*Defining the Middle Line of portion of the Railway
 from Auckland to Puniu.*

(L.S.) NORMANBY, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and twenty-second section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that every railway shall be made only under the authority of a special Act, which shall state as nearly as may be the line of the railway and the two termini thereof; and, by the one hundred and twenty-third section of the same Act, that the several railways specified in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed to have been made, and in so far as any of them are unfinished may be completed, under the provisions of the Act now under recital, and the said Act shall be deemed to be a special Act authorizing the construction of each of the said railways; and, by the one hundred and twenty-fourth section of the same Act, that when any railway is to be constructed under the provisions of any special Act the Governor shall issue a Proclamation defining the middle line of the railway or any part thereof, and may from time to time, by a Proclamation revoking or amending such former Proclamation, alter such line in any manner or to any extent which may be found necessary for the construction of such railway within the provisions of the said special Act; and, by the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of the same Act, that the Minister shall cause to be made and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court such maps and plans as may be necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such Proclamation: And whereas the railway from Auckland to Puniu is one of the railways specified in the said Fourth Schedule, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule

hereto, commencing at a point on the ground formerly known as Fort Britomart, and terminating at a point on the eastern side of Queen Street Wharf, Waitemata Harbour, Provincial District of Auckland, Colony of New Zealand. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6775, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable James Macandrew, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland, in the Provincial District of Auckland.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the ground formerly known as Fort Britomart, the said point being within the limits of deviation of a portion of the railway from Auckland to Mercer, as described in the Proclamation dated the eighth day of August, 1872, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, of the 12th of August, 1872, and proceeding thence in a generally westerly direction for 23½ chains, or thereabouts, to a point on the eastern side of the Queen Street Wharf, situate in the Waitemata Harbour, Provincial District of Auckland, Colony of New Zealand, in the manner delineated on the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6775, signed by the Honorable James Macandrew, Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland, in the Provincial District of Auckland; the total length being 23½ chains, or thereabouts.

and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Abolishing Pounds in Hutt County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Wellington intituled "The Wellington Impounding Act, 1874," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *Provincial Gazette*, to declare that any place shall be a pound within the meaning of and under the provisions of that Act, and in like manner to abolish any pound and establish any other in lieu thereof: And whereas by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now vested in the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said recited Acts, do hereby proclaim that from the date of this Proclamation all existing pounds within the Hutt County are hereby abolished.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Otago.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Monday, the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application.

Extension of Time for making Valuation, under "The Land-Tax Act, 1878."

ORDER IN COUNCIL,

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of February, 1879.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty of "The Land-Tax Act, 1878," it is, among other things, enacted that, on or before the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the Valuer or Valuers appointed for or acting in each district shall prepare, sign, and transmit to the Deputy Commissioner of such district a valuation list in the prescribed form, setting forth to the best of his skill and judgment the value of all lands in such district liable to the duty by the Act now in recital imposed, with the improvements thereon, and the value of such lands without such improvements; together with the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, and the nature, situation, and extent of the property:

And whereas by section sixty-three of the said in part recited Act it is also provided that, if any act or thing by the said Act required to be done within a fixed time is not done within the time appointed or required, the Governor in Council may appoint a further or other time for doing the same, although the time within which the same ought to have been done has elapsed or expired, and any act or thing done within the time prescribed by such Order in Council shall be as valid as if it had been done within the time fixed by or under the said Act:

And whereas the valuation lists required by the said in part recited Act to be transmitted on or before the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, have not been prepared, signed, and transmitted, and it is expedient to appoint a further time for doing the same:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by "The Land-Tax Act, 1878," do hereby order and appoint that, on or before the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the Valuer or Valuers appointed for or acting in each district shall prepare, sign, and transmit to the Deputy Commissioner of such district a valuation list, in the prescribed form, setting forth, to the best of his skill and judgment, the value of all lands in such district liable to the duty by "The Land-Tax Act, 1878," imposed with the improvements thereon, and the value of such lands without such improvements; together with the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, and the nature, situation, and extent of the property. Separate lists shall be made for each county and borough within the limits of a district.

