Appointing Day for Election of Members for Toi Tois Road District, County of Southland.

(L.S.) HERCULES ROBINSON, Governor.
 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section ten of "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance, 1874," it is enacted that, if from any cause whatever, the persons entitled to vote at any election for any subdivision of any district shall fail or neglect to hold an election of members of the District Board of such district on the day appointed by the said Ordinance for that purpose, it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, to appoint a day for the holding of such election, and an election may be held upon the day so appointed; and the election so held shall for all purposes whatsoever be deemed to have been duly held on the day appointed by the said Ordinance for holding the same: And whereas the powers and authorities vested in the Superintendent by the said section are, by "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," now vested in the Governor: And whereas the persons entitled to vote in the election of members for the Toi Tois Road District failed on the day appointed by "The Otago Road Ordinance, 1871," to hold an election:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Ordinance and Act, do hereby proclaim and appoint that an election shall be held on the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, of members of the Road Board of the Toi Tois Road District.

Town of North Invercargill proclaimed a Borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876."

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifteenth section of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any of the several places specified in the Third Schedule to the said Act in which a Municipal Corporation has been established under the provisions of an Ordinance of the Province of Otago intituled "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," from a day to be named in such Proclamation; subject, however, to certain conditions in the said section mentioned:

And whereas the Town of North Invercargill, in the Provincial District of Otago, is one of the places specified in the said Third Schedule, and a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, by sixty-two of the ratepayers of such town, praying him to constitute such town into a borough under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and such petition was, on the twenty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, publicly notified, and no petition from an equal or greater number of such ratepayers was presented to His Excellency within two months after such public notification praying him not to assent to the prayer of such first-mentioned petition:

Now, therefore, I, Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the date of this Proclamation, the said Town of North Invercar-

gill shall be a borough constituted under the said "Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," and shall be called the Borough of North Invercargill; and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North by a road-line and Sections Nos. 36, 37, and 38 of Block I., Invercargill Hundred; towards the East by a road-line and Sections Nos. 35 and 34; again towards the North by said Section No. 34; towards the North-east by Section No. 6; towards the South-east by Sections Nos. 5, 4, and 3, all of the said Block I., and the Borough of East Invercargill; and towards the West by the Park Reserve, being Section No. 22 of Block I., and Section No. 26 of same block: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the District Survey Office, Invercargill.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road in Reserve number one thousand two hundred and two, and Rural Section three thousand seven hundred and fifty-three, Timaru District, Canterbury:

And whereas the Levels Road Board has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken under "The Public Works Act, 1876," and "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of a road through Section two, Heretaunga Survey District, County of Hawke's Bay:

And whereas the Hawke's Bay County Council has laid before the Governor the memorial and map mentioned in and signed and certified as required by the said Acts:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by sections twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and by section twenty-eight of "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and of any other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road; and that, from and after the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates and interests of what kind soever, for use as a road.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of July, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Rabbit Nuisance Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1877," it is enacted that, in addition to the power of proclaiming districts given by the third section of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876," the Governor might from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that any part of the colony to be defined therein should be a rabbit district for the purposes of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the firstly hereinbefore recited Act, doth hereby order and direct that that part of the colony described in the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the date hereof, be and the same is hereby constituted a district for the purposes of "The Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1876," and shall be named and known as the Tutarau Rabbit District, and the boundaries of such district shall be those defined in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, His Excellency doth hereby order that the first election of Trustees for the said district shall be held on the thirty-first day of August next, at Humphries Hall, Mataura.

SCHEDULE.

TUTURAU RABBIT DISTRICT.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, bounded towards the North by the northern side of the Southern Trunk Railway from the Mataura River to the Waipahee River; thence towards the East by that river and the Kaiwera River to its western source; thence by a right line to the Mimi Stream at the south-western corner of Run No. 132; thence towards the South by that stream and the Mimi Stream to the Mataura River aforesaid; and towards the West by that river to the Southern Trunk Railway aforesaid: as the same is delineated on the plan deposited in the Survey Office, Dunedin.

Authorizing Messrs. Smith and Larnach to build a Jetty in Otago Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of July, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth sections of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea, or any harbour, or the construction of any graving dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea) in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence: And whereas by the one hundred and fifty-second section of the said Act it is enacted that, where it shall appear to the Governor in Council that any harbour works are required for the use, benefit, or convenience of the public within a harbour under the control of a Harbour Board, and that such Board cannot conveniently execute or carry out such works, then, and in any such case, the Governor in Council may exercise all or any of the powers vested in him by the said sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth sections of the said Act:

And whereas James Smith and William James Mudie Larnach desire to build a jetty in Otago Harbour, and the Otago Harbour Board cannot conveniently execute or carry out such work; and it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the said work will not be, or tend, to the injury of navigation, or interfere with or injure any harbour works already constructed by the Board or under its control, or that may be in progress:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the said James Smith and William James Mudie Larnach to build in Otago Harbour, for the use and benefit of the public, a jetty, in accordance with the plan and specification marked M.D. 400, and in the position shown on the plan marked M.D. 401, which plans are deposited in the office of the Marine Department, on the following conditions, that is to say,—

That the right hereby conferred shall not exceed the period of ten years, at which time the right shall absolutely cease without payment of any compensation whatever.

