A PROCLAMATION.

KNOW YE that I, being desirous that the General Assembly of New Zealand should be holden as soon as may be, do hereby summon and call together the said General Assembly to meet at the Parliament Buildings in Molesworth Street, in the City of Wellington, on WEDNESDAY, the SEVENTEENTH day of SEPTEMBER next, at Twelve of the clock at noon.

Lands taken for a Road in the Waipukurau Road District, County of Waipawa.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section twenty-one of "The Public Works Act, 1876" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that, whenever lands are required to be taken for public works, the Road Board, in the case of district works, shall cause a survey to be made and plans to be prepared showing generally the nature of the works proposed to be executed and the lands required to be taken for the same, together with the names of the owners and occupiers of such lands so far as they can be ascertained, and shall cause a copy of such plans to be deposited in some place in the road district in which such lands are: And by section twenty-two of the said Act it is further enacted that the said Road Board shall cause a notice to be gazetted, and to be twice publicly notified, stating the place where such plans are open for inspection, with a general description of the works proposed to be executed and of the land required to be taken, and in such notice shall call upon all persons affected to set forth in writing any well-grounded objections to the execution of such works or to the taking of such lands, and to send such writing within forty days from the first publication of such notice to the said Road Board: And by sections twenty-three and twenty-four of the said Act it is further enacted that the Road Board shall cause a copy of such notice and description to be served upon the said owners and occupiers so far as they can be ascertained; and that the said Road Board shall, upon receiving any objection, appoint a time and place within the colony within which the objector may appear before the said Road Board, and support the objection by such evidence as the objector thinks fit: And by section twenty-five of the said Act it is enacted that, if within the said forty days no such objection is made, or if after due consideration of such objections the said Road Board is of opinion that it is expedient that the proposed works should be executed, and that no private injury will be done thereby for which due

compensation is not provided by the said Act, the land proposed to be taken shall be taken in the following manner, that is to say: The said Road Board shall lay before the Governor a memorial containing an accurate description of the land proposed to be taken, together with a map thereof, signed by the Surveyor-General or some certificated surveyor as evidence of the accuracy thereof; and the Governor in Council may thereupon, if he think fit, by Proclamation gazetted and publicly notified, declare that the said lands are taken for the use of a railway, road, or other public work, as the case may be; and from and after a date to be named in the said Proclamation the land therein specified shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for the public use named in the said Proclamation:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken under the said Act for a certain public work, to wit, the construction of a road in the Survey Districts of Ruataniwha and Takapau, in the Waipukurau Road District, County of Waipawa, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay:

And whereas the Waipukurau Road Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the twenty-fifth section of the said Act:

And whereas all the requirements and conditions prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and fulfilled, and all things have happened and all times elapsed to lawfully authorize this Proclamation to be issued:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by the herebefore in part recited Act, and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto are hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the lands so described shall become absolutely

vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement 23 acres 1 rood 30·7 perches, more or less, situate in the Survey District of Ruataniwha, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, being portion of Blocks 235, 109, 115, 111, and 105: Commencing on the easterly side of a public road at a distance of 832 links south-westerly from junction of Ashley-Clinton and Ruataniwha Public Road with Block 218. Bounded generally southerly and westerly by lines, 2328, 967, 398, 2931, 579, 1756, 910, 1083, 453, 1342, 1372, 1334, 227, and 1801 links respectively; thence generally easterly and northerly by lines, 256, 370, and 279 links respectively; thence generally westerly and northerly by lines, 280, 215, 451, 255, 335, 287, 227, 140, 642, 89, 537, 373, and 1105 links respectively; thence southerly by public road, 100 links; thence generally easterly and southerly by lines, 967, 240·8, 629, 189, 704, 108, 129, 274, 300·5, 188·6, 450, 300, and 258 links respectively; thence generally southerly and westerly by lines, 179, 309, 370, and 110 links respectively; thence generally northerly and easterly by lines, 2073, 306, 1340, 1380, 1290, 413, 1096, 1779, 595, 2940, 406, 972, and 2326 links respectively; thence westerly by public road to commencing point, 100 links or thereabouts.

Also all that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement 20 acres 2 roods 36·7 perches, more or less, situated in the Survey District of Ruataniwha, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay aforesaid, being portion of Blocks 105, 196, and 274: Commencing on the southerly side of public road at a distance of 2074 links; on the northerly side of the said public road from the piece firstly described, and 219 links across said road obliquely. Bounded generally southerly and westerly by lines, 1998, 2007, 4596, 6262, 3424, 227, 323, 572, 391·3, 367, and 579 links respectively; thence northerly by a line, 50 links; thence south-westerly by Mangatewai River, 100 links; thence southerly by a line, 126 links; thence generally easterly and northerly by lines, 722, 424, 420, 593, 234, 189, 3483, 6283, 4573, 2004, and 1808 links respectively; thence northerly by public road to commencing point, 218 links or thereabouts.

Also all that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement 15 acres 3 roods 11½ perches, more or less, situate in the Survey Districts of Ruataniwha and Takapau, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay aforesaid, being portion of Blocks 59, 182, 192, and 60: Commencing on the south-westerly side of the Mangatewai River, 431 links south-westerly from the piece secondly described. Counties of Taranaki and Patea declared a disturbed District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Colonial Forces Courts-Martial Act, 1868," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, appoint and declare any portion of the colony defined in such Proclamation to be a disturbed district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that a portion of the colony should be declared a disturbed district, as hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim, appoint, and declare all that portion of the colony which is comprised within the limits of the Counties of Taranaki and Patea, as such counties are described in the First Schedule to "The Counties Act, 1876," to be a disturbed district within the meaning of "The Colonial Forces Courts-Martial Act, 1868."

Abolishing Polling-places and Principal Polling-places.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME—GREETING.

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1870," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand, from time to time to appoint polling-places for each electoral district, within or within one mile of the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such polling-places to be the principal polling-place for the district, and all or any of such polling-places from time to time to abolish, and, if he think fit, to appoint other polling-places in lieu of those abolished, and that every such warrant shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*: Provided always that no polling-place shall be appointed by the Governor under the said Act unless he shall be first satisfied that the place to be appointed is more convenient than any other for at least twenty electors to record their votes thereat:

And whereas by warrants under the hand of the Governor certain places were appointed polling-places and principal polling-places for the election of Members of the House of Representatives for the electoral districts mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said polling-places and principal polling-places:

Now know ye that I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby abolish all the polling-places and principal polling-places for the electoral districts mentioned in the said Schedule for the election of Members of the House of Representatives.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued at Wellington, this nineteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1870," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand, from time to time to appoint polling-places for each electoral district, within or within one mile of the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such polling-places to be the principal polling-place for the district, and all or any of such polling-places from time to time to abolish, and, if he think fit, to appoint other polling-places in lieu of those abolished, and that every such warrant shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*: Provided always that no polling-place shall be appointed by the Governor under the said Act unless he shall be first satisfied that the place to be appointed is more convenient than any other for at least twenty electors to record their votes thereat:

Now know ye that I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby appoint the places mentioned in the First Schedule hereto to be polling-places for the electoral districts in the said First Schedule mentioned for the elections of Members of the House of Representatives: And I do hereby also appoint the polling-places mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto to be the principal polling-places for the electoral districts in the said First Schedule and in the Second Schedule mentioned for the election of Members of the House of Representatives.
