A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," and "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the season in which the native game specified in the Schedule hereto shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in the Provincial Districts of Auckland, Hawke's Bay, Wellington, Taranaki, Marlborough, Nelson, Canterbury, Otago, and Westland, excepting within the County of Grey, shall be from the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, until the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, both days inclusive.

SCHEDULE.

NATIVE GAME: Wild duck of any species, bittern, pied stilt plover, wild geese, dotterell, native pigeon, teal, black stilt plover, curlew, quail.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section thirteen of Appendix H of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that

it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute into a hundred any portion of the Crown lands not forming part of any hundred previously proclaimed, notwithstanding that such lands or any part thereof shall be comprised within any pastoral lease or license heretofore or hereafter to be granted by the Crown under any law regulating the occupation or disposal of Crown lands, and whether or not the same shall have been included within the boundaries of any proclaimed gold field:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago have recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be proclaimed a hundred under the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient that effect should be given to the said recommendation of the Land Board:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim that the portion of the waste lands particularly described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted into a hundred, under and for the purposes of the said Act; and that it shall be called or known by the name set above the description of the said hundred in the Schedule hereto.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twelfth day of March, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas the Governor has, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, bearing date this eighteenth day of March, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto shall all be disposed of as small farm allotments.

Changing the Purpose of a Reserve and Vesting the same.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twelfth day of March, 1880.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto is a reserve purchased by the Superintendent of Southland, upon trust for the public service of the Province of Southland:

And whereas the said reserve is for one of the purposes named in Part I. of the Schedule to "The Public Reserves Act Amendment Act, 1878," and, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient to change the purpose of such reserve referred to in the Schedule hereto to another of the purposes named in the said Part I., as hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the sixth section of "The Public Reserves Act Amendment Act, 1878," doth hereby order and direct that the purpose of the reserve mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be changed from that of a reserve for the public service of the Province of Southland, and doth hereby declare and define the purposes of such reserve to be those specified in the second column of the said Schedule, the same being one of the purposes named in Part I. of the Schedule to the said Act.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in my opinion, there is some doubt or uncertainty as to the purpose for which the land described in the Schedule hereto was reserved and set apart:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the seventh section of "The Public Reserves Act Amendment Act, 1878," do hereby declare and define that the purpose for which the said land shall, from and after the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, be dedicated, shall be for a site for a sheep-dip, and quarantine purposes.

Decision of Court of Inquiry on Wreck of "Sophia" confirmed.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to confirm the following decision of the Court of Inquiry into the cause of the stranding of the schooner "Sophia," official number 70508, 200 tons register, William Burk, master, holding a South Australian certificate of service, No. 204.

The vessel struck on Bull Rock, off Portland Island, at 6 a.m., on the 28th January.

THAT Captain Burk was guilty of default, whereby the above shipping casualty was caused.

1. Though the lighthouse on Portland Island was first seen at 2 p.m. on the 28th, and its bearing observed, no other observation of it was made till 9.30 p.m. As when first observed it bore N.N.W., and ship's course was N.N.E., and going about four knots, even occasional noting of the ship's position by steering and by bearing of light must have shown that she was not keeping her N.N.E. course, but was setting in shore.

2. The captain, having no certificated mate, should have been extra careful, and remained on deck when in the vicinity of danger, but did not do so.

3. A cast of deep-sea lead would have shown him that he was too far in shore, but the lead was not hove.

I, therefore, suspend the certificate of Captain William Burk for one month, and further order him

to pay to the Clerk of the Court at Auckland the sum of £11 5s. as the cost of this inquiry.

BLUFF HARBOUR.

Two dolphins have been placed on the "middle spit," which lies to the north of the wharf, and between the two channels. One is on the extreme east end in 12 feet; it is surmounted by a cross, painted red and white in horizontal bands. The other is on the middle of the spit, in 4 feet, and surmounted by a Y-shaped beacon, painted red and white in diagonal bands. These, when kept in a line about N.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., lead through the deepest of the channel, in not less than 24 feet from the red cone buoy with staff and ball, till abreast of the lightship.

The sandy knoll laid down on the Admiralty charts about 3 cables length to the north-east of Starling Point, with 2 fathoms marked on it, has disappeared, and there is now 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms in that position.

The knoll, 2 cables length south of Tewaewae Point, marked 3 fathoms, has shoaled up and extended about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cables to the south, and there is only 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ to 2 fathoms over the whole area. A chequered buoy, black and white, has been placed on its north-west end, and a red buoy on its south-east; both are in 3 fathoms. When entering by the west channel the buoys must be left on the starboard hand, and on the port when entering by the north channel.

There is not less than 3 fathoms over the area to the south-east of the knoll, within a line between the outer red buoy in the west channel and the inner black buoy in the north channel.

The depths given are at low-water spring tides, and bearings magnetic.

DANGERS IN BAY OF PLENTY AND NEAR CAVALLI ISLAND, NORTH ISLAND, N.Z.

THE following dangers have recently been discovered in the Bay of Plenty:—

A shoal, consisting of a narrow ridge, with from 2 to 4 fathoms on it, deepening to 10 fathoms rather suddenly to the south and east, and more gradually to the westward, extends from the south end of Motiti Island for a full mile in a S.W. by S. direction.

A rocky patch (Tokeroa Shoal), about three quarters of a mile long in a S.W. direction by half a mile

broad, exists off Plate Island. The least water found was 3 fathoms, with the south end of Plate Island bearing N.E., distant one and a half miles.

Cavalli Island: A sunken rock has been reported to exist about one mile E.N.E. from Cavalli Island.

A SUNKEN rock (on which the "Sophia R. Luhrs" struck) has been found about 1½ cables length E. by S. from the end of the reef running out on the west side of Lyell Bay. This rock has only about 17 feet on it at low-water spring tides. Particular attention is directed to the directions given in "The New Zealand Pilot" (p. 127, edition of 1875): "Running for Port Nicholson from the northward or westward, with a fair wind, Cape Terawite should be passed at a distance of from two or three miles, and the continuous coast not approached nearer until arrived between Karori Rock and Sinclair Head, when a vessel may haul gradually up towards the latter, taking care to keep Pencarrow Lighthouse well open, and passing about one mile from the points of land to the eastward of Sinclair Head, until Barrett Reef opens out, when she may steer boldly for the southern end of the latter, passing it, if necessary, within ½ cable, as before described.

Alterations and Additions to the Rates for the Conveyance, Delivery, and Storage of Goods, Parcels, &c., on the New Zealand Railways.

THE following sections of the Property Assessment Act are published for general information.

18. Every company, including banking and insurance companies, carrying on business in New Zealand at the commencement of this Act, shall at all times be represented by a person residing in the colony; and a place within the colony shall be appointed from time to time by every such company as aforesaid at which any notices or other instruments affecting the company under this Act may be served or delivered.

(1.) Such person shall be called the "Public Officer" of the company for the purposes of this Act, and shall be appointed as follows:—

(a.) In the case of a company having a local Board of Directors or Managers resident in the colony, within three months after the passing of this Act:

(b.) In the case of a company not having such local Board as aforesaid, within six months after the passing of this Act.

The office of Public Officer shall be kept constantly filled by the making of fresh appointments thereto from time to time as may be necessary.

(2.) Every new company shall, within three months after it shall commence or enter into business after the passing of this Act, appoint a Public Officer, and name a place for delivery of notices as aforesaid.

(3.) Every company failing or neglecting, within the time hereinbefore limited in that behalf, to appoint a Public Officer, or name a place at which notices or other instruments may be served or delivered as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds a day for every day after the time aforesaid during which such neglect shall continue.

The Wairoa Confiscated Block, situated between the Rivers Wairoa and Waiau, is distant from Clyde, the port of the Wairoa, some 4½ miles, and is connected with it by a good dray road. The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

POPULATION.—In the case of Nelson the population is given according to the estimate for January, 1879, as the local authorities have not yet supplied the information necessary to enable the estimate to be corrected. In the other cases the estimates are for the 1st January, 1880.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 437, against 511 in January, being a decrease of 74. The deaths amounted to 217 in February, being an increase of 34 on the number in January.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 128; females, 89. 113 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 52.07 per cent. of the whole number; 89 of these were of children under one year of age.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin that were registered during the month of February, 1880.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 235 in February, against 295 in January, a decrease of 60.

The deaths in February were 137, against 118 in January, an increase of 19.

There were 6 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards, viz., 2 males of 78 and 83 years at Auckland; 2 males of 65 and 73, and 1 female of 65, at Christchurch; and 1 male of 77 at Wellington.

Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was somewhat greater in February than in January; the deaths having been 54 in February, against 50 in January. The mortality from dysentery and diarrhoea caused the number to be so large. Of the 41 deaths from these two complaints, 18 occurred in Christchurch and 20 in Wellington, of which 25 were of children under one year, viz., 10 in Christchurch and 15 in Wellington. Only 2 deaths (both in Christchurch) occurred from typhoid fever.

Constitutional Diseases caused slightly fewer deaths than in January.

Local Diseases caused 43 deaths in February, against 35 in January. Of these, diseases of the digestive organs caused 7 deaths in January and 15 in February.

Violent Deaths.—These deaths amounted to 7, of which 1 was homicidal and 2 were suicidal.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