That it shall be lawful for the said James Smith and William James Mudie Larnach to levy wharfage on all vessels coming alongside the said jetty at a rate not exceeding one farthing per registered ton per diem: Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall authorize the said James Smith and William James Mudie Larnach to charge with wharfage any vessel the property of the Otago Harbour Board.

The rights and powers conferred under or by this Order in Council may be resumed at any time by the Governor on giving to the said James Smith and William James Mudie Larnach six months' previous notice of his intention so to do.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the eleventh section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Auckland, and known as the Frasertown Recreation-ground, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," and its amending Acts; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Acts.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 31 acres 2 roods 14 perches, more or less, being Lot 152, Town of Frasertown, Wairoa, Taramarama Survey District, Provincial District of Auckland. Bounded towards the North-east by a street, 1250 links; towards the South-east by a street, 2436 links; towards the South by a street, 1260 links; and towards the North-west by a street, 2598 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

Powers delegated to the Frasertown Domain Board under "The Public Domains Act, 1860."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of July, 1880.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," it is enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred upon any person for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas it is enacted by "The Public Domains Act, 1865," that the word "person" in the hereinbefore recited section of "The Public Domains Act, 1860," shall be deemed to include more persons than one: And whereas pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under and to be subject to the said "Public Domains Act, 1860:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by subsections five and ten of section five and section eleven, to the under-mentioned

persons, who shall be known as the Frasertown Domain Board:—

WILLIAM GOLDSTONE,
JOHN STUART TAYLOR,
HENRY BROWN,
THOMAS JOHN TUNKS, and
CHRISTOPHER GRAY

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the public School-room, Frasertown, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the sixteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And whereas by the ninety-fourth section of the said Act it is enacted that the land occupied by any road stopped as provided by the said Act shall be dealt with as provided by the twenty-ninth and following sections of the said Act in the case of lands not required for public use:

And whereas the roads, the land occupied by which is described in the Schedule hereto, have been stopped under the authority of the said Act:

And whereas the Highway Board of the Kirikiriroa Highway District has laid before the Governor the memorial referred to in the twenty-ninth section of the said Act, praying the Governor, by an Order in Council, to cause such land to be sold:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Hercules George Robert Robinson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, do hereby order and authorize the land described in the Schedule hereto to be sold and dealt with in the manner and subject to the conditions of the twenty-ninth and following sections of the said Act.

THE following rules and regulations for the management of the Wyndham Cemetery have been submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council, and are published in accordance with "The Cemeteries Management Act, 1877."

THOMAS DICK.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE WYNDHAM CEMETERY, UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF "THE CEMETRIES MANAGEMENT ACT, 1877."

1. All charges must be paid in advance, when orders are given.
2. Any person or persons making a vault, placing a tombstone, or erecting a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the Trustees for the time being, and upon payment of the required charges, shall maintain and keep up such vault, tombstone, or monument, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, heirs, near relations, and friends, for ever.
3. Application for such permission must be made to the Secretary, or to one of the Trustees, and a certificate of such permission, in the form of Schedule B, or to the like effect, may be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of charges in Schedule A.
4. The cost and charges of the burial of any person in such cemetery will be remitted on proof being given, to the satisfaction of the Trustees, that such person was a pauper at the time of his death, and that there are no funds applicable, and no person is liable for the payment of costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment must be given to the

sexton at least six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge will be made in terms of Schedule A. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice of six hours.

6. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of a surveyor appointed by the Trustees; and, in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession will be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hour fixed for funerals will be from 8 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from 8 o'clock a.m. till 4 o'clock p.m. the other four months of the year, except on Sundays, when the usual and only funerals will be from 2 o'clock till 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No funeral will be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron; and every coffin in a private grave must have on the lid a metal plate, with name of deceased stamped or painted thereon.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every fence, monument, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, must be submitted to the Trustees, and approved of by them.

12. No servant or any other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Trustees shall receive any gratuity, under penalty of dismissal.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise till sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the graves, shall be kept by the Secretary, and may be inspected on payment of the charge mentioned in Schedule A, and registers of all graves shall be kept by the Secretary.

15. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, or the Coroner holding the inquest or inquiry, or a Magistrate; and such certificate must be delivered to the sexton at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gate.

16. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

17. Any purchaser of private ground, in which no interment shall have taken place, may transfer his or her interest in the said ground upon payment being made to the Trustees for the time being of five shillings for such transfer.

NOTES FOR MAY, 1880.

Mongonui.—Showery, unpleasant, with strong winds in early part; 5 days of thunder and 3 of hail; wind N.W. and S.W.; maximum rainfall recorded on 11th, .960 in. Some fine weather during latter part, though at times showery and squally; prevailing winds S.W. and N.W.

Auckland.—Very showery; maximum rain recorded on 11th, .89 in.; wind generally W. and N.W., and at times strong, especially from 5th to 7th, and 10th to 13th; slight thunder on 11th, 12th, and 13th; often clear sky between showers.

Taranaki.—A very wet month; prevailing S.E. and S.W. winds; gales from N.W. on 10th, 11th, and 12th, from S.W. on 17th and 19th, and from S.E. on 28th; maximum rain recorded on 26th, 1.25 in.
