Proclaiming Part of South Auckland Cattle District free from Disease.—Notice No. 72.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor has received the certificate required by the twenty-fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1871" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to the effect that the South Auckland Cattle District is free from the disease called pleuro-pneumonia, with the exception of the following places:—

The farm of Richard Burke, at Te Awamutu; and

The whole of the estate in the district belonging to the Waikato Land Association;

which two places remain infected places under the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare the said South Auckland Cattle District, with the exceptions above mentioned, to be free from disease; and such district, with the exceptions as aforesaid, shall, from the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, cease to be infected within the meaning of the said Act.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is, amongst other things, enacted that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New Zealand until the Governor of the said colony shall signify, by speech or message, to the Legislative Council or House of Representatives of the said colony, or by Proclamation, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and the House of Representatives of the said colony, No. 49, of 1879, entitled "An Act to amend the Law relating to the Administration of the Estates of Deceased Persons," was presented to the Governor of the said colony for Her Majesty's assent, and the said Bill was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the said in part recited Act, do, by this Proclamation, signify and proclaim to all whom it may concern that the said Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Revocation of Exemption of certain Land from Occupation for Mining, &c., Purposes within the Nelson South-West Gold Field Mining District.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, His Excellency the Governor did proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto was exempted from occupation for mining purposes, or for water-races, dams, or reservoirs, or for machine, business, or residence sites:

And whereas it is expedient and desirable that the said exemption should be revoked:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the eighth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," do hereby revoke the exemption contained in the Proclamation above mentioned, and referring to the land described in the First Schedule hereto; save and except the lands described in the Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules hereto.

A BREADTH of one mile on each side of the Waimangaroa River, beginning at the crossing of the Westport and Ngakawau Railway, and extending up the river to the confluence of the south branch with main stream.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventh day of July, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twentieth section of “The Westland and Nelson Coal Fields Administration Act, 1877,” it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, reserve such portions of the lands described in the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules to the said Act, which, in his opinion, are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto are lands subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said section, and, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient to reserve the same for the purposes therein named:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of the above recited power, and by and with the consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby order and direct that the lands mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule hereto shall be reserved, and doth hereby declare and define the purposes of the said reserve to be that specified in the second column of the said Schedule, the same being the purposes named in the twentieth section of the said Act.

“The Highways Act, 1871,” brought into operation within the Eparaima Highway District, County of Waipawa.

HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Hawke's Bay intituled “The Highways Act, 1871,” it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Superintendent might, from time to time, on the requisition of five voters, by notification in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, bring that Act into operation in any district, and thereupon, but not previously, that Act should come into and remain in full operation therein; and in such notification the day, hour, and place of meeting for the first meeting of ratepayers for such district should be appointed: And whereas, under the provisions of the said Act, a portion of the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay has been created a highway district by the name of the Eparaima Highway District: And whereas the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now, by “The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875,” vested in the Governor: And whereas His Excellency the Governor has received a requisition signed by five voters of the Eparaima District, in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, requesting him to bring the said Act into operation in the said Eparaima District:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do, by this notification, bring “The Highways Act, 1871,” into operation within the Eparaima Highway District, and do declare that the first meeting of ratepayers under the said Act shall be held at the Wallingford Hotel, on the seventeenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, at two o'clock p.m.

Defining Limits of Whangarei Township Highway District for the Purposes of the Auckland Municipal Police Acts.

HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by Acts of the Provincial Council of the Province of Auckland intituled "The Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1866," and "The Municipal Police Act 1866 Amendment Act, 1871," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Superintendent may from time to time, by public notification in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, appoint and define the limits of cities, towns, and other places within the Province of Auckland for the purposes of the said Acts: And it is also enacted that the Superintendent may from time to time, by public notification in the Provincial Government *Gazette*, appoint such person or public body, as he shall think fit, to be the local authority thereafter referred to for any city, town, or other place to which those Acts should be applicable, and may alter and revoke such appointment:

And whereas the powers vested in the Superintendent by the said Act are now, by the operation of "The Abolition of Provinces, 1875," vested in the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Acts, do by this notification appoint and define the limits of the Whangarei Township Highway District, as such limits are set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of "The Auckland Municipal Police Act, 1866," and do hereby declare that, from and after the date hereof, the said Act shall apply to the said Whangarei Township Highway District, so defined as aforesaid.

And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby name the day of the date hereof as the day on and from which sections two, three, four, and five of the said "Municipal Police Act 1866 Amendment Act, 1871," shall come into force within the limits of the said Whangarei Township Highway District; and I do hereby give notice that I hereby appoint the District Board of the said Whangarei Township Highway District to be the local authority for the purposes of the said Act.

ALL that block of land commencing at the northernmost angle of Dr. Perston's land, known as Rahi. chains to the eastward of the south-western angle of Allotment No. 1 of the Parish of Parahaki; thence by a right line crossing the Whangarei River aforesaid to the river termination of the easternmost boundary of Dr. Perston's land aforesaid, and by said eastern boundary to the southern boundary of Dr. Perston's land aforesaid; towards the South and South-west by the southern and south-western boundaries of Dr. Perston's land aforesaid to its westernmost angle, the point of commencement: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Auckland.

And whereas by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said one hundred and forty-fourth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the several warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the *Gazettes* specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

415. The Act 15 and 16 Vict., c. 26 (1852), enables the Crown to carry into effect arrangements with foreign Powers for the apprehension and surrender of seamen, not being slaves, who may desert from merchant vessels belonging to a subject of such Powers when within Her Majesty's dominions. The following list shows the arrangements (in the shape of treaties, conventions, agreements, declarations, notifications, and Orders in Council) at present existing between Great Britain and the foreign Powers named for the mutual surrender of merchant seamen deserters:—

WHEREAS by "The Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign Power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such Power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being German subjects) who desert from British merchant ships in the territories belonging to His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Germany, will be given under an agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Germany, signed at London on the 5th November, 1879:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Emperor of Germany within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always that, if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions, he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence, if any, has been fully carried into effect.

And Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is further pleased to order and declare that, upon and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, the Order in Council made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 16th day of October, 1852, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 26th day of October, 1852, so far as it relates to seamen who desert from merchant ships belonging to citizens of the Free Hanseatic Cities of Lubeck, Bremen, and Hamburg, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Prussia, made by virtue of the said Act, on the 16th day of October, 1852, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 26th day of October, 1852, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Grand Duke of Oldenburg, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 13th day of June, 1853, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 14th day of June, 1853, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the Grand Duke of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 9th day of March, 1854, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 10th day of March, 1854, and the Order in Council relating to seamen who desert from the merchant ships belonging to subjects of the King of Hanover, made, by virtue of the said Act, on the 8th day of June, 1854, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 13th day of June, 1854, shall be revoked, and the same are hereby revoked accordingly.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AGREEMENT between the Governments of Great Britain and Germany relative to Merchant Seamen Deserters.—Signed at London, November 5, 1879.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, being desirous, for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows:—

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the Contracting Parties, within any port in the territories or in the possessions or colonies of the other Contracting Party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession or colony, shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the Consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the deputy or representative of the Consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to subjects of the country where the desertion shall take place.

Each of the two High Contracting Parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present agreement, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.
