(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

In exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," and by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," and in exercise of every other power enabling me in that behalf, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke a certain Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of April instant, and issued under the authority of the said Acts; and do further hereby proclaim and declare that cock-pheasants shall be open to be hunted, shot, taken, or killed, within the Counties of Grey and Inangahua, between the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, both days inclusive, but only between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

Restrictions as to Weight to be carried on certain Vehicles in Manchester Highway District.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eighty-fourth section of an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Wellington, intituled "The Highways Act, 1874," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," and of all other powers enabling me in

that behalf, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the following clause to be in force in the Manchester Highway District, that is to say,—

"Whenever it shall appear to the satisfaction of any Highway Board that the weight carried on vehicles having the breadth of their wheels of less than five inches requires to be restricted, the Board may, by notice posted in the district, or by advertisement inserted at least twice in some newspaper circulating in the district, give notice that all such vehicles shall be subject to a penalty of not less than one shilling per hundred weight or fractional part of a hundredweight so carried above the weight of one ton five hundredweight on two wheels or two tons ten hundredweight on four wheels; and that such penalty shall be recoverable at the suit of the collector or other agent appointed for that purpose by the Board: Provided, for the carrying into operation of this clause, the Board shall be empowered to take such steps as to them shall appear necessary for ascertaining the weight of any load, and no liability or damage shall accrue for any necessary delay in ascertaining the said weight."

Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Railway from Riverton to Orepuki (Riverton Contract).

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and twentysecond section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that every railway shall be made only under the authority of a special Act, which shall state as nearly as may be the line of the railway and the two termini thereof; and, by the one hundred and twenty-third section of the same Act, that the several railways specified in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed to have been made, and in so far as any of them are unfinished may be completed, under the provisions of the Act now under recital, and the said Act shall be deemed to be a special Act authorizing the construction of each of the said railways; and, by the one hundred and twenty-fourth section of the same Act, that when any railway is to be constructed under the provisions of any special Act the Governor shall issue a Proclamation defining the middle line of the railway or any part thereof, and may from time to time, by a Proclamation revoking or amending such former Proclamation, alter such line in any manner or to any extent which may be found necessary for the construction of such railway within the provisions of the said special Act; and, by the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of the same Act, that the Minister shall cause to be made and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court such maps and plans as may be necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such Proclamation: And whereas the branch line of railway from the main line (Invercargill to Kingston) through Riverton to Orepuki is one of the railways specified in the said Fourth Schedule, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a portion of such railway-namely, from a point on Tauna Terrace near the Riverton Railway Station, to a point situate near Colac's Bay, all in the County of Wallace, Provincial District of Otago:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said portion of the said branch line railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6970, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable James Macandrew, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Invercargill, in the Provincial District of Otago.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point on Tauna Terrace, near the Riverton Railway Station, the said point being within the limits of deviation of a portion of the railway from Riverton to Orepuki, as described in the Proclamation dated the 10th September, 1874, and proceeding thence in a generally west-south-westerly direction for a distance of six miles or thereabouts, passing in, into, through or over the following lands, &c.: Township of Riverton, South Riverton. In Block I., Jacob's River Hundred, Sections Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17 (Pourakino) Sections 18 (township reserve), 19, 26, 27, 31, 31A, and 30; in Block XVIII., Jacob's River Hundred, Section No. 187 (Native reserve), unsurveyed lands; and terminating at a point situate near Colac's Bay; including all adjoining and intervening places, Crown lands, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; all within the County of Wallace, Provincial District of Otago, Colony of New Zealand; in the manner delineated on the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6970, signed by the Honor-

able James Macandrew, Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Invercargill, in the Provincial District of Otago, the total length being six miles or thereabouts.

Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Railway from Main Line to Upper Ashburton.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and twenty-second section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that every railway shall be made only under the authority of a special Act, which shall state as nearly as may be the line of the railway and the two termini thereof; and, by the one hundred and twenty-fourth section of the same Act, that when any railway is to be constructed under the provisions of any special Act the Governor shall issue a Proclamation defining the middle line of the railway or any part thereof, and may from time to time, by a Proclamation revoking or amending such former Proclamation, alter such line in any manner or to any extent which may be found necessary for the construction of such railway within the provisions of the said special Act; and, by the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of the same Act, that the Minister shall cause to be made and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court such maps and plans as may be necessary to explain the said line and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans shall be referred to in any such Proclamation: And whereas the railway from the main line (Amberley-Waitaki) to Upper Ashburton is one of the railways specified in "The Immigration and Public Works Appropriation Act, 1878," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act for the said railway, within the meaning of "The Public Works Act, 1876:" And whereas it has been determined to construct and maintain a portion of such railway, namely, from a point at Tinwald Station on the Amberley-Waitaki Railway, to a point in Rural Section 33010, in the Upper Ashburton Road District:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said portion of such railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6964, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable James Macandrew, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of

the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Christchurch, in the Provincial District of Canterbury.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point at Tinwald Station, on the Amberley-Waitaki Railway, the said point being within the limits of deviation of portion of the railway from Ashburton to Temuka, as described in the Proclamation dated the 20th February, 1874, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 13, of 26th February, 1874; and proceeding thence in a generally westerly and north-westerly direction for a distance of 11 miles 20 chains or thereabouts, passing in, into, through, or over the following lands: Township of Tinwald: Rural Section No. 6023; Reserves Nos. 2064, 2275, 350, and 2378; Rural Sections Nos. 20828, 20822, 17297, 6424; I.P.R. B'; 21609, 17294, 6425, 15042, 15043, 15037, 15038, 17295, 5254, 22252, 5253, and 28069; Reserve No. 1960; Rural Sections Nos. 28782, 5249, 20339, 5250, 33182, and 32742; Reserve No. 1961; Rural Sections Nos. 28494, 20338, 20840, 28515, and 28493; Reserve No. 2073; Rural Section No. 32999; Crown lands; I.P.R. E'; I.P.R. D' 32584, 28492, and I.P.R. Z'; and terminating at a point within Rural Section 33010; all within the Upper Ashburton Road District, Provincial District of Canterbury, Colony of New Zealand; including all adjoining and intervening places, lands, roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; in the manner delineated on the map and plan marked P.W.D. 6964, signed by the Honorable James Macandrew, Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Christchurch, in the Provincial District of Canterbury; the total length being 11 miles 20 chains or thereabouts.

Land withdrawn from the Deferred-payment System in Taranaki.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation;

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto was, with other lands, on the thirtieth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, proclaimed as open for occupation on deferred payments:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be withdrawn from the deferredpayment system, and should be offered for sale by public auction as ordinary rural land:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the

aforesaid recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the above-named Acts, do hereby revoke the Proclamation above referred to, so far as it relates to the sections therein mentioned and included in the Schedule hereto, and do proclaim and declare that the said sections are hereby withdrawn from the operation of the deferred-payment system, and that the same shall be disposed of as recommended by the Land Board aforesaid.

Land at Timaru taken for Railway Purposes.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

In exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the fourth section of "The Timaru Harbour Board Endowment Act, 1878," and by thu twenty-first, twenty-second, twenty-third, twentye fourth, and twenty-fifth sections of "The Public Works Act, 1876," I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for railway purposes, and that, from and after the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for the purposes of a railway.

SCHEDULE.

Lands taken for Roads in Sections 66, Block I., and 48, Block II., Oteranika Hundred, Southland County.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section twenty-one of "The Public Works Act, 1876" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that whenever lands are required to be taken for public works the Road Board, in the case of district works, shall cause a survey to be made and plans to be prepared showing generally the nature of the works proposed to be executed and the lands required to be taken for the same, together with the names of the owners and occupiers of such lands so far as they can be ascertained, and shall cause a copy of such plans to be deposited in some place in the road district in which such lands are: And by section twenty-two of the

