Amended Proclamation of Shooting Season, Marlborough.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made under "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," dated the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, it was, amongst other things, enacted that cock-pheasants and Californian quail may be hunted, shot, taken, or killed between the first day of May and the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, within the Electoral District of Picton: And whereas it is expedient to amend such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that cock-pheasants and Californian quail shall be open to be hunted, shot, taken, or killed, within the Provincial District of Marlborough, from the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, but only between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Southland.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Thursday, the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Invercargill, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

IN pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to by-law forty-eight, as fixed by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and doth declare that the same shall come into force from the day of the date hereof:—

ADDITION TO BY-LAW 48.

Ledger accounts will be allowed to merchants and others doing above an average amount of business with the railways, which average amount will from time to time be fixed by the Minister. All ledger accounts will be rendered weekly, and if not paid within one week after the account is rendered the ledger account will be closed, and the amount due collected forthwith. No claim upon the Government will be allowed as a set off against a ledger account or other claim of the railways. All accounts must be paid as rendered, and any ascertained errors will be adjusted in the next account.

WHEREAS by "The Rabbit Nuisance Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," it is enacted that, in addition to the power of proclaiming districts given by the third section of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876," the Governor might from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that any part of the colony to be defined therein should be a rabbit district for the purposes of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876:"

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eleventh section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that that portion of the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Wellington, and known as the Waverley Recreation-ground, and

described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Wellington, being portion of the Town Belt of Waverley Township, containing by admeasurement 126 acres 3 roods 9 perches, more or less. WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive

Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the Waverley Local Board, who shall be known as the Waverley Domain Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at four o'clock p.m., at the Waverley Local Board Office, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—
 The births were 273 in April, against 293 in March, an increase of 20.
 The deaths in April were 102, against 125 in March, a decrease of 23.
 There were 6 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards, viz., 1 male of 70 at Auckland; 2 males of 69 and 76, and 2 females of 68 and 72, at Wellington; and 1 male of 78 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases decreased from 62 in March to 40 in April. The deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea having been 21 in April, against 49 in March, but the deaths from typhoid fever increased from 7 in March to 12 in April. In April there were 12 deaths from rheumatic fever; no deaths from that cause having occurred in March.

Constitutional Diseases caused 18 deaths in April, against 17 in March.

Local Diseases caused 26 deaths in April; the deaths from diseases of this class having been 32 in March, and 43 in February.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
