*Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858."*

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of a Proclamation duly made and issued on the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, as relates to the New Plymouth and Patea Districts, constituted for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof were therein set forth, and do proclaim and declare that the territories formerly comprised within the said districts shall be and the same are hereby divided for the purposes of the Act into four districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

INGLEWOOD DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Taranaki, and bounded towards the North from the River Waiwakaiho at the north-west corner of Section 52 in Hua and Waiwakaiho Hundred, by Sections 48, 44, and 45 of that hundred, by Sections 32, 41, 80, 55, and 203 of Tarurutangi Survey District, by Sections 127, 115, 116, 206, and 207, Huirangi Survey District, to a point on the southern boundary of last mentioned section where the eastern side of Suffolk Road produced intersects it, thence by a right line to the Kurapete River at the south-east corner of Section 238, thence by that river to its confluence with the Manganui River; towards the East by the Manganui River to Block VI., Huirao Survey District, thence by Blocks II. and III.; towards the East by Blocks VIII., XII., and XVI. of said district, and IV. of Ngaere Survey District; towards the South by the Patea River to its source, thence by a line to the summit of Mount Egmont; towards the West by a line from the summit of Mount Egmont to the source

of the Waiwakaiho River, and by said river to the starting point.

NEW PLYMOUTH DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Taranaki, and bounded towards the North by the River Mokau from its mouth to its source; towards the East and South-east by a right line, thence to a point on the Tuhua River at which the 39th parallel of south latitude intersects it, thence by that river and the Wanganui River to a point at which the Taumatamahoe track intersects that river, thence by a right line in the direction of the mouth of the Patea River to the confiscation boundary; towards the south-west by that boundary to the Patea River, thence by that river to the Inglewood Registration District, hereinbefore described; and thence towards the West, South, and again towards the East by that district to the summit of Mount Egmont; again towards the South-east by a right line to the source of the River Taungatara, and by that river to the sea; and towards the West by the sea to the mouth of the Mokau River, the starting point.

HAWERA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Taranaki, bounded towards the North-west by the New Plymouth District, hereinbefore described; towards the North-east by the Inglewood District, hereinbefore described, and the said New Plymouth District, to the confiscation boundary; thence towards the East by a right line to the source of the Manawapou River, and by that river to the sea; and towards the South-west by the sea to the mouth of the Taungatara River, the starting point.

PATEA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial Districts of Taranaki and Wellington, bounded towards the North-west by the Hawera District, hereinbefore described; towards the North-east by the confiscation boundary to its intersection with the Waitotara River; towards the South-east by that river; and towards the South-west by the sea.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke so much of a Proclamation made and issued on the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, as relates to the New Plymouth and Patea Districts, constituted for the purposes of "The Registration Act, 1858," the boundaries of which were therein set forth, and do proclaim and declare that the territories formerly comprised within the said districts shall be and the same are hereby divided for the purposes of "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," into four districts, the names whereof shall be the Inglewood District, New Plymouth District, Hawera District, and Patea District, and the boundaries of the said districts shall be coterminous with the boundaries of districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act Amendment Act, 1858;" and I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

*Regulations respecting Prospecting Licenses to search for Gold outside Mining Districts, under "The Mines Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879."*

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.  
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by "The Mines Act 1877

Amendment Act, 1879," I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim that the following regulations respecting prospecting licenses to search for gold upon Crown lands outside mining districts shall be in force from the date hereof:—

1. Every person desirous of obtaining a prospecting license to search for gold upon Crown lands outside any mining district shall apply for such license to the Governor, by delivering to the Commissioner of Crown Lands of the provincial district in which the land is situated an application containing the name of the locality or district in which he desires to prospect.

2. The fee (payable upon application) for the prospecting license shall be one pound.

3. The license shall be for any term not exceeding twelve months, and shall be in the form hereunto annexed.

FORM OF LICENSE.

KNOW all men that I, \_\_\_\_\_, being in that behalf duly authorized by His Excellency the Governor, do hereby, in pursuance of "The Mines Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," give to \_\_\_\_\_, of \_\_\_\_\_, in consideration of the sum of one pound by him duly paid, full license and authority to enter upon the Crown lands herein described, viz., \_\_\_\_\_

for the purpose of searching for gold.

And this license shall be in force for twelve calendar months from the date hereof; but shall in no case be deemed to prevent the sale of any Crown lands over which the license may extend.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of May, 1880.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eleventh section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Auckland, and known as the Mount Hobson Recreation-ground, and described

in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land known as the Mount Hobson Reserve, containing by admeasurement 23 acres 1 rood, more or less, being Lot 2A, Section XI, Suburbs of the City of Auckland. Bounded towards the North and North-east by a road 100 links wide, 956 links, 306 links, and 794 links; towards the South-east and East by Lots 4, 5, and 6 of the said section, 515 links, 277 links, 157 links, and 738 links; towards the South-west by Lot No. 7 of the said section, 1009 links; and towards the West by Lots 2 and 3 of the said section, 1300 and 522 links.

*Powers delegated to the Mount Hobson Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of May, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Mount Hobson Domain Board:—

DAVID B. CRUICKSHANK

herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at Brunswick Buildings, Queen Street, Auckland, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to

each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

*Vaccination Districts constituted.*