And with the like advice and consent, and in further pursuance and exercise of the powers aforesaid, I do hereby order that this Order in Council shall be deemed to have come into operation from and after the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Mount Eden Recreation-ground brought under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this fourth day of February, 1879.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eleventh section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Auckland, and known as the "Mount Eden Recreation-ground," and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Auckland, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement sixty-three (63) acres, more or less, situated in the Parish of Waitemata, in the Waitemata, Rangitoto, Titirangi, and Otahuhu Survey Districts, and being Allotment number one A (1A) of Section number six (6) of the Suburbs of Auckland. Bounded toward the North by a road line, by lines and Allotment number one hundred and ten (110), two thousand three hundred and ninety-one (2391) links; towards the East by Allotment number one hundred and ten (110) aforesaid, the termination of a road line, Allotments number ninety-seven (97), ninety-eight (98), ninety-nine (99), one hundred (100), and the termination of another road line, two thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (2875) links; towards the South-east by Allotments number thirty-eight (38) and fifty-seven (57), one thousand eight hundred and forty-six (1846) links; towards the South-west by Allotment number ten (10), eight hundred and sixty (860) links; and towards the West by the termination of another road line, Allotments numbers fifty-two (52), fifty-three (53), fifty-four (54), fifty-five (55), and fifty-six (56), and a road line, four thousand four hundred and twelve (4412) links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

Powers delegated to the Mount Eden Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of February, 1879.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may

from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the "Mount Eden Domain Board:"—

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each month, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, at the office of the Chairman, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at any annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in March in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of the Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Fixing Intervals of Sittings at Auckland of District Court of Auckland.

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, by notification in the

New Zealand Gazette, to fix the times and places within the district at which every District Court shall be held:

And whereas by "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that, as to the times of holding such Courts, it shall be sufficient for the Governor, if he shall so think fit, to fix the interval only within which such Courts shall be held at each place, and it shall in such case be lawful for the Judge of such Court to fix the particular times and days for the holding of such Courts, and from time to time to alter the same, provided that such time and day shall fall within the interval so fixed by the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, fix that sessions of the District Court of Auckland shall be held in the Supreme Courthouse, Auckland, at intervals of not less than thirteen days nor more than twenty-one days between the first day of each sittings of such Court.

New Zealand University.—Regulation for Audit of Accounts.

NORMANBY, Governor.

WHEREAS by the twenty-eighth section of "The New Zealand University Act, 1874," it is enacted that the Senate of the said University shall, during the month of April in every year, report the proceedings of the University during the previous year to the Governor, and such report shall contain a full account of the income and expenditure of the said University, audited in such manner as the Governor may direct, and a copy of every such Report, and of all Statutes and Regulations of the University, shall be laid in each year before the General Assembly:

And whereas a warrant was issued on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, G.C.M.G., the then Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, prescribing the manner in which the said account of the said University should be audited; and it is expedient that the said warrant should be rescinded, and that the aforesaid account of the said University should henceforth be audited in a different manner:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby rescind the above-mentioned warrant of twenty-third April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, prescribing the manner in which the said account of the said University shall be audited, and in lieu thereof I do hereby direct that the said account of the said University shall be annually audited in the manner following, that is to say: The Governor shall from time to time appoint an Auditor for the purpose of auditing the said account of the said University.

The said Senate shall before the fifteenth day of February forward to the said Auditor a copy of the said account for the year ending the thirty-first day of December then preceding, and the Treasurer or other proper officer of the said University shall at such time within or before the month of February, and at

such place as shall be appointed by the said Auditor, attend before the said Auditor. The said Auditor shall, in the presence of the said Treasurer or other proper officer aforesaid, if he desire to be present, proceed to audit the said account of the year ending on the thirty-first day of December then preceding, and the Senate of the said University shall, by such Treasurer or other officer aforesaid, produce and lay before the Auditor the said account, accompanied with proper vouchers in support of the same, and all books, papers, and writings in the custody or power of the said Senate relating thereto, and if the said account be found correct the Auditor shall sign the same in token of the allowance thereof; but if the Auditor think there is just cause to disapprove of the said account, or any part of the said account, he may signify his disapproval thereof on the said account or otherwise in such manner as he may find most convenient.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Provincial District of Nelson described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purpose in the said Schedule specified.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Nelson, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement two (2) acres, more or less, situate at Hatter's Terrace, in the Mawheranui Survey District, and the boundaries of which are described as follows: Starting at a point one thousand and twenty-three (1023) links, on a line bearing two hundred and three (203) degrees and eight (8) minutes, from the north-west corner of Section 11, Block I., Hatter's Terrace Township; thence by a line bearing one hundred and one (101) degrees and forty-five (45) minutes, being the southernmost boundary of the said township, for a distance of four hundred (400) links; thence by a line bearing one hundred and ninety-one (191) degrees and forty-five (45) minutes for a distance of five hundred (500) links; thence by a line bearing two hundred and eighty-one (281) degrees and forty-five (45) minutes for a distance of four hundred (400) links; thence by a line bearing eleven (11) degrees and forty-five (45) minutes for a distance of five hundred (500) links, to the point from which these boundaries commence. WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:
