as the same is defined in a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, shall be extended to one hundred pounds.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section ten of "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance, 1874," it is enacted that, if from any cause whatever,

the persons entitled to vote at any election for any subdivision of any district shall fail or neglect to hold an election of members of the District Board of such district on the day appointed by the said Ordinance for that purpose, it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to appoint a day for the holding of such election, and an election may be held upon the day so appointed, and the election so held shall for all purposes whatsoever be deemed to have been duly held on the day appointed by the said Ordinance for holding the same: And whereas the powers and authorities vested in the Superintendent by the said section are, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," now vested in the Governor: And whereas the persons entitled to vote in the election of members for the South Wyndham Road District failed on the day appointed by "The Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," to hold an election:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Ordinance and Act, do hereby proclaim and appoint that an election shall be held on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, of members of the Road Board of the South Wyndham Road District.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Education Act, 1877," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby make the following regulation respecting the class books to be used in public schools, that is to say,—

1. The book entitled "English History for Schools," by John Curnow (George Philip and Son, London), and the several parts of the book entitled "Elementary Linear Drawing," by David C. Hutton (issued by the Education Department), may be used in any public school as if they had been described and included in the list of works set forth in the Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

2. This regulation shall come into force on the date hereof.

WHEREAS by the fourth section of "The Lunatics Act, 1868" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to order or direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary, by the said Act, within any province or other district of the colony, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such province, or by any other person the Governor may think fit, subject, however, to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit; and thereupon such functions, powers, duties, and authorities may, by such Superintendent or other person, be exercised or performed within the province or other district of the colony specified in such order; and in like manner to alter or revoke any such order:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the powers granted to the Colonial Secretary under the seventy-fourth and seventy-fifth sections of the said Act were delegated to George Lilly Mellish, to be exercised by him within the Canterbury District:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the delegations of the powers granted to the said George Lilly Mellish under the said sections, and to delegate the said powers in manner hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth, by this present order, revoke the aforesaid delegation to the said George Lilly Mellish, and doth hereby delegate to

JOHN MARSHMAN

the powers granted to the Colonial Secretary under the seventy-fourth and seventy-fifth sections of the said Act, and doth hereby order that the said powers shall be exercised by the said John Marshman within the said Canterbury District.

Powers delegated to the Oxford Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, bearing date the eighteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, made and issued under the authority of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," "The Public Domains Act, 1865," and "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," certain powers were, in respect of certain lands referred to in a further Order in Council of the same date, made and issued under "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," aforesaid, delegated to Joseph Pearson, senior, Richard Perham, John Mullins, John Rhodes Pearson, and John R. Gorton:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Domains Act, 1860," aforesaid, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council delegating the Governor's powers to the above-named persons; and do hereby further delegate, in respect of the lands referred to in the aforesaid Orders in Council, all the powers conferred by "The Public Domains Act, 1860," except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Oxford Domain Board:—

JOSEPH PEARSON, Senior,
JOHN MULLINS,
JOHN R. GORTON,
GEORGE PLASKETT, and
WILLIAM FISHER PEARSON

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the office of the Oxford Road Board, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become

vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

Appointment of Resident Magistrates' Courts for Ridings in County of Ashburton, pursuant to Section 47 of "The Counties Act, 1876."

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the forty-seventh section of "The Counties Act, 1876," I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby appoint the Resident Magistrate's Court named in the first column of the Schedule hereto to be the Resident Magistrate's Court for the ridings in the County of Ashburton named in and set opposite to such Court in the second column of the said Schedule, to which any person who considers himself aggrieved by his own name or that of any other person being entered on or omitted from the roll of such ridings respectively, or by the number of votes allotted to him or to any other person thereon being more or fewer than that to which he or such other person is entitled under the said Act, may apply for relief.

Altering Times of Meeting of the Land Board of the Land District of Hawke's Bay.

WHEREAS by the first subsection of section twenty-five of "The Land Act, 1877," it is provided that the Land Boards of the respective land districts shall sit at the Land Office in the principal town of the land district, at certain times to be determined by the Board and approved of by the Governor, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*:

And whereas by a warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, dated the fifteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, it was appointed that the Land Board of Hawke's Bay should sit on the third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and on every alternate Thursday thereafter, at eleven o'clock a.m.:

And whereas the Land Board of Hawke's Bay did, on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, pass a resolution recommending that the time of sitting should be altered, and it is expedient to give effect to the said recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise

of the power and authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby fix and determine that the ordinary meetings of the Land Board of the Land District of Hawke's Bay shall be held on the first Friday in each month, at eleven o'clock a.m., commencing on Friday, the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, instead of every alternate Thursday, as heretofore appointed.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and forty-fourth section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which, in his opinion, are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby temporarily reserve from sale the land in the Provincial District of Otago described in the Schedule hereunder written, for the purposes in the said Schedule specified.

By-laws for Slaughterhouses in the Counties of Marlborough and Sounds.

THE following by-laws for slaughterhouses in the Counties of Marlborough and Sounds are published in accordance with "The Slaughterhouses Act, 1877."

THOMAS DICK.

BY-LAW No. 1.

For the Regulation and Management of Licensed Slaughterhouses in that Portion of the County of Marlborough lying to the North of the River Wairau, and for the County of Sounds.

License fee.

1. It is ordered, by virtue of the authority in us vested by "The Slaughterhouses Act, 1877," that, from and after the approval hereof by the Governor, the license fee payable by persons licensed to slaughter great or small cattle shall be ten shillings per annum, or fractional part of a year, payable in advance. All licenses shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year.

New licenses.

2. Applications for new licenses shall be in the form given in Schedule 1 to this by-law, and shall be posted or delivered to the Clerk of the nearest Resident Magistrate's Court in the licensing district at least five weeks before the day fixed for hearing the same.

Hearing applications for new licenses.

3. On receipt of the application as aforesaid, the Resident Magistrate having jurisdiction to hear the said application shall appoint a time and place for the hearing thereof, and shall return the application, with notification of time and place of hearing, to the applicant: Provided that the date fixed for hearing the application shall allow the applicant time to advertise notice as required by section 24 of the said Act.

Renewal of license.

4. Every applicant for a renewal of a license shall deposit an application, in writing, in the form given in Schedule 2 to this by-law, with the Clerk of the Resident Magistrate's Court at Picton or Havelock (whichever may be the nearest to his licensed slaughterhouse), at least fourteen clear days before the sitting of the Court at which such applications for renewal shall be heard and determined.

No slaughterhouse within three chains of road.

5. After the date of approval of this by-law by the Governor, no license shall be granted for any slaughterhouse situated within three chains of any main or district road used as a public road.

Slaughterhouses kept clean.

6. Every slaughterhouse shall be kept clean to the satisfaction of the Inspector, who may at all times give such directions concerning the cleansing thereof as to him may seem needful. Any persons licensed under the provisions of the said Act who shall not, without unnecessary delay, obey the directions of the Inspector shall be deemed to have committed a breach of the provisions of this by-law.

Cattle fed and watered.

7. Every slaughterhouse shall, at all times, be provided with a sufficient supply of fresh water, and all cattle confined on the premises of any slaughterhouse, or in any yard or enclosure connected therewith, shall be properly fed and watered at least once in every twenty-four hours.

Filth removed.

8. The filth shall be removed from every slaughterhouse or yard connected therewith at least once in every twenty-four hours.

Inspectors to visit slaughterhouses.

9. The Inspectors shall visit all slaughterhouses in their districts at least once every three months, where practicable, and not later than the first week in December in each year they shall furnish a report in writing to the Resident Magistrate having jurisdiction in their district, stating generally the condition in which the slaughterhouses in their district have been kept during the past year.

Fees for cattle slaughtered.

10. The fees payable to Inspectors from all persons holding licenses under the said Act, or any Act amending the same, shall be as follows: For every head of small cattle killed for sale, the sum of one farthing; and for every head of great cattle killed for sale, the sum of one penny. Inspectors shall dispose of all fees received according to any law for the time being in force.

Persons licensed to furnish reports.

11. Every person licensed under the said Act shall, with the report required to be forwarded under section 26 of "The Slaughterhouses Act, 1877," also send, together with the report to the Inspector, the amount of fees due for all cattle slaughtered for sale.

All fees must be paid before renewal of license.

12. No license shall be renewed unless the Inspector reports to the Court to whom application has been made for renewal that all fees due to the date of sitting of the said Court have been paid by the applicant for such renewal.

Licenses not to be transferred.

13. No license shall be transferred. In all cases of change of ownership of any slaughterhouse during the current year, the new owner shall make application in manner provided for new licenses.

Fine for breach of by-law.

14. For any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law a fine of not less than five shillings, nor more than five pounds, shall be inflicted. All such fines shall be recovered in a summary manner before a Resident Magistrate or any two Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction as provided by "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1866," or any Act amending the same.

Interpretation.

Wherever in this by-law the words "the said Act" are used, they shall mean "The Slaughterhouses Act, 1877," or any Act amending the same.

NOTE.—Altitude of Bealey, 2,104 feet; Queenstown, 1,070 feet. The stations marked thus * are furnished with aneroid barometers only.

NOTES FOR APRIL, 1880.

Mongonui.—Showery in early part, but otherwise fine; prevailing N.E. and S.E. winds and moderate; rather stormy on 1st and 2nd from N.E.; maximum rain recorded on 11th, .380 in.

Auckland.—Generally fine, clear, and dry weather, light winds E. to S.; maximum rain registered on 11th, .300 in.; thick fog on 9th.

Taranaki.—Very dry weather for time of year, very slight rain, .79 in. recorded on 11th, being the maximum; moderate winds prevailing from S.E. and N.E.; strong N.W. breeze on 10th, and from S.E. on 21st.

Napier.—Weather generally fine and pleasant; on 11th, 12th, and 13th showery, the maximum fall recorded on 13th, .71 in.; thick fog on morning of 19th; winds prevailed from S. and moderate; on the 14th rather strong S. breeze; hail on 19th.

Wanganui.—Weather throughout very fine, with exception of a few hours on 11th and 26th, when it blew from S.W. and S.E. with rain; prevailing N.E. and S.E. winds and moderate; fogs on six days; maximum rain recorded on 11th, .500 in.

Wellington.—Very fine up to 5th; from 6th to 10th stormy from N.W. and unpleasant; on night of 8th very heavy rain; .97 in. recorded on 9th, the maximum for month; on night of 10th changed to S.E., and showery and squally to 14th. Remainder of month generally fine bright weather, principally from S.E., occasionally showery towards end; prevailing S.E. and N.W. winds.

Nelson.—Fine weather; slight rain about middle of month, .38 in. the maximum recorded on 10th; prevailing N.E. and S.E. winds and moderate, except on 24th, when it blew hard.

Cape Campbell.—

Christchurch.—Fine seasonable weather, heavy dews and occasional frosts occurring on several nights; from 8th to 13th light showers, .18 in. recorded on 9th, the maximum; on 10th vivid lightning with hailstorm in neighbourhood doing damage; prevailing N.E., E., and S.W. winds, and moderate.

Bealey.—Up to 6th very fine and bright; from 7th to 12th wet, remainder fine and pleasant; maximum rain recorded on 10th, 1.91 in.; gales on 6th, 9th, and 10th from N.W., from which quarter it prevailed; thunder on 9th; fog on nine days.

Hokitika.—Fine to 5th; heavy rain from 6th to 11th; 2.70 in. recorded on 8th, the maximum for month; fine pleasant weather from 12th to 24th; remainder of month showery; prevailing S.W. winds and frequently stormy; fog on 8th.

Dunedin.—Pleasant though showery weather; maximum rain recorded on 8th, 1.42 in.; prevailing S.W. and W. winds, and stormy on 25th; thunder on 8th; fog on 23rd.

Queenstown.—Fine to 5th, then showery to 13th, followed by fine weather until 25th, when it rained hard and continued showery to end; maximum rain recorded on 10th, 1.13 in.; prevailing W. wind and stormy on 24th; snow on 11th; nine days of fog.

Southland.—Fine early part, wet towards middle, then fine until end, when light showers were experienced; light winds, chiefly from W.; thunder on 11th; hail on 11th and 26th.

Chatham Islands.—Very fine up to 9th, then showery until 28th; last few days fine; greatest rainfall on 11th, .26 in.; prevailing S.W. winds and moderate, except on 27th, when it blew hard; hail on 26th.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Fine, bright, dry weather almost throughout; remarkably high atmospheric pressure and high temperature; very small rainfall; moderate winds. Earthquakes reported at Wanganui on 17th, slight shock; at Wellington on 20th, at 12.39 p.m., a noise followed by a smart shake N. to S.; at Queenstown on 29th, at 2.30 a.m., sharp. Meteors observed on 10th, 18th, and 23rd.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

POPULATION.—In the case of Nelson the population is given according to the estimate for January, 1879, as the local authorities have not yet supplied the information necessary to enable the estimate to be corrected. In the other cases the estimates are for the 1st January, 1880.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 498, against 462 in May, being an increase of 36. The deaths amounted to 147 in June, an increase of 7 on the number in May.

Of the above deaths, males contributed 72; females, 75. 55 of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 37.41 per cent. of the whole number; 40 of these were of children under one year of age.

THE following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin that were registered during the Month of June, 1880.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs :—
 The births were 267 in June, against 259 in May, an increase of 8.
 The deaths in June were 103, against 92 in May; an increase of 11.
 There were 6 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards, viz., 2 males of 65 and 88 at Auckland; 2 males of 68 and 74 at Wellington; 1 male of 65 at Christchurch; and 1 male of 78 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases were 10 fewer than in May; the numbers having been 25 in May, and 15 in June. Of these, the deaths from typhoid fever amounted to 2 in June, against 5 in May; and the deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea to 3 in June, against 10 in May. Scarlet fever caused 1 death in Wellington in June.

Constitutional Diseases.—These caused 20 deaths in June, against 13 in May. The deaths from cancer increased from 2 in May to 5 in June. There was also a slight increase in the number of deaths from phthisis.

Local Diseases.—The deaths in June from these diseases amounted to 38, or more in number than in May; the numbers having been considerably in excess of the deaths from those diseases in April.

Violent Deaths.—There was a considerable increase in the number of these deaths in June. Of the total number 13, 3 were of persons murdered at Dunedin, 1 was a case of manslaughter, and 2 were cases of suicide.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal Zymotic diseases of the Miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
