Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858."

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of former Proclamations duly made and issued in pursuance of the said power and authority as relate to the Oamaru district constituted for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within the said district shall be and the same is hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into two districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

DUNSTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and North-east by the Waitaki River (from the junction of the Maerewhenua River) and its Ohau branch to Lake Ohau, and by the south shore of that lake and a line running westward therefrom to the Dunstan Mountains; towards the West and South-west by the Dunstan Mountains to Mount St. Bathans, the Hawkdun Mountains, and the Kakanui Mountains to Kakanui Peak; towards the East by the north branch of the Kakanui River to a point due south of the junction before mentioned of the Maerewhenua River with the River Waitaki, and by a straight line to that junction, the commencing point.

OAMARU DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Waitaki River from the sea to the junction of the Maerewhenua

River; towards the West by a straight line from that junction drawn due south to the north branch of the Kakanui River; towards the South by the last-mentioned river to the sea; and towards the East by the sea to the Waitaki River.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by "The Registration of

Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of former Proclamations, duly made and issued in pursuance of the said power and authority, as relate to the Oamaru District constituted for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth; and do proclaim and declare that the territory formerly comprised within the said district shall be and the same is hereby divided for the purpose of the said Act into two districts, the names whereof shall be the Duntroon District and the Oamaru District, and the boundaries of the said districts shall be coterminous with the boundaries of districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858;" and I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Vaccination Districts constituted.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Public Health Act, 1876," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Oamaru District constituted as a vaccination district under "The Public Health Act, 1872," shall be and the same are hereby altered; and do hereby proclaim and declare that the territory therein comprised shall be divided anew into two vaccination districts, the names whereof shall be the Duntroon District and the Oamaru District; and that the boundaries of the said districts shall be coterminous with the boundaries of districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858;" and I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies,

Reserves made under Section 4, "Confiscated Lands Act, 1867."

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to reserve out of lands taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," as amended by "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1864," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act 1865," and "The New Zealand Settlements Act Amendment Act, 1866," such lands as to him shall seem fit, and thereout to grant or set apart such portion or portions as he think fit, as therein specified: And whereas the pieces of land described in Schedule B hereto have been taken under the said last-mentioned Acts: And whereas by section six of "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," it is enacted that the provisions of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," shall continue in operation, and shall be deemed to have been always in operation, in respect of any reserves promised to Natives or set apart for Natives under the said Act, at any time previous to the coming into operation of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," but which, for want of surveys or other unavoidable causes, could not be proclaimed previous to the time last mentioned: And whereas prior to the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, being the day on which "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," came into operation, promises were made to the tribes named in the Schedule hereto marked A, who had been in rebellion, but had subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority, to reserve, for the purposes of the said fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," the pieces of land described in the Schedule B hereto, but such pieces of land, for want of proper surveys and other unavoidable causes, could not be proclaimed previous to the said "Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," coming into operation:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," by "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," and "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," and of all other powers and authorities me thereunto enabling, and in fulfilment of the said promises, do hereby proclaim and declare that the pieces of land mentioned and described in the Schedule B hereto are hereby reserved for the purposes of the fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867."

Warrant setting apart Land for Rebel Natives under "Confiscated Lands Act, 1867."

HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS by the fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to reserve out of lands taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," as amended by "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1864," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," and "The New Zealand Settlements Act Amendment Act, 1866," such lands as to him shall seem fit, and thereout to grant such portion or portions thereof as he shall think fit to such person or persons of the Native race as shall have proved to his satisfaction to have been in rebellion, and have subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority; or by warrant under his hand to set apart out of the lands so reserved as last aforesaid such portion or portions thereof as he shall think fit for the benefit of any such person or persons as last aforesaid: And whereas by "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," it is enacted that the provisions of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," shall continue in operation, and shall be deemed to have always been in operation, in respect of any reserves

