WHEREAS by the seventeenth section of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," it is enacted that, whenever the Governor is satisfied that any lands purchased out of the sums authorized under "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," and any Act amending the same, to be issued and expended in the purchase of lands in the North Island of New Zealand, are free from Native claims and all difficulties in connection therewith, he shall, by Proclamation, declare such lands to be waste lands of the Crown, subject, except as thereafter in the said Act provided, to be sold and dealt with according to the provisions of the laws regulating the sale and disposal of waste lands of the Crown for the time being in force in the land district in which such land is situated; and thereupon such land so pro-claimed shall become subject to such provisions: And whereas the lands described in the Schedule

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the East Gore Domain Board :-

Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1870," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Ngaruawahia Domain Board :---

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at eight o'clock p.m., at the Town Board Office, Ngaruawahia, or such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Amended Regulations for Management, &c., of Railway Stores.

HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by Order in Council bearing date the

twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine, certain regulations relating to railway stores were made under the eighty-fifth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878:" And whereas it is expedient that the said regulations should be repealed and revoked and amended regulations made:

revoked, and amended regulations made : Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the said eighty-fifth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby repeal and revoke the aforesaid regulations of the said twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventynine, and doth also hereby make the new regulations for the management and custody of railway stores, and for accounting for the same, contained in the Schedule hereto; and it is hereby also, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, ordered that this

Order in Council, and the regulations hereby made, shall have the full force of law from and after the twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

SCHEDULE.

SUPPLIES of stores shall be obtained by means of contracts, tenders being publicly advertised for. Contracts shall run for a period of not less than one year, and not more than three years, at the discretion of the Hon. the Minister for Public Works.

The accounts for the supplies of stores sent in by the contractors and others shall be passed for pay-ment under the signature of the Stores Managers, or in their absence by some persons duly authorized by them in writing, who, if the goods are under contract, shall certify that they are in accordance with the contract, if not under contract, that the price charged is reasonable.

Stores shall be issued by the storekeepers for the use of the departments upon requisition signed by the heads of departments, or by persons duly appointed by them, and lists of the persons authorized to make requisitions shall be furnished to the storekeepers.

For accounting purposes for each stores depôt, an invoice-book and a day-book of the issues shall be kept.

A stores ledger also shall be established, in which a separate account shall be opened for each article kept in stock or purchased for use, and which shall deal with values as well as quantities. This ledger shall be opened on a given date with

the stock in hand of each article (quantity and value), and the account shall be debited with the quantity and value (as per invoice) of the particular article received from the contractor or other source of supply. The credits shall be the total quantity and value

of the several articles issued monthly to the several departments, as taken day by day in detail into an abstract sheet.

A journal and general ledger by double-entry shall also be kept, which shall embrace all the stores transactions of the several depôts. In this ledger there shall be a special account of stores, which shall be opened with the value of the stock, be debited with the amounts of the invoices of the stores received from the contractors and other sources of supply, and be credited with the monthly value of the stores supplied to the several departments. The balance of this account, at any given period, shall agree with the sum of the balances of the stores ledger, the two ledgers thus inutually checking and corroborating each other.

An account in detail of the stock at each depôt shall be taken annually in the month of December, and the operation shall be performed by the Stores Managers, and superintended by some person having no interest in the result, preferably by an officer appointed by the Controller and Auditor-General. The stock account shall be taken for the same period at all the depôts; the ledgers shall not be balanced until after the stock accounts are completed, and, after such account has been taken, and has been signed by the superintending officer, no alteration shall be made therein without the consent in writing of the latter.

The articles in the stock accounts shall be priced at the contract rates, and the amounts calculated and totalled.

A comparative statement of the money balances of the stores ledgers and of the amounts in the stock accounts shall then be prepared with two columns

headed respectively "Excesses " and " Deficiencies," into which the differences shall be carried. After such discrepancies as are susceptible of explanation have been adjusted, a balance shall be struck between the totals of the "Excess" and "Deficiency" columns, and if there be a balance of excess it shall be *credited* rateably to the departments; if of deficiency it shall in like manner be debited to the departments.

The balancing of the books at the stock-taking shall effect the adjustment and final extinction of all discrepancies, and the stores ledgers shall be re-opened for the new period with the actual stock as exhibited in the stock accounts.

The care and control of all articles issued for use from stores shall be subject to such regulations as the Commissioners of Railways may deem it expedient to establish.

All the accounting of the Stores Departments shall be done in the offices of the Stores Managers, the duties of the local storekeepers being confined to their more legitimate functions of receiving, recording, and issuing stores.

All matters of detail in respect of the accounting and management of the Stores Department not herein provided for shall be left to the discretion of the Commissioners of Railways.

The accounts and books of the Stores Department shall at all times be open for such inspection and audit as the Controller and Auditor-General may consider it proper to institute.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. POPULATION.—In the cases marked thus * the numbers given are for the 3rd March, 1878, according to the census then taken; in the other cases the numbers have been estimated for the 1st January, 1879. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 489, against 527 in July, a decrease of 38. The deaths amounted to 178 in August, an increase of 7 on the number in July. Of the above deaths, males contributed 114; females, 64. 80 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 44:94 per cent. of the whole number; 65 of these were of children under one year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs :--The births were 259 in August, against 279 in July, a decrease of 20. The deaths in August were 106, against 97 in July, an increase of 9. There were 14 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards-viz., 4 males of 67, 69, 70, and 72 years, and 2 females of 67 and 72 years, at Wellington; 3 males of 65, 73, and 95, and 1 female of 67, at Christchurch; and 3 males of 68, 70, and 77, and 1 female of 85, at Dunedin. Zymotic diseases.--The deaths from Zymotic diseases, which decreased from 28 in May to 22 in June, and from 22 in June to 15 in July, have again decreased from 15 in July to 13 in August. Typhoid fever caused 1 death in August, against 2 in July.

June to 15 in July, have again decreased from 15 in July to 15 in August. Typical term caused 1 death in August, agains 2 in July.
Constitutional diseases.—The deaths from these diseases have increased from 13 in July to 21 in August. Of these, the deaths from phthisis were 8 in July and 13 in August.
Local diseases.—The number of deaths from local diseases was 50 in July and 52 in August; of these, diseases of the nervous system caused 14 deaths in July and 12 in August. Heart disease caused 7 deaths in July and 6 in August; diseases of the respiratory organs caused 21 deaths in July and 26 in August; diseases of digestive organs caused 6 deaths in August, against 5 in July.
Developmental Diseases.—The number of deaths from these causes was the same in both months—viz., 14 in July and 14

Developmental Diseases.—The number of deaths from these causes was the same in both months—viz., 14 in July and 14 in August. Violent Deaths .-The number of these deaths was 4 in August, against 5 in July. Suicide caused 1 death in August and

2 in July. The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
