Defining the Middle Line of further Portion of the Wellington to Napier Railway (further Portion of Wellington Station).

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Wellington to Napier is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is therein declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and in exercise of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point opposite the Pipitea Railway Station, in the City of Wellington, to a point on the southern boundary of Ballance Street, Thorndon Reclamation, in the said city, all within the Provincial District of Wellington, Colony of New Zealand, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 7827, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honorable Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point opposite the Pipitea Railway Station, Wellington, the said point being within the limits of deviation of a portion of the railway from Wellington to Masterton, as described in the Proclamation dated the 18th September, 1872, and pub-

lished in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 49, of the 25th September, 1872, and proceeding thence in a generally south-westerly direction for a distance of 44.85 chains or thereabouts, and terminating at a point on the southern boundary of Ballance Street, Thorndon Reclamation; all within the Provincial District of Wellington, and Colony of New Zealand; in the manner delineated upon the map marked P.W.D. 7827, signed by the Hon. Richard Oliver, Minister for Public Works, deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington; the total length being 44.85 chains or thereabouts.

Land set apart on Deferred Payments in Taranaki.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Taranaki did, on the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Saturday, the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at New Plymouth, and at the District Land Office in Carlyle, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection maps in those offices.

In pursuance of section four of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby declare that subsection four of the sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," shall not apply to any of the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

Lands taken for Harbour Works, Lyttelton.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the lands described in the First Schedule hereto are required to be taken under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for certain works, to wit, the reclamation of a portion of the Lyttelton Harbour, at Dampier's Bay, and the construction of a graving dock therein: And whereas the Lyttelton Harbour Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby taken for the purposes of harbour works; and that, from and after the fifteenth day of July, one thousand eight

hundred and eighty, the lands so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, to be used for harbour works.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Lot 2. Declaring certain Lands to be a Portion of the Waimea Water-race.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation publicly notified and gazetted, declare any land therein specified, whether within or without, or partly within and partly without, a proclaimed gold-field, to be a water-race: And whereas by "The Public Works Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Minister shall cause a map of such water-race to be deposited in the Warden's Court of the district in which such land is; and such map shall be referred to in and shall form part of any such Proclamation: And whereas, for the purpose of supplying with water a portion of the proclaimed gold field known as the Westland Gold Field, there has been constructed within such proclaimed gold field a water-race, called the Waimea Water-race:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the hereinbefore recited Acts, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby declared to be portion of a water-race for the purposes of the said Acts, called the Waimea Water-race; and that the said lands are shown on a map marked P.W.D. 7834, deposited in the Warden's Court at Kumara, in the Provincial District of Westland.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 5 acres 3 roods 11 perches, more or less, commencing at a point on the western boundary of Section No. 1357, distant 17 links from the north-west corner. To His Excellency Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

SIR,—Pursuant to directions contained in an Order in Council dated the 13th day of April, 1878, I have the honor respectfully to report:—

2. That the Native Land Court, having, for the purpose of hearing the Native claims to the Himatangi Block, sat at Foxton, near the block, and taken full evidence concerning those claims, has decided,—

3. That the land known as the Himatangi Block, containing 11,000 acres, more or less, as set forth in the First Schedule of "The Himatangi Crown Grants Act, 1877," is the property of the persons whose names are hereafter set forth, and in the manner, quantity, and proportions hereafter respectively described, that is to say,—

4. That a wahi tapu or burial-place, now reserved, and consisting of 3 acres of land, as more particularly described in the First Schedule to this report, should be granted to Roira Rangiheua, Petihira te Kuru, and Renata Ropiha, as trustees, to preserve and administer such burial-place for the use of the Ngatiteau, the Ngatitiranga, and the Ngatitiranga hapus, and that the grant should be absolutely restricted from alienation.

5. That the remaining 10,997 acres of land in the block are the property of the persons whose names are hereafter written in list marked "A" of persons entitled to share in the said block, and whose individual shares, whether defined geographically or not, are equal; that is to say, that each person so named possesses $\frac{1}{37}$ th part of the said area of 10,997 acres, but that such share or portion shall be taken in the following manner, namely:—

6. That the ten persons of the Ngatiteau hapu whose names are written first in the said list "A" shall receive their undivided shares, equal in the aggregate to $\frac{1}{37}$ ths of the said area of 10,997 acres, in that portion of the block lying next to its northern boundary, and that such portion shall be bounded on the South by a line on a bearing of $111^{\circ} 11'$.

7. That the next twenty-eight persons named in the said list, that is Nos. 11 to 38 inclusive, being members of the Ngatitiranga hapu, shall receive their undivided shares, equal in the aggregate to $\frac{2}{37}$ ths of the said area of 10,997 acres, in that portion of the block

lying next to the south of the portion allotted as above to the Ngatiteau hapu, and that such portion shall be bounded on the South by a line on a bearing of $111^{\circ} 11'$.

8. That the next eighteen persons named in the said list, namely, Nos. 39 to 56 inclusive, being also a section of the Ngatitiranga hapu, shall receive their undivided shares, equal in the aggregate to $\frac{3}{37}$ ths of the said area of 10,997 acres, in that portion of the block lying next to the south of the part last above-described, and that such portion shall be bounded on the South by a line on a bearing of $111^{\circ} 11'$.

9. That the next sixteen persons named in the said list, namely, Nos. 57 to 72 inclusive, being members of the Ngatirakau hapu, shall receive their undivided shares, equal in the aggregate to $\frac{4}{37}$ ths of the said area of 10,997 acres, in that portion of the block lying next to the south of the portion last above described, and that such portion shall be bounded on the South by a line on a bearing of $111^{\circ} 11'$.

10. And that the last fifteen persons named in the said list, namely, Nos. 73 to 87 inclusive, being also members of a section of the Ngatirakau hapu, shall receive their undivided shares, equal in the aggregate to $\frac{5}{37}$ ths of the said area of 10,997 acres, in that part of the block lying next to the south of the portion last above described, and extending to the southern boundary of the block, as described in the First Schedule to "The Himatangi Crown Grants Act, 1877."