said Act it is further enacted that the said Road Board shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and to be twice publicly notified, stating the place where such plans are open for inspection, with a general description of the works proposed to be executed and of the land required to be taken, and in such notice shall call upon all persons affected to set forth in writing any well-founded objections to the execution of such works or to the taking of such lands, and to send such writing within forty days from the first publication of such notice to the said Road Board: And by sections twenty-three and twenty-four of the said Act it is further enacted that the Road Board shall cause a copy of such notice and description to be served upon the said owners and occupiers so far as they can be ascertained; and that the said Road Board shall, upon receiving any objection, appoint a time and place within the colony within which the objector may appear before the said Road Board and support the objection by such evidence as the objector thinks fit: And by section twenty-five of the said Act it is enacted that, if within the said forty days no such objection is made, or if after due consideration of such objections the said Road Board is of opinion that it is expedient that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done thereby for which due compensation is not provided by the said Act, the land proposed to be taken shall be taken in the following manner, that is to say: The said Road Board shall lay before the Governor a memorial containing an accurate description of the land proposed to be taken, together with a map thereof, signed by the Surveyor-General or some certificated surveyor as evidence of the accuracy thereof; and the Governor in Council may thereupon, if he think fit, by Proclamation gazetted and publicly notified, declare that the said lands are taken for the use of a railway, road, or other public work, as the case may be; and from and after a date to be named in the said Proclamation the land therein specified shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for the public use named in the said Proclamation:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken under the said Act for a certain Government work, to wit, the construction of roads in Section sixty-six (66), Block one (I.), and Section forty-eight (48), Block two (II.), Oteramika Hundred, in the County of Southland:

And whereas the Oteramika Road Board has

And whereas the Oteramika Road Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the twenty-fifth section of the said Act:

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and fulfilled, and all things have happened and all times elapsed to lawfully authorize this Proclamation to be issued:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the lands so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for

ALL that area in the Southland Division of the Provincial District of Otago, comprising two (2) acres one (1) rood and sixteen (16) poles, more or less, being part of Section 66, Block I., Oteramika Hundred, and bounded as follows, viz: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of said section; thence due South, one hundred (100) links; thence due West, two thousand four hundred and eighty-eight (2488) links; thence by line running one hundred and eighty-six (186) links, bearing 57° 26'; thence by line running due East, two thousand three hunhundred and thirty-one (2331) links, to the starting point.

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken under the said Act for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road leading from Gebbies Bay to Governor's Bay, and portion of a road leading from Governor's Bay to Christchurch, in the Port Victoria Road District, County of Akaroa:

And whereas the Port Victoria Road Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the twenty-fifth section of the said Act:

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and fulfilled, and all things have happened and all times elapsed to lawfully authorize this Proclamation to be issued:

Additional Regulations under "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867."

WHEREAS under the authority of "The Salmon and Trout Act 1997" and Trout Act, 1867" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), certain regulations were made for the purposes of the said Act, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventyseven, and such regulations are now in force:

And whereas by the said Act it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time as may become necessary, to make such regulations as to the Governor seems expedient, for imposing or prescribing any conditions and restrictions in respect to salmon or trout fishing: And whereas, for the purpose of protecting salmon, it is expedient that additional regulations should be made as hereinafter provided: And whereas certain regulations were made for the purposes of the said Act, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirtieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine:

Any person knowingly and wilfully committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to forfeit and pay such sum of money, by way of penalty, not exceeding one hundred pounds, as the Justices imposing such penalty shall think fit.

The expression "tidal waters" has the like meaning as given to such expression in certain regulations made under "The Fish Protection Act, 1877," and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the eleventh of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. No person holding a license issued under the said last-mentioned regulations shall be deemed exempt from these or any other regulations in force under "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867."

3. These regulations shall be read as part of any existing regulations for the time being in force under the said Act, and, whenever any penalty shall be prescribed under any regulations in force under the said Act as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Justices imposing the same to order such part of the prescribed penalty to be paid as the Justices before whom the same shall be sought to be recovered shall think fit.

THE Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, considering the opinion expressed at the meeting of November 6, 1878, by the Commission appointed to decide upon the competitions instituted by Royal decree of February 14, 1877, in regard to the essays "On the genus Citrus" presented to compete for the prince of 2000.

Considering that the reasons still exist for which it was thought very beneficial to encourage a complete study of the physical nature and biology of the Hesperidæ, and for which the competition was in-

Accepting the vote passed by the above-mentioned Commission,

Decrees:

Article 1. A reward of 3,000 lire shall be assigned to the author of the most complete and best monographic essay on the structure, the vital functions, and the diseases of the acid fruits, or species and varieties of the genus Citrus and kindred genera: Provided that the said work, by a sufficient collection of original observations and experiments, should succeed in furnishing an important addition to the present knowledge concerning such subjects, and thereby supply a scientific criterion for the improvement of the cultivation of these acid fruits, and for the cure of their diseases.