promised to Natives or set apart for Natives under the said Act, at any time previous to the coming into operation of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," but which, for want of surveys or other unavoidable causes, could not be proclaimed previous to the time last mentioned: And whereas by Proclamation of even date herewith, I did reserve the lands specified in the fourth column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes of the said fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867:" And whereas prior to "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," coming into operation, promises were made to the Natives named in the first column of the Schedule aforesaid to set apart the land set opposite to their names in the said Schedule for the benefit of such Natives: Now know ye that I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said "Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby set apart, for the benefit of the persons whose names and sexes are set forth in the first and second columns of the Schedule hereto, being persons of the Native race who to my satisfaction have been proved to have been in rebellion, and to have subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority, the pieces of land set opposite their names respectively in the third column of the said Schedule: Provided always that in any Crown grants which may be issued to the aforesaid persons, or any of them, there shall be inserted a clause restricting all alienation of the land thereby granted, whether absolute or conditional, or for a term of years in possession, without the consent of the Governor in Council being first obtained to such alienation.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS by the fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to reserve out of lands taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," as amended by "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1864," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," and "The New Zealand Settlements Act Amendment Act, 1866," such lands as to him shall seem fit, and thereout to grant such portions or portions thereof as he shall think fit to such person or persons of the Native race as shall have proved to his satisfaction to have been in rebellion, and have subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority; or by warrant under his hand to set

apart out of the lands so reserved as last aforesaid such portion or portions thereof as he shall think fit for the benefit of any such person or persons as last aforesaid: And whereas by "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," it is enacted that the provisions of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," shall continue in operation, and shall be deemed to have been always in operation, in respect of any reserves promised to Natives or set apart for Natives under the said Act, at any time previous to the coming into operation of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," but which, for want of surveys or other unavoidable causes, could not be proclaimed previous to the time last mentioned: And whereas by Proclamation of even date herewith, I did reserve, with other lands, the lands specified in the fourth column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes of the said fourth section of "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867:" And whereas prior to "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," coming into operation, promises were made to the Natives named in the first column of the Schedule aforesaid to set apart the land set opposite to their names in the said Schedule for the benefit of such Natives: Now know ye that I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said "Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," "The Volunteers and Others Lands Act, 1877," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby set apart, for the benefit of the persons whose names and sexes are set forth in the first and second columns of the Schedule hereto, being persons of the Native race who to my satisfaction have been proved to have been in rebellion, and to have subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority, the pieces of land set opposite their names respectively in the third column of the said Schedule.

THE following amended rules and regulations regarding the management of the Government Remount Landing Depôt, Garden Reach, Calcutta, are published for general information, in modification of the rules previously circulated:—

Notification.

With a view to assist shippers of horses, and to save risk and expense which has been hitherto incurred in landing and stabling horses imported to Calcutta, it is notified for general information that the Government of India have authorized arrangements being made at the Government Remount Depôt, 13, Garden Reach, for the reception of horses arriving from Australia, under the terms laid down in the following amended rules and regulations.

In such cases as may appear necessary, the Government of India are also prepared to advance the amount of freight required to clear the consignment of horses from the ships, together with captain's and other fees connected with the voyage. Such advances to be recovered from the shippers on payment by the Remount Agent of the value of horses purchased by him.

Rules and Regulations.

1. Every shipper landing any horse or horses at the Government Remount Landing Depôt, Garden Reach, Calcutta, shall be subject to the rules hereinafter detailed, and to any such directions as the Remount Agent, Calcutta, may give regarding the horses stabled in Government stables, and every shipper shall sign an agreement on landing to this effect. He is also to agree that he will not remove any horse or horses without the special leave of the Remount Agent, and that he will immediately remove any horse or horses on being requested to do so by the Remount Agent.

2. Every horse landed at the Government Remount Landing Depôt shall be subject to a charge of Rs. 10 per horse.

In return for this charge, horses that are intended to be presented for purchase by Government will be stabled in the depôt until considered in fit condition to be submitted for approval to the Remount Agent.

