, 1877," shall be and be deemed a mining district under that Act:

And whereas by the forty-fifth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," aforesaid, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time subsequent to the constitution or proclamation of a gold-mining district, by Proclamation, to withdraw therefrom any Crown lands which he may deem it necessary to withdraw : And whereas it is desirable and expedient to withdraw from the said gold-mining district the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Crown land described in the said Schedule hereto is hereby withdrawn from the said gold-mining district, and that such lands shall henceforth be dealt with in every respect as though they had never been comprised in any mining district.

Constituting a River District within the Provincial District of Olago.

(L.S.) NORMANBY, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by "The Hawke's Bay and Marlborough Rivers Act, 1868," as amended by "The Hawke's Bay and Marlborough Rivers Acts Amendment Act, 1872." (hereinafter called "the said Acts"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that, upon the petition of the owners and occupiers of not less than three-fourths of the annual value of the rateable property of any district therein defined, any part of the province intersected or bounded by any river or rivers from the overflow of which damage may be apprehended, the Superintendent shall, by Proclamation in the Provincial *Gazette*, declare that this Act shall come into operation within such part of the province, and shall, by such Proclamation, define the boundaries of the same and declare the same to be a district under this Act, and shall also fix the name by which such district shall be known:

And it is also further enacted that the Superintendent shall also in such Proclamation determine the number of Conservators who are to constitute the Board for each such district, but in no case shall the number be less than five nor more than seven:

the number be less than five nor more than seven: And whereas, by the operation of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," all the powers by the said Acts vested in the Superintendent are now vested in, and are to be exercised and performed by, the Governor:

And whereas a petition as aforesaid of the owners and occupiers of the district hereinafter mentioned has been presented to me, praying that the said Acts may be brought into operation within such district:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority in that behalf, do hereby declare and appoint that the said Acts shall come into operation within that part of the Provincial District of Otago described in the Schedule hereto, on and after the thirtieth day of January instant; and do also declare and appoint that the said part of the Provincial District of Otago shall be and the same is hereby constituted a district under the said Acts, to be called by the name of "The Henley River District," the boundaries whereof shall be as described in the Schedule hereto, and also that the number of Conservators of which the said Board shall consist shall be five.

Additional Regulations under "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867."

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS under the authority of "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), certain regulations were made for the purposes of the said Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventyseven, and such regulations are now in force:

And whereas by the said Act it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time as may become necessary, to make such regulations as to the Governor seems expedient, for imposing or prescribing any conditions and restrictions in respect to salmon or trout fishing: And whereas, for the purpose of protecting salmon and trout, it is expedient that additional regulations should be made as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore recited power and authority, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf under the said Act, do hereby make the following regulations, that is to say,—

1. If any person shall by any means take or catch any salmon or trout in any stream, river, or tidal water, he shall forthwith return such salmon or trout alive to the stream, river, or tidal water in or from which the same was caught or taken. Any person knowingly and wilfully committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to forfeit and pay such sum of money, by way of penalty, not exceeding one hundred pounds, as the Justices imposing such penalty shall think fit.

The expression "tidal waters" has the like meaning as given to such expression in certain regulations made under "The Fish Protection Act, 1877," and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eleventh of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. No person holding a license issued under the said last-mentioned regulations shall be deemed exempt from these or any other regulations in force under "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867."

3. These regulations shall be read as part of any existing regulations for the time being in force under the said Act, and, whenever any penalty shall be prescribed under any regulations in force under the said Act as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Justices imposing the same to order such part of the pre-scribed penalty to be paid as the Justices before whom the same shall be sought to be recovered shall think fit.

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EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES | FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I. Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the Superintendent Registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II. A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which he may have resided.

111. Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in clause 1 must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies-

- 1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.
- 2. To candidates who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to them-selves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates :-

- (a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enabled the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.
- (b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.
- (c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement that after due inquiry no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.
- (d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.-Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE AND JULY, 1879.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On the 17th June, 1879, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly quali-fied. Of these, will be selected for Presidency of Bengal, [for the Upper Provinces, for the Lower Provinces,] for ras, and for that of Bombay.*and for that of Madras, and Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st of April, 1879, evidence showing-

- (a) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (b) That his age will be above seventeen years on the first of June, 1879, and under nineteen years on the first of January, 1879.⁺ [N.B.-In the case of Natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the candidate may have resided.]
- (c) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.‡
- (d) That he is of good moral character ‡

He must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe.§

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be primá facie satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India; and if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

5. The merits of the persons examined will be es-timated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary, in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."*

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by
