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Land taken for Road in Sections 43, 44, and 45, Block VI., North Harbour and Blueskin District, County of Waikouaiti.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Sections forty-three, forty-four, and forty-five, Block six, North Harbour and Blueskin District, County of Waikouaiti:

And whereas the Blueskin Road Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the fifth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

ALL that piece of land situate in the North Harbour and Blueskin District, County of Waikouaiti, containing by admeasurement 1 acre 1 rood, be the same a little more or less, being parts of Sections numbered respectively 43, 44, and 45, Block VI., in the above district. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-fourth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of the branch line of railway to Hamilton, being one of the railways specified in "The Immigration and Public Works Appropriation Act, 1878," was defined: And whereas, pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the twelfth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas the railway from Waikato to the Thames is one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," and the Hamilton Branch is now part of the said railway, and it is enacted therein that such of the railways mentioned as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for the Hamilton Branch section of the said line of railway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the sixth section of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of every power and authority in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said part of the said line of railway from Waikato to the Thames.

THE following rules and regulations of the Hororata Cemetery, County of Selwyn, have been submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council, and are published in accordance with "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

JOHN HALL.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR HORORATA CEMETERY, COUNTY OF SELWYN.

1. The Hororata Cemetery is laid off in four blocks. Block four, situated at the north end of the cemetery, is reserved for the use of the Roman

Catholics. The remaining blocks will be divided into burial-plots measuring 9 feet by 4 feet, and will be open to selection by any person requiring the same.

2. The exclusive right of burial in perpetuity in any plot of ground may be sold by the Trustees, to persons applying for the same, at £1 1s. per plot.

3. All graves must be not less than 6 feet deep; but, in the event of purchasers of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. shall be made for every foot more than 6 feet. No coffin to be within 4 feet 6 inches of the surface.

4. Any purchaser of private ground may transfer his or her interest in said ground to any other person upon payment being made to the Clerk to the Cemetery for the time being of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

5. The Clerk to the Cemetery for the time being

shall keep a book, in which he shall enter from time to time the number of every lot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale of the same, and shall keep a record of the burials in the cemetery.

6. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the Clerk to the Cemetery for the time being for a warrant for such interment, which warrant the Clerk is hereby authorized to grant upon payment to him of the following fees, viz:—

7. The costs and charges of the burial of any person in such cemetery will be remitted on proof being given to the satisfaction of the Trustees that there are no funds applicable, and no person liable for the payment of costs and charges.

8. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton at least six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge of 5s. will be made. The following particulars must accompany the order:—

9. In event of any person wishing to purchase a plot in any part of the cemetery not already plotted, such person must pay all costs of survey by a qualified surveyor.

10. All monuments, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

11. The record-book shall be open for the inspection of the public on paying a fee of 1s. for each inspection.

12. All charges made for any matter or thing relating to the cemetery shall be paid for in advance.

13. No body shall be disinterred, or removed from the said cemetery, except by order from the Coroner, without express permission in writing from the Trustees.

14. A sexton will from time to time be appointed by the Trustees, whose duty it will be to dig all graves required in the cemetery, and no other person will be allowed to dig any grave therein without express permission in writing from the Trustees.

15. Grants of exclusive rights of burial in perpetuity shall be made out in the Form A annexed to the regulations, on payment of a fee of 1s.; and all necessary stamps must be supplied by the parties applying for such right.

THE following rules and regulations for the Kimberley Cemetery, County of Selwyn, have been submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council, and are published in accordance with "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

JOHN HALL.

BY-LAWS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF KIMBERLEY CEMETERY.

1. The Trustees appointed by the Governor under "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall have the entire control and management of the Kimberley Cemetery.

2. The Trustees have power by the said Act to allocate portions of the cemetery to the various religious denominations requiring the same. No interference will be permitted with such allocations. A portion of the cemetery will be set apart as open ground for purposes of general interment.

3. Persons desirous of obtaining an exclusive right in any plot of ground in the cemetery, for the purpose of making graves or family vaults, or erecting monuments, may do so at a rate not exceeding 5s. per square yard. Such persons shall receive the following document, signed by the Trustees:—

KIMBERLEY CEMETERY.

RECEIVED from A.B., of _____, the sum of _____, for that piece of ground, part of Kimberley Cemetery, at Kimberley, No. _____ on the plan of cemetery in the custody of the Trustees, the said piece of ground to be held by the said A.B. subject to the rules for the time being in force for the management of the said cemetery.

4. Applications for this purpose may be made to the Trustees or to the Secretary, or other person authorized by them to receive the same.

5. Every burial-plot shall be 9 feet by 4 feet, and every grave shall be 6 feet in depth at the least. In the event of the purchaser of private ground desiring a greater depth, an extra charge of 2s. 6d. shall be made for every foot more than 6 feet.

6. Any purchaser of private ground may transfer his or her interest therein to any other person upon payment of a fee of 5s. for such transfer.

7. A plan of the cemetery shall be kept, showing the plots as laid off in the several divisions; and each plot shall have a separate number on the plan.

8. A book shall be kept in which shall be entered the number of every plot sold, the name of the purchaser thereof, together with the date of the sale or transfer of the same. A register shall also be kept of all burials in the cemetery, which register shall be open for the inspection of the public on payment of a fee of 1s. for each inspection.

9. In all cases of intended interment the person having the management or control of the same shall apply to the sexton or other duly-authorized person for a warrant for such interment, which warrant shall be granted upon payment of the following fees, viz. :—

THE following sections of the Property Assessment Act are published for general information.

J. SPEEREEY,

18. Every company, including banking and insurance companies, carrying on business in New Zealand at the commencement of this Act, shall at all times be represented by a person residing in the colony; and a place within the colony shall be appointed from time to time by every such company as aforesaid at which any notices or other instruments affecting the company under this Act may be served or delivered.

(1.) Such person shall be called the "Public Officer" of the company for the purposes of this Act, and shall be appointed as follows:—

(a.) In the case of a company having a local Board of Directors or Managers resident in the colony, within three months after the passing of this Act:

(b.) In the case of a company not having such local Board as aforesaid, within six months after the passing of this Act.

The office of Public Officer shall be kept constantly filled by the making of fresh appointments thereto from time to time as may be necessary.

(2.) Every new company shall, within three months after it shall commence or enter into business after the passing of this Act, appoint a Public Officer, and name a place for delivery of notices as aforesaid.

(3.) Every company failing or neglecting, within the time hereinbefore limited in that behalf, to appoint a Public Officer, or name a place at which notices or other instruments may be served or delivered as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds a day for every day after the time aforesaid during which such neglect shall continue.