Horses that are not intended for Government, but that are imported for private sale, cannot be stabled in the depôt, and must be removed from the premises as soon as possible after having been landed.

3. The actual cost of landing the horses and surplus forage remaining at the end of the voyage will be borne by the shipper. The work will be carried out in the most economical way possible, the shipper and his assistants performing their due share of the work.

4. The shippers may, if they wish it, feed their horses on the remainder of the forage put on board their ships for the voyage. Grain, bedding, and fodder will be supplied, as required, under instructions from the Remount Agent, to be paid for by the shipper at such rate as will cover the total cost of such supplies.

5. Syces and the necessary native establishment will be provided by the Remount Agent, as required, and the shipper will be charged at the actual rate for wages of such establishment.

6. Veterinary attendance will be given by the Assistant Remount Agent free, and medicines supplied at actual cost rates.

7. All horses intended for Government, whether landed at the Government Landing Depôt or not, will be inspected with a view to purchase, as soon as the Remount Agent considers them in fit condition for such inspection.

8. Horses will be received at the landing depôt from the 15th August until the end of the purchasing season.

9. The Remount Agent can, if he considers it necessary, refuse to receive into the depôt any horse or horses.

10. Should the stables at the Government Landing Depôt be insufficient to accommodate all the horses landed at one time, horses shall be selected from the first arrivals, and be removed to the Remount Depôt at Ballygunge, to await inspection of the Remount Officer. Such removal is to be at the risk of the shipper, and the horses are to stand at the Ballygunge Remount Depôt on the same terms in every respect as if they were at the Landing Depôt at Garden Reach.

11. All charges of every kind whatsoever against the shipper will be recovered from him on payment being made for the remounts selected for Government by the Remount Agent.

BAY OF BENGAL—COROMANDEL COAST, MADRAS.
CHANGE IN THE ANCHORAGE LIMITS OF THE PORT.

THE Master Attendant of Madras has given notice that, owing to the extension of the harbour works into deep water, it has become necessary to shift the northern and southern port buoys into 8 fathoms of water. These buoys, which are painted half red and half white vertically, should henceforward be looked upon as danger buoys, and commanders of vessels, making or leaving the anchorage, are hereby warned not to pass in shore of either of these buoys by day, nor to come under 8 fathoms by night, as the rubble bases of both groins extend much further seaward than the walls themselves, and in some places have only 17 feet of water on them.

The middle, or large buoy, which is painted red, is laid down in 6½ fathoms, and marks the western limit of the anchorage for steamers.

All sailing vessels, excepting dhonies, should anchor outside the 8-fathom line of soundings.

RED SEA—HEDJAZ—ARABIAN COAST. INTENDED DISCONTINUANCE OF LIGHT AT EL-WEG (SHERM WEJ-II).

THE Egyptian Government has given notice that the quarantine station at El-Weg having been removed to Tor, in the Gulf of Suez, the light exhibited on the south side of the entrance to El-Weg Harbour will be discontinued on the 1st October, 1879.

"THE LAND ACT, 1877."—HOMESTEAD SYSTEM.

Conditions of Occupation.

1. The area allowed to be selected by each person of the age of 18 years or upwards shall be—of first-class lands, fifty acres, or of second-class lands, seventy-five acres; and for persons under 18 years of age, of first-class lands, twenty acres, or of second-class lands, thirty acres: Provided that the total quantity to be selected by any one family or number of persons occupying the one household shall not exceed two hundred acres of first-class or three hundred acres of second-class lands.

2. Within three months after the selection has been approved to the Board, the selector shall commence to reside on his selection, and shall continue to reside continuously thereon for five years from the date of such approval as aforesaid.

3. Within eighteen months after such approval the selector shall erect on his selection a permanent dwellinghouse of wood or other materials, which shall be specified in regulations to be issued in reference to homestead-system selections.

