Defining the Middle Line of Portion of Branch Line of Railway from Otautau to Nightcaps (Western Railways), Waicola Section.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the branch line of railway from Otautau to Nightcaps (Western Railways) is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway, and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that belief, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point on Section eleven, Aparima Hundred, to a point in deferred-payment reserve, the said point distant about one hundred and twenty chains in a northerly direction from Trig. Station F; all within the Provincial District of Otago. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 7730, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Invercargill, in the Provincial District of Otago.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point on Section No. 11, Aparima Hundred, in the Provincial District of Otago, Colony of New Zealand, said point being the point of termination of the Opio Section of the Otautau to Nightcaps Railway, as described in the Proclamation dated the 30th May, 1879, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 60, of the 5th June, 1879; proceeding thence generally in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 7 miles 60 chains or thereabouts, and passing in, through, over, or into the following territorial divisions, viz.: The said Aparima Hundred, Sections 11 and 15; Wairio District—Deferred-payment reserve, Sections numbered respectively 52, 50, 48, and 5, and a deferred-payment reserve; and all intervening places, lands, reserves, streams, and watercourses; and terminating at a point in the last above-mentioned deferred-payment reserve; the point of termination being distant about 120 chains in a northerly direction from Trig. Station F; in the manner delineated on a plan marked P.W.D. 7730, which plan is signed by the Honourable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Invercargill, Provincial District of Otago.

Land taken for Road in Motueka Survey District, Highway District of Motueka, County of Waimea.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road through the hereinafter mentioned sections:

And whereas the Motueka Highway Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by

the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

Again commencing at a point on the south side of the main line of road along the south bank of the Motueka River, the said point being north of and 590 links distant from the boundary line between Sections 1 and 75 (measured along centre of new road); thence by lines in a southerly and westerly direction to a point on the south side of the main line of road along the south bank of the Motueka River, the said point being 1781 links north-east of and distant from the boundary line between Sections 75 and 2 (measured along the old road), 4238 links: containing by admeasurement 2 acres 2 roods 6 perches, more or less. Sections 2 and 3, Block IX.: 9th. Again com-

mencing at a point on the main line of road, the said point being 2966 links (measured along the old road) south-west of and distant from the boundary line between Sections 75 and 2; thence by lines in a south-westerly direction to a point on the main line of road, the said point being 3416 links (measured along the old road) north-east of and distant from the boundary line between Sections 3 and 4, 3796 links: containing by admeasurement 2 acres 1 rood 4 perches, more or less.

Section 4, Block IX.: 10th. Again commencing at a point on the main line of road, the said point being 3207 links (measured along the old road) south-west of and distant from the boundary line between Sections 3 and 4; thence by lines in a south-westerly direction along the bank of the Motueka River, 458 links: containing by admeasurement 1 rood 16

perches, more or less.

Section 5, Block XIII.: 11th. Again commencing at a point on the main line of road, the said point being 3345 links (measured along the old road) west

or thereabouts: containing by admeasurement 3 of and distant from the south-western corner of Section 19; thence by a line in a north-westerly direction along the east bank of the Motueka River, 556 links: containing by admeasurement 1 rood 30

perches, more or less.

Sections 20 and 48, Block XIII.: 12th. Again commencing at a point on the main line of road, the said point being 2380 links (measured along the road) north of and distant from the boundary line between Sections 20 and 48; thence by an irregular boundary along the road now in use, and by lines along the new road to a point on the main line of road on the bank of the Motueka River, 1689 links (measured along the road) south of and distant from the boundary line between Sections 20 and 48, 4069 links: containing by admeasurement 3 acres and 1 perch, more or less.

Be all the aforesaid measurements either more or less, as the same is more particularly delineated upon the map marked P.W.D. 7449, and attached to the memorial above referred to.

Repealing "The Land-Tax Act, 1878."

