Lands declared to be Waste Lands of the Crown.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that, whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and any Act amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall, by Proclamation, declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as thereafter in the said Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown for the time being in force in the land district in which such land is situated; and thereupon such land so proclaimed shall become subject to such provisions:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto have been purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and Acts amending the same, and it is expedient that the said lands should be declared to

be waste lands of the Crown;
Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert
Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, being satisfied that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," do hereby proclaim and declare the said lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown in force in the Land District of Auckland.

SCHEDULE.

TE PUKE.

All that parcel of land in the Bay of Plenty District, in the Provincial District of Auckland, known

by the name of Te Puke, containing by admeasurement 25,972 acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-east by the sea; towards the East by a line, 10916 links, the Kaituna and Waiari Rivers; towards the South-east by the Mangatoi Creek and a line, 6450 links; and towards the North-west by lines, 1175047 links; save and excepting two reserves containing by admeasurement 1,081 acres and 500 acres respectively: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

"Auckland Dog Nuisance Act, 1854," in force within the County of Coromandel.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Auckland intituled "The Auckland Dog Nuisance Act (Session I., No. 4), 1854," it is, among other things, enacted that the said Act shall come into operation in such districts as shall be proclaimed by the Superintendent in the Auckland Provincial Gazette to come within the operation of the said

And whereas the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," vested in the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient to proclaim that the

district comprised within the County of Coromandel shall be proclaimed to come within the operation of the said first-mentioned Act:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that, on and from the date of this Proclamation, the said "Dog Nuisance Act, 1854," shall come into operation within the district comprised within the County of Coromandel, and the said Act shall extend and apply to the said

County of Coromandel accordingly.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

Revoking Notice under Sections 142, 143, 144, and 145 of "The Harbours Act, 1878," published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 51, of 15th May, 1879.

W HEREAS a certain notice bearing date the twelfth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 51, of the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and purporting to be made under the one hundred and forty-second, one hundred and forty-third, one hundred and forty-fourth, and one hundred and forty-fifth sections of "The Harbours Act, 1878," was given by me to the Otago Harbour Board that I should, on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, on a day therein named, enter upon and take possession of certain land particularly described in the Schedule thereto:

Fixing Sittings of District Court of Dunedin.

In the Resident Magistrate's Courthouse. Dunedin, for the despatch of Civil business, on the thirtieth day of June, twenty-fifth day of July, first and twenty-sixth day of September, thirty-first day of October, twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Provided that in case any of the days so fixed as aforesaid shall happen to be a holiday, then the Court appointed for that day shall be holden on the

first day thereafter not being a holiday.

Fixing Sittings of District Court of Tokomairiro and Clutha.

N pursuance and exercise of the power and 1 authority in this behalf enabling me, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby fix and appoint that sit-tings of the District Court of the Tokomairiro and Clutha District shall be held as follows, in lieu of those previously fixed and appointed:

At Tokomairiro, in the Resident Magistrate's Courthouse, for the despatch of Criminal and Civil business, on the eighteenth day of June, fifteenth day of July, twenty-third day of August, fifteenth day of September, twentyfourth day of October, seventeenth day of November, and twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.
