Amended Proclamation of Shooting Season for Lake County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made under "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," dated the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, it was, amongst other things, enacted,

that cock-pheasants and Californian quail may be hunted, shot, taken, or killed between the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and hares between the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, within the Lake County: And whereas it is expedient to amend such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that that part of the said Proclamation above recited is hereby revoked, and that Californian quail, only, shall be open to be shot, taken, or killed, between the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, within the said Lake County.

Addition to Wairau Gold Field.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, GOVERNOR.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," made by the Governor, and bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, certain boundaries were appointed to be the limits of the Wairau Gold Field:

And whereas by the sixth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the colony to be a mining district under this Act, to assign boundaries to such district, to enlarge, contract, or otherwise alter such boundaries, and to declare by what local name every such district shall be designated; and, until the Governor shall otherwise order, every gold field duly proclaimed or constituted at the time of the commencement of this Act shall be and be deemed a mining district under this Act:

And whereas it is desirable and expedient to enlarge the boundaries of the said gold field:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by "The Mines Act, 1877," do hereby proclaim and order that the said mining district shall be and the same is hereby enlarged, so that such mining district shall include the land described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Marlborough, bounded towards the North-west and North by the summit of the watershed between the Wairau and Pelorus Valleys; towards the North-east by the summit of the watershed between the Pine Valley Stream and the Cat Valley Stream to a point due west of the north-west angle of Section No. 34, Pine Valley Survey District; thence again towards the North by a right line due east to the north-west angle aforesaid; again towards the North-east by said Section No. 34 and Sections Nos. 33, 32, and 31 of said survey district to a road, and thence by that road to the Wairau River; towards the South-east by that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section No. 58, Mount Olympus Survey District; thence towards the West to and by that section and by a right line, being the eastern boundary of said

Section No. 58, produced to the summit of the range; thence by lines forming the western and northern boundaries of Oddstone Run to Hillersden Cattle Run, and thence by lines forming the western boundary of said Hillersden Run to the summit of the watershed: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Blenheim.

Appointing Trustees under "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eighth day of June, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant, or lunatic, or other person under legal disability, shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas by orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended

to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disabilities described in the fourth column in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the infants named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees, within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts, for the said infants during the term or terms of their minority ; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, or memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

Fixing Sittings of District Court of Westland.

HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in this behalf enabling me, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby fix and appoint that sittings of the District Court of Westland shall be held as follow:—

In the Supreme Courthouse at Hokitika, for civil business, on the seventeenth day of January, the thirteenth day of March, the fifteenth day of May, the twelfth day of July, the thirteenth day of September, and the fifteenth day of November; and for criminal and civil business on the fourteenth day of February, the seventeenth day of April, the twelfth day of June, the sixteenth day of August, the eighteenth day of October, and the tenth day of December, in each year.

In the Resident Magistrate's Courthouse at Grey-mouth, for civil business, on the twentieth day of January, the sixteenth day of March, the eighteenth day of May, the fifteenth day of July, the sixteenth day of September, and the eighteenth day of November; for criminal and civil business on the seventeenth day of February, the twentieth day of April, the fifteenth day of June, the nineteenth day of August, the twenty-first day of October, and the thirteenth day of December, in each year.

In the Resident Magistrate's Courthouse at Reefton, for criminal and civil business, on the twenty-third day of February, the twenty-sixth day of April, the twenty-first day of June, the twenty-fifth day of August, the twenty-seventh day of October, and the seventeenth day of December, in each year.

In the Resident Magistrate's Courthouse at West-

port, for criminal and civil business, on the twenty-seventh day of January, the twenty-third day of March, the twenty-fifth day of May, the twenty-second day of July, the twenty-third day of September, and the twenty-fifth day of November in each year.

Provided that in case any of the days so fixed as aforesaid shall happen to be a Sunday or a holiday, then the Court appointed for that day shall be holden on the first day thereafter not being a Sunday or a holiday.

Provided, further, that this warrant shall not take effect till the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.
