A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of former Proclamations duly made and issued in pursuance of the said power and authority as relate to the under-mentioned districts constituted for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, viz.: The Cambridge, Alexandra, Tauranga, Thames, Raglan, and Mohaka and Wairoa Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territories formerly comprised within the said districts shall be and the same are hereby divided for the purposes of the said Act into seven districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

HAMILTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a straight line from Putakauere on the Waikato River, in the direction of the summit of Te Aroha Mountain, to the intersection by said line of the western boundary of Te Aroha Block; thence by the western and northern boundary of Te Aroha Block to its intersection by a line drawn from the summit of Te Aroha to Whangamata South Head; thence southerly by such line to Te Aroha; thence by the Tauranga confiscated line to the southern boundary of Te Aroha Block; thence by the southern boundaries of Te Aroha, Hungahunga No. 2, Orongomairoa, and Waihekau Blocks to the intersection by a straight line drawn from the summit of Te Aroha to Pukemoremore; thence by that line and by the southern boundary of the Parish of Tamahere to the Waikato River; thence by the said river to the southern boundary of the Parish of Te Rapa; thence by the southern boundary lines of the Parishes of Te Rapa and Tuhikaramea to the Waipa River; thence by the said river to the southern boundary of the Parish of Karamu, and by said boundary to the summit of the Te Rehi Range, where the Native track crosses said range; and by a line to the summit of the Tera Ranges, and by the watershed of the said Tera and Hakarimata Ranges

to the northernmost end; thence by a straight line to the southern shore of Wangape Lake; thence by the shore of the lake to the north-east angle of Allotment No. 32 of the Parish of Wangape; thence by a straight line to the Waikato River at Putakauere, the point of commencement.

CAMBRIDGE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-west by the Hamilton Registration District hereinbefore described; thence towards the East by the Tauranga confiscated boundary to Poutihi; thence by a straight line to Te Whetu Native Settlement; thence by a straight line to the Waikato River at Ateamuri; thence towards the South and West by the said river to the mouth of the Little Waipa River; thence by a straight line to the summit of Maungatautari; thence by a straight line to the south end of the line forming the boundary between the Parishes of Puniu and Pukekura; thence by the western boundary of the Parish of Pukekura to the Hamilton Registration District.

TE AWAMUTU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North and East by the Hamilton and Cambridge Registration Districts to Ateamuri on the Waikato River; thence by a straight line to Lake Taupo at the mouth of the Waihora River; thence towards the South by a straight line to the summit of Pukearuhe; thence by a straight line to Te Rua Point on the West Coast; and towards the West by the coast line northwards into Kawhia Harbour to the mouth of the Kauri Creek; thence by a straight line to the summit of Pirongia; thence by the western boundary of the Parish of Pirongia to Te Rehi on the southern boundary of Hamilton Registration District.

TAURANGA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the sea from the south head of Whangamata River to the Whakatane River; towards the East by the Whakatane River aforesaid to its source; thence by a line to the source of the Ohiwa or Waikare River, and by that river to Lake Waikare-Moana; towards the South by the northern margin of Lake Waikare-Moana aforesaid; and thence by a straight line to Lake Taupo at the point where the Waikato River leaves said lake; thence by the northern shore of the lake

to the mouth of the Waihora River; thence towards the West by the Registration Districts of Te Awamutu, Cambridge, and Hamilton, to the summit of Te Aroha Mountain; thence by a straight line to the starting point at the south head of Whangamata.

#### THAMES DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Coromandel District; towards the North-east and North-west by the Mercury Bay District to the sea; towards the East by the sea to the south head of Whangamata Harbour; thence towards the South-east by a right line in the direction of the summit of Te Aroha Mountain to its intersection by the line of the northern boundary of Te Aroha Block; thence by the northern boundary of said block, and by a straight line from the western boundary of the said block, to Tahunatapu on the Piako River, on a line drawn from the summit of Te Aroha Mountain to Putakanere on the Waikato River; towards the West by the Piako River to its mouth, and by the Frith of Thames to the mouth of the Waikawau Creek.

#### RAGLAN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the southern shore of the Wangape Lake and by a straight line running west-south-west from the western angle of the Wangape Lake to the West Coast; on the West by the sea southward to Kawhia Harbour; on the South by Kawhia Harbour to the mouth of the Kauri Creek; thence on the South-east by a straight line to the summit of Pirongia; thence by the western boundary of the Parish of Pirongia to Te Rehi Range, on the southern boundary of Hamilton District, where the Native track crosses said range; thence by a line to the summit of the Tera Ranges, and by the watershed of the said Tera and Kakarimata Ranges to the northernmost end; thence by a straight line to the southern shore of Wangape Lake, the point of commencement.

#### WAIROA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by part of the south-western boundary of the Tauranga District, and the southern boundary of the Opotiki District; towards the North-east by the western and southern boundaries of the Turanga District, and by high-water mark of the sea to Table Cape; towards the South by high-water mark of the sea from Table Cape aforesaid to the Waikare River; thence by said river to its source, and by a right line thence to the parallel of latitude 39°; thence by the said parallel of latitude to the Upper Waikato River; and towards the West by the Upper Waikato River aforesaid to the southern margin of Lake Taupo; thence by part of the southern and the whole of the eastern margins of Lake Taupo to the south-western boundary of the Tauranga District, herein first mentioned.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

And whereas the Trustees of the Geraldine Public Cemetery have applied to the Governor to bring the said cemetery under the provisions of the said Act, and due inquiry has been made in pursuance of the said thirty-ninth section as to the desirability of granting such petition:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order and direct that all provisions of "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877," shall come into force in respect of the public cemetery at Geraldine, in the Provincial District of Canterbury, and known as the Geraldine Cemetery, as the same is described in the Schedule hereto: And in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me, I do, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, order and direct that this order shall come into force on the third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

18. Every company, including banking and insurance companies, carrying on business in New Zealand at the commencement of this Act, shall at all times be represented by a person residing in the colony; and a place within the colony shall be appointed from time to time by every such company as aforesaid at which any notices or other instruments affecting the company under this Act may be served or delivered.

(1.) Such person shall be called the "Public Officer" of the company for the purposes of this Act, and shall be appointed as follows:—

(a.) In the case of a company having a local Board of Directors or Managers resident in the colony, within three months after the passing of this Act:

(b.) In the case of a company not having such local Board as aforesaid, within six months after the passing of this Act.

The office of Public Officer shall be kept constantly filled by the making of fresh appointments thereto from time to time as may be necessary.

(2.) Every new company shall, within three months after it shall commence or enter into business after the passing of this Act, appoint a Public Officer, and name a place for delivery of notices as aforesaid.

(3.) Every company failing or neglecting, within the time hereinbefore limited in that behalf, to appoint a Public Officer, or name a place at which notices or other instruments may be served or delivered as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds a day for every day after the time aforesaid during which such neglect shall continue.