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section ninety-seven of "The Property Assessment Act, 1879," it is enacted that "The Land-Tax Act, 1878," is hereby repealed: Provided that this repeal shall not affect the past operation of the Act hereby repealed, or the sufficiency or insufficiency, validity or invalidity, of anything done or suffered, or the payment or recovery of any duty or land tax which may have or may hereafter become payable to Her Majesty under the said Act; nor shall this repeal interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed, or the recovery of any penalty or

forfeiture incurred, against or under the said Act:
And by the ninety-eighth section of "The Property
Assessment Act, 1879," it is enacted that this Act,
with the exception of section ninety-seven of this Act, shall come into operation on the day on which it is assented to by the Governor in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty; and section ninety-seven of this Act shall come into operation on such day after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, as the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, declare

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in exercise of the power and authority in me vested by the ninety-eighth section of "The Property Assessment Act, 1879," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the above-recited

section ninety-seven of the said Act shall come into operation on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and the same shall be in operation accordingly on and from such lastmentioned day.

Redefining Districts under "The Licensing Act, 1873."

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1873," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the said Act, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, define such territorial divisions as he may think proper to be licensing districts for the purposes of the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the Districts of Whangarei Heads, Whangarei, and Mangapai were, amongst others, constituted under the said "Licensing Act, 1873:" And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the District of Bay of Islands was constituted under the said "Licensing Act, 1873:" And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said Districts of Whangarei Heads and Mangapai, and to alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Districts of Whangarei and Bay of Islands:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Act, and of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby abolish the said Districts of Whangarei Heads and Mangapai, and do hereby alter and redefine the boundaries of the said Districts of Whangarei and Bay of Islands, as the same are set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

WHANGAREI DISTRICT.

ALL that parcel of land in the Colony of New Zealand, bounded towards the North-west by a right line from the most easterly peak of the Tutamoe Range to the north-west corner of Opuawhanga No. 4 Block; thence by lines forming the north-western boundaries of said block to the sea at Helena Bay; thence towards the East by the sea to the north head of the Ruakaka River; thence towards the South-east by a right line to the south-eastern angle of the Parish of Mangapai, and thence by lines forming the south-eastern boundaries of the said parish; towards the South-west by lines forming the south-western boundaries of the said parish; again towards the East, South, and South-west by lines forming the east, south, and south-western boundaries of the Parish of Ruarangi to the Tauraroa River; and thence by that river to the western boundary of the Parish of Maungakaramea; thence towards the West by lines forming the western boundaries of the said parish to the Waionepu River; again towards the South-west by a right line from thence to the confluence of the Mangakahia River with the Wairoa River; thence towards the North-west by the Wairua River to the confluence of the Maungaharuru River; thence again towards the South by a right line to the most easterly peak of the Tutamoe Range, the starting point.

BAY OF ISLANDS DISTRICT.

All that parcel of land in the Colony of New Zealand, bounded towards the North by the Mongonui, Totara, Kaco, and Whangaroa Highway Districts, from Raetea to the mouth of the Takou River; thence towards the East by the sea to Helena Bay; towards the South-east by the Opuawhanga No. 4 Block, and a right line from the north-west corner of the said block to the most easterly peak of the Tutamoe Range; thence towards the West by a right line to the south-western point of the Omapere Lake; thence

by a right line to the summit of a hill at Okaihau, called Te Pare-o-Kawa; thence towards the Southwest by a right line to the summit of Raetea, the

starting point.

W HEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that,

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the

Native Land Court:

And whereas by orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named, and under the disabilities described, in the fourth column in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the

And whereas at a sitting of the Native Land Court of New Zealand, held at Kaiapoi, in the County of Ashley, and the Provincial District of Canterbury, on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in pursuance of an Order in Council, made on the fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, under and by virtue of "The Kaiapoi Native Reserves Act, 1877," certain orders were made by the Court awarding the several parcels of land set forth and described in the First Schedule to the lastly afore-recited Act, and referred to in the first column of the Schedule hereto, to the several aboriginal Natives in the said several orders named:

portion or portions thereof respectively, from any places beyond the limits of the said colony whatso-ever.