Article 2. The date for sending in the works competing for the said prize is fixed for the end of May, . 1881.

Essays by Italians, or by foreigners written in Italian, are admissible to the competition; but if

written in another language they must be accompanied by an Italian translation.

The essays sent in for competition are to be sent to the Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Com-merce, with the superscription, "Competition for the Prizes for the best Essay on the genus Citrus," and they must be distinguished by a motto, to be given also on a sealed cover containing the name and

address of the author.

Article 3. The award upon the essays of the competitors will be issued by the Commission appointed in pursuance of the Royal decree of February 14, 1877, No. 3684, within ten months from the close of the competition.

The cover that bears the motto of the essay to which the reward is to be granted will be opened; the covers corresponding with the unsuccessful essays

will be burnt unopened.

The copyright of the essays sent in for competition is reserved to the respective authors; but the essay that obtains the reward may be printed, entire or in part, in the "Annals of Agriculture," published by the Ministry of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

POPULATION.—In the cases marked thus * the numbers given are for the 3rd March, 1878, according to the census then taken; in the other cases the numbers have been estimated for the 1st January, 1879.

It has been considered desirable this month to remodel the form of the monthly report, in order to comply with urgent requests, by giving information as to the number of births and deaths in some other boroughs than those mentioned in the former reports. This information has, therefore, been given in the case of all boroughs, except Sydenham, having a population of 3,000 and over; Hokitika being included, as it was mentioned in former reports. The information has not been obtainable for Sydenham on account of the want of local information as to the boundaries of that borough, and the impossibility therefore of ascertaining whether certain births and deaths occurred within or outside that borough. As a consequence of the altered form, the actual causes of death are only given for large boroughs having a population of over 10,000, and the separate causes can be shown for each of these boroughs, rendering this part of the report more valuable than when the causes for several boroughs were grouped together.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 120; females, 69. 91 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 48:14 per cent. of the whole number; 64 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—
The births were 269 in April, against 227 in March, an increase of 42.
The deaths in April were 128, against 132 in March, a decrease of 4.
There were 4 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards—viz., 1 male of 65 in Auckland; 1 male of 80 and 1 female of 79 in Wellington; and 1 male of 80 in Dunedin.

Zymotic diseases caused 51 deaths in April, against 48 in March. There was a decrease in the number of these deaths in Auckland and Wellington, but an increase in Christchurch and Dunedin.

Constitutional diseases caused 17 deaths in April, against 26 in March.

Local diseases caused 38 deaths in March, and 42 in April.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

STANDING ORDERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL RELATIVE TO LOCAL BILLS.

1. Local Bills are those which not being such as require to be introduced as Private Bills, are yet Bills specially affecting local interests and dealing with private rights, or with public reserves for local and municipal purposes; also Bills altering the constitution, election, or powers of local public bodies.

2. There shall be a Standing Committee, to consist

of five members, to be called the "Local Bills Committee," to which shall stand referred, after their to which shall stand referred, after their first reading, all Bills which may appear to the Speaker to come within the description given in the preceding Order. Such Committee shall, in the case of every Bill referred to it, decide whether the same comes within the definition of a Local Bill; and, if so, whether the conditions laid down in Orders 3, 4, and 5 have been complied with.

3. No Local Bill shall be introduced into the Legislative Council by any member later than two months after the commencement of the session.

4. The member in charge of a Local Bill shall produce to the Local Bills Committee satisfactory evidence that the intention to introduce the Bill and the purport of the same has been made public in the locality whose interests are affected, by advertisement in a local newspaper, at least four times in four successive weeks. When the Bill specially affects the interests of any private individual, evidence shall also be produced that personal notice to the effect

above stated has been given to such individual.

5. When a Local Bill refers to an exchange of or other dealing with any Crown lands, or with a public reserve, the member in charge thereof shall also produce a certified map, on a scale of not less than 20 chains to an inch, showing the land or reserve in question, and the mode in which it is proposed to deal with the same. When any Schedule containing a description of any land is attached to such Bill, it shall be accompanied by a certificate of its correctness from an officer of the Survey Department or other duly-authorized Surveyor.