4. In each year there shall be brought under cultivation one-fifteenth of the area of such selection if open land, and one-twenty-fifth if bush land, so that at the end of the term of five years one-third of the selection of open land, or one-fifth of bush land, shall be under cultivation.

5. Non-performance of any of the foregoing stipulations shall render the selection void, and the right of the selector therein and to all improvements thereon shall be forfeited.

6. At the end of the said period of five years a grant or grants shall issue for the lands selected: Provided the selector shall not have forfeited his right thereto in manner aforesaid.

SURVEY REGULATIONS.

1. All surveys shall be made by surveyors authorized by the Surveyor-General, and in accordance with instructions to settlement surveyors issued or which may be issued by him.

Mongonui.—Generally fine; greatest rainfall recorded on 4th, 3 in.; prevailing winds from E. and S.E.; strong on 3rd from E., and on 14th from N.W.; otherwise moderate.

Auckland.—Generally very fine; greatest rain registered on 15th, 1.50 in.; prevailing southerly winds, strong from 4th to 6th, otherwise light; heavy dews; from 6th to 13th, and 23rd to 29th, very clear sky; sheet-lightning on night of 24th.

Taranaki.—Very fine weather; prevailing S.E. winds; strong on 4th and 18th; otherwise moderate; maximum rain on 4th, 1.37 in.

Napier.—Unsettled, showery weather; wind prevailed from S. and moderate; maximum rain on 22nd, 2.38 in., falling during night of 21st; thunder on 22nd and 23rd.

Wanganui.—Fine, with moderate winds from S.E. and N.W.; strong breeze from S.W. on 1st and S.E. on 23rd; maximum rain on 4th, .60 in.; frequently calm.

Wellington.—On 3rd, at night, a gale from N.W. with rain; 5th, stormy from N.W.; on night of 13th strong N.W. wind and rain; also 14th, wind and rain from N.W.; on 21st and 22nd stormy from S.E., with rain; otherwise the weather during the month was pleasant and bright, with prevailing N.W. and S.E. winds; the greatest rain recorded on 15th, .930 in.

Nelson.—Generally fine clear weather, though occasionally heavy rain, the maximum on 15th, 1.57 in.; prevailing S.E. winds and moderate; on 4th, 5th, and 6th, strong S.W. winds, and strong from N.E. on 15th.

Cape Campbell.—A fine dry month, only one day of rain, .20 in.; prevailing S.E. and N.W. winds, and stormy on nine days.

Christchurch.—Fine weather prevailed, with S.W., E., and N.E. winds; on 3rd and 4th stormy from N.W., and on 5th gale from S.W.; otherwise moderate winds; maximum rain recorded on 15th, .52 in.

Hokitika.—Heavy rain in beginning, middle, and end of month; remainder fine, but rather dull; maximum rain on 4th, 1.51 in.; strong S.W. winds on 3rd, 4th, and 5th, and from N.W. on 13th and 14th; general direction variable.

Dunedin.—Squally and changeable, but dry month; strong S.W. winds on 3rd, 4th, and 5th; maximum rain recorded on 22nd, .33 in.

Queenstown.—Remarkably fair, bright weather; greatest rain recorded on 4th, .82 in.; prevailing N.W. winds and light, often calm; snow on hills 5th, 14th, 20th, 21st; fogs on 11th and 15th.

Southland.—Showery weather, but small total rainfall, the maximum recorded on 4th, .52 in.; strong wind on 5th from S.W., and 11th and 14th from N.E.; otherwise moderate, and prevailed from S.W. and N.W.; thunder on 5th.

GENERAL REMARKS.

Very fine weather generally throughout; high barometer readings; temperature below the average, and small rainfall; winds on the whole moderate. Earthquake at Wellington, 24th, at 10.55 p.m., slight; Queenstown, 20th, at 12 p.m., slight.
